PAIN CAPABLE UNBORN CHILD PROTECTION ACT

The US Senate will take up the Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act. The bill stops abortions after 20 weeks – the time at which preborn babies can feel pain. Senator Lindsey Graham joined other pro-life groups at a news conference in support of the bill. Marjorie Dannenfelser of the Susan B. Anthony List said, "Right now in our country, a child can be killed in his or her mother's womb for any reason, at any point, up until the moment of birth. We are one of only seven nations in the world, including China and North Korea, to allow such brutality. We are a better nation than this." The Senate is expected the pass the measure. Charmaine Yoest, president of Americans United for Life, said limiting abortion at five months is simply a "commonsense response to the ugly reality of later term abortions, which causes tremendous pain to fully-formed infants and exposes women to dangerous health risks. The abortion lobby denies the pain of the unborn, and refuses to be honest about what can happen to women during a risky late-term abortion procedure." The president is expected to veto the measure, but pro-life leaders vow to press forward.

FORTNIGHT FOR FREEDOM 2015: FREEDOM TO BEAR WITNESS

The Fortnight for Freedom: Freedom to Bear Witness will take place from June 21 to July 4. During the Fortnight, there is a celebrate of the following great martyrs who remained faithful in the face of persecution by political power—St. Thomas More, St. John Fisher, Nativity of St. John the Baptist, Sts. Peter and Paul, and the First Martyrs of the Church of Rome. The theme of this year's Fortnight will focus on the "freedom to bear witness" to the truth of the Gospel. "Keeping the spirit of the Gospel means that Catholic institutions are to bear witness in love to the full truth about the human person by providing social, charitable, and educational services in a manner that fully reflects the God-given dignity of the human person." - Archbishop William E. Lori, Chairman, Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty, on the "Freedom to Bear Witness"

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SACRAMENTS OF HEALING RECONCILIATION (PENANCE) AND ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Bless the LORD, my soul; who pardons all your sins, and heals all your ills, who crowns you with mercy and compassion. He has not dealt with us as our sins merit, nor our wrongs deserve. As far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our sins from us. (Psalm 103)

Thoroughly wash away my guilt; from my sin cleanse me, for I know my transgressions; my sin is always before me. Against you, you alone have I sinned; I have done what is evil in your eyes. A clean heart create for me, God; renew within me a steadfast spirit. My sacrifice, O God, is a contrite spirit; a contrite, humbled heart, O God, you will not scorn. (Psalm 51)

Jesus said to the disciples, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." (John 20)

Reconciliation is the first sacrament of healing. As sinners, we recognize both our human limitations and failures also God's limitless love for us. God loves and forgives us. The sacrament of reconciliation makes this gift of forgiveness a reality in the life of the sinner. Because of our natural tendency to sin, we break our relationship or our connection with God, choosing other things in favor of that relationship. We also break our relationship with each other. We need to repair that bond with God and with the Church through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, better known as confession. We tell our sins to a priest who absolves them. God always forgives us but sometimes we withhold reconciliation or have unforgiveness in the heart (I will never forgive that person for what one has done to me or I will never forgive myself for what harm I did to a person). Therefore, the sacrament of reconciliation does more than offer forgiveness. It formally reconciles us with God and the community.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Is anyone among you sick? One should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over this one and anoint this one with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise one up. If one has committed any sins, one will be forgiven. (James 5)

Anointing of the Sick is given to anyone in need of healing from a serious injury, elderly, or before a surgery. A priest will come to anoint the sick individual with the oil of the sick and to lay hands upon a person asking God to heal the person physically, spiritually, emotionally and mentally. One needs not be near death to receive the Sacrament, which is a common misconception. A dead person cannot receive the sacrament. However, the compassionate Church has a prayer service for those dying who have already received the Sacrament and for those who have died.
