Twelve members were present when Grand Knight Steve Romofsky called the Council meeting for September to order at 8:37 p.m. Upon closing the meeting doors, Warden James Bauer verified membership cards. The Worthy Grand Knight led the Council in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes from the August Council Meeting were approved as read.

The Grand Knight reported on the following items:

- Planning continues for the Centennial celebration.
- The Columbian calendar for the Council has been drafted.
- The September 26 social on will include a Super Cucas "Build your own taco" dinner.
- It is definitely time for Knights to be purchasing tickets for the Knights Nite Out on October 24 (\$150) and the Clergy Appreciation Dinner on January 23 (\$15).

Pro-Life Report

Rallies in 145 Cities Protest White House's Anti-Catholic, Pro-Abortion "Mandate"

Mike Engler **T**he Church Militant took to the streets again on October 20. In 145 cities from coast to coast, tens of thousands of Catholics and other citizens rallied against the administration's shocking and unconstitutional order that all employers, including most religious ones, must provide free sterilizations, contraceptives and early-abortion pills to their employees.

Attendance was good at the rallies, with crowds turning out even in small towns. Thousands protested in Barack Obama's Chicago, carrying signs that read, "Vote for Life and Liberty" and "Stop Obama's HHS Mandate." Rally Co-Chairman Eric Scheidler said we must stop the State from infringing on the rights of individuals to act according to their consciences and their Faith.

If the HHS mandate isn't rescinded, America's 600 Catholic hospitals and all Catholic colleges and universities will be forced to cooperate in mortal sins or face fines that could put them out of business.

In Huntsville, Alabama, former state Chief Justice Roy Moore noted that forcing people to pay for abortion and birth control goes against the Declaration of Independence, which guarantees both life and liberty.

In Des Moines, Iowa, organizer Jenifer Bowen said that although most protesters had religious motives, protest leaders are seeing more and more atheists who are upset about being forced to pay. "Christian, Catholic, Lutheran, whoever you are," she noted, "you're also going to pay for it, and that's not okay with people."

In Zanesville, Ohio, 450 people came out to protest. Organizer Nancy Nicholson stated that the purpose of the rallies went beyond abortion, and stretched across religious denominations. She said their purpose wasn't to tell people whom to vote for on November 6, but to urge them to consider their freedoms when they enter the voting booth. "If one of these freedoms can be attacked by the government and removed, then all our freedoms are at risk," she warned.

She added that refusing to obey the HHS mandate will bring fines of \$100 per day per employee, which could force many employers to close their doors. "The weakest among us, the poorest among us, who are served by these religious-based agencies will be forced to close or will close because they can't pay the fines, these people will be the most affected," she warned. Please pray daily for the rescinding of the anti-Catholic, anti-life HHS mandate. And when you and your family vote, remember that no other issue is anywhere near as important as ending the killing of millions of unborn babies. Vote pro-life!

**Council 1684's Founding Grand Knight
Jarrett T. Richards (1843-1919)**



Jarrett T. Richards (shown here in 1870 at age 27), witnessed President Lincoln's Gettysburg Address in person, earned an LL.B. from Columbia Law School, and moved to Santa Barbara from Pennsylvania in 1868. A taxpayers' advocate, Republican and opponent of monopolies, he founded the *Santa Barbara Times* in 1871 and successfully opposed making taxpayers have to subsidize the railroad interests. In 1874, he won a fistfight with J.A. Johnson, editor of the pro-railroad *Santa Barbara Daily Press*, and that catapulted him into being elected mayor of Santa Barbara in 1875. He also served as city attorney in the 1870's. In 1898, Jarrett Richards married Mary Lewis, formerly of Maryland. He was Price, Postel & Parma's longest-serving attorney – some 53 years. Evidently he was a convert; his father was Presbyterian. Jarrett Richards was an author: In 1901 he gave a lecture reprinted as a 26-page booklet, *Roman Catholic Church, the refuge, home and school for passionate souls*; and in 1914 he wrote an autobiographical novel, *Romance on El Camino Real* – which sold for \$1.35 a copy. –

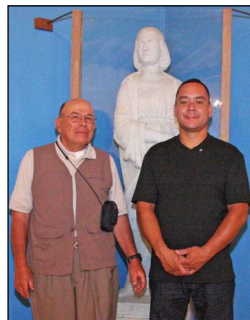

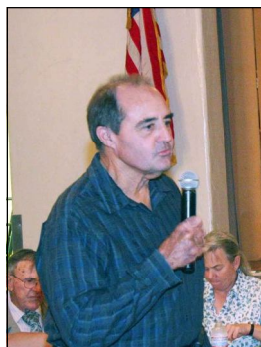

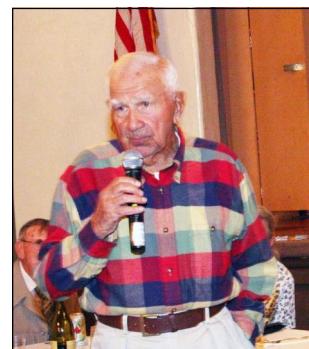
