## **FLAG DAY**

The idea of an annual day specifically celebrating the Flag is believed to have first originated in 1885 with BJ Cigrand, a schoolteacher in the Fredonia, Wisconsin Public School to observe the 108th anniversary of the official adoption of The Stars and Stripes as US Flag. On June 14, 1889, George Balch, a kindergarten teacher in New York City, planned appropriate ceremonies for the children of his school, and his idea of observing Flag Day was later adopted by the State Board of Education of New York. On June 14, 1891, the Betsy Ross House in Philadelphia held a Flag Day celebration. On June 14, 1892, the New York Society of the Sons of the Revolution, celebrated Flag Day. Following the suggestion of Colonel J Granville Leach (at the time historian of the Pennsylvania Society of the Sons of the Revolution), the Pennsylvania Society of Colonial Dames of America on April 25, 1893 adopted a resolution requesting the mayor of Philadelphia and all others in authority and all private citizens to display the Flag on June 14th. In 1894, the governor of New York directed that on June 14 the Flag be displayed on all public buildings. In the same year, the American Flag Day Association, a Illinois organization, organized the first general public school children's celebration of Flag Day in Chicago at Douglas, Garfield, Humboldt, Lincoln, and Washington Parks, with more than 300,000 children participating. Franklin K. Lane, Secretary of the Interior, delivered a 1914 Flag Day address in which he repeated words he said the flag had spoken to him that morning: "I am what you make me; nothing more. I swing before your eyes as a bright gleam of color, a symbol of yourself." Inspired by these three decades of state and local celebrations, Flag Day was officially established by the Proclamation of President Woodrow Wilson on May 30th, 1916. Not until August 3rd, 1949, when President Truman signed an Act of Congress designating June 14th of each year as National Flag Day.
