THE SANCTITY OF LIFE AND WHAT WE CAN DO ABOUT IT

As some of you may know and others will come to know, one of the major issues with which I am personally concerned is the issue of the sanctity of life. As a person with a genetic defect, I have felt the weight of social opinion telling me I am a burden on the healthcare system and that I should abort my children. These are not fantasies. I have read them and heard them personally from doctors. Besides the issue of abortion to be committed for the "traditional" reasons, we now have the pressure for assisted suicide by the sick or aged, abortion for sexual selection, killing of embryos for research or unused in fertility treatment, sterilization of certain minorities, abortion for population control, and killing of "undesirable" children up to a certain age such as 10 months or even more. These are all practiced now or are seriously proposed by some powerful people.

On the patriotic side, our Constitution guarantees the right to life. Have we become too weak to care about our Constitution and its implementation? What kind of society will we leave for our children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren if they are not aborted? What other anti-life practices that we allow now or cannot imagine will be practiced on them in the future? Some of the above practices were not imagined as happening in the USA when I was younger. Our president voted several times to allow killing of babies that survive abortion.

CHAPTER THREE I DELIVERED TO YOU WHAT I ALSO RECEIVED (CF. 1COR 15:3) FROM POPE FRANCIS' ENCYCLICAL *LIGHT OF FAITH*

The Sacraments and the Transmission of Faith Part 1

The Church, like every family, passes on to her children the whole store of her memories. But how does this come about in a way that nothing is lost, but rather everything in the patrimony (protecting and passing on) of faith comes to be more deeply understood? It is through the apostolic Tradition preserved in the Church with the assistance of the Holy Spirit that we enjoy a living contact with the foundational memory. What was handed down by the apostles as the Second Vatican Council in Constitution on Divine Revelation ¶8 states "comprises everything that serves to make the people of God live their lives in holiness and increase their faith. In this way the Church, in her doctrine, life and worship, perpetuates and transmits to every generation all that she herself is, all that she believes". Faith, in fact, needs a setting in which it can be witnessed to and communicated, a means which is suitable and proportionate to what is communicated. For transmitting a purely doctrinal content, an idea might suffice, or perhaps a book, or the repetition of a spoken message. But what is communicated in the Church, what is handed down in her living Tradition, is the new light born of an encounter with the true God, a light which touches us at the core of our being and engages our minds, wills and emotions, opening us to relationships lived in communion. There is a special means for passing down this fullness, a means capable of engaging the entire person, body and spirit, interior life and relationships with others. It is the sacraments, celebrated in the Church's liturgy. The sacraments communicate an incarnate memory, linked to the times and places of our lives, linked to all our senses; in them the whole person is engaged as a member of a living subject and part of a network of communitarian relationships. While the sacraments are indeed sacraments of faith (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy ¶59), it can also be said that faith itself possesses a sacramental structure. The awakening of faith is linked to the dawning of a new sacramental sense in our lives as human beings and as Christians, in which visible and material realities are seen to point beyond themselves to the mystery of the eternal.
