

Seventeen members were present when Grand Knight Steve Romofsky called the Council meeting for June to order at 7:42 p.m. Upon closing the meeting doors, Warden James Bauer verified membership cards, and the Grand Knight led the opening prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the May meeting were accepted as read.

The Worthy Grand Knight reported on the following items:

- In a review of the May Scholarship Social, the Worthy Grand Knight praised the work of Brother Deacon Nick Curran and the Scholarship Committee. The food was good, the music was good, the scholarship recipients and their families were spectacular, and for the first time in a long time, we had to put up more tables to seat everyone.
- The Latin Mass was unforgettable. Father Charles Talley, our Chaplain, Father Kennon Osborn, the altar persons and others made it a memorable and spiritual pièce de résistance. After the Latin Mass, District Deputy Mike Ohler and District Warden Mark Scheutz had pancakes made and sausages fried for the pancake breakfast at Serra Hall. Many thanks to all (including the hard working Centennial Committee) for a successful Council event, including incoming District Deputy Ray Centeno, Jr., who was in attendance.
- The Grand Centennial celebration will be held on **Saturday**, June 22 at 6:30 at Bishop Diego García High School. The joint officer installation will be held at 5:00 p.m., prior to the celebration. Please plan to attend and celebrate Council 1684's 100th birthday; tickets are just \$15 per person. There will be musical entertainment by Gilda Sahagun, and the incomparable chef Ralph Karleskint will be the most incomparable he has ever been.
- The Grand Knight would like the telephone committee to begin calling our brother Knights to remind them of the details regarding our Centennial Celebration.
- Grand Knight Steve Romofsky and Brother Mark Weitstock attended the KOC State Convention and had a wonderful experience.
- Getting a Council 1684 web site up and running will be a priority for the coming Columbian year.
- The Council welcomed the incoming Distric Deputy Ray Centeno, Jr.

Under membership, there were no new applications, but a First Degree Exemplification will be scheduled for the August 14 business meeting in anticipation of at least two new members.

Under communication,

- The Council received communication from Brother Richard Rink representing the Society of St. Vincent de Paul regarding support for their efforts to send disadvantaged youth to the Circle V Camp near Lake Cachuma. The Council will send a check for \$425.
- The Council received a lovely hand-written card of thanks from the Principal of Notre Dame School for our support of Matthew and Rodolfo with scholarships given in May.

Under the Treasurer's report,

- The Council's May bank statement reflects a balance of \$10,153.29 after deposits of \$26,014.65 and withdrawals of \$24,042.79.
- The May Scholarship Social showed a net gain to the Council of \$174.23 with a total of 68 Knights and guests attending.

The financial secretary reported five bills paid.

Under Unfinished Business,

• The Resolution made and seconded at the May meeting received the second reading. The Resolution reads:

Whereas U.S. Treasury Notes and C.D.'s are yielding only 1.7% or less, but a laddered bond fund of investment grade (a third Triple A) has yielded about 5% of the last ten years. Therefore, we propose that up to 50% of the Council's Building and Equipment Fund be invested in such a bond fund.

• Brother Mark Weitstock updated the Council regarding the trials and tribulations of obtaining the trailer used to sell our drinks. The process is fluid and ongoing. Knights will need to sign up for a shift in MacKenzie Park as Fiesta begins July 31.

Under New Business, District Deputy Mike Ohler was given a standing ovation as this was his last regular business meeting representing the Council as District Deputy. District Warden Mark Scheutz was also given a standing ovation for his good works related to serving our Council.

S ixteen members were present when Grand Knight Steve Romofsky called the Council meeting for May to order at 7:26 p.m. Upon closing the meeting doors, Warden James Bauer verified membership cards, and the Grand Knight led the opening prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the April meeting were accepted as read.

The Worthy Grand Knight reported on the following items:

- A review of the Essay Contest social in April shows a very disappointing turnout by Knights, but a good program by Brother Nick Curran and worthy recipients of the prizes.
- The Latin Mass coming up May 11 in the Serra Chapel was reviewed. There will be ushers to direct people to the correct place. Father Charles Talley will be giving the Mass with the programs provided by Brother David Borgatello. District Deputy Mike Ohler and Mark Shuetz of Moorpark will be doing most of the cooking for the pancake breakfast in Serra Hall with Mike and Mark bringing their Council's equipment and special pancake batter with them.
- The Scholarship social will be held on May 22. Don't miss our \$24,000 donation to support Catholic schools in our area. The Knights will be barbequing chicken and tritip, so come hungry.
- The Grand Centennial celebration will be held on a Saturday, June 22 at 6:30 at Bishop Diego García High School. Please plan to attend and celebrate Council 1684's 100th birthday. There will be entertainment and the incomparable chef Ralph Karleskint will again be even more incomparable.

Under membership, there were no new applications.

Under communication, there was no new communication.

Under the Treasurer's report,

- The Council's May bank statement reflects a balance of \$8,091.98 after deposits of \$5,635.30 and expenditures of \$1,356.80.
- The April social showed a net gain to the Council of \$124 thanks to the hefty discount provided by Brother Ralph Karleskint.

The financial secretary reported five bills paid.

Under Unfinished Business, Brother Ray Charpentier gave our slate of officers the second reading. The list includes: Steve Romofsky as Grand Knight, Hank Peterson as Deputy Grand Knight, Dale Ohmstead as Chancellor, Al Anglin as Recorder, Ray Charpentier as Financial Secretary, Bruce García as Treasurer, Richard Rink as Advocate, James Bauer as Warden, David Chávez as Inside Guard, Mitch Molitor as Outside Guard, Thomas Salgado, Sr. as Trustee (1 year), John Green as Trustee (3 year), Mark Weitstock (2 years). It was moved, seconded and carried unanimously that the slate of officers be accepted.

Under New Business,

- Brother Mark Weitstock explained his thinking about whether we should continue to use Pepsi as our soft drink provider during Fiesta. Volunteers will be needed to man our booth regardless of the logo on the side of the trailer.
- Brother John Green explained that one of our investment assets was called and we have money that needs to be invested. After discussion, he submitted a Resolution to make our investments work harder for us. The Resolution reads:

Action Alert! Help Stop Persecution of Catholics Under Gov't Anti-Life "Mandate"

"The need for prayer, education and action in defense of religious liberty has never been greater," warns Archbishop William Lori, Supreme Chaplain of our Order and chairman of the U.S. Bishops' Ad Hoc Committee for Religious Liberty. That's because on

August 1, under the "HHS mandate," the Obama administration will start forcing most employers in our country to provide contraceptives, sterilizations and abortion-causing drugs to their employees, or suffer heavy fines.

This means most Catholic (and other) employers will have to commit mortal sins and risk the loss of their eternal souls, or suffer financial ruin. Six hundred Catholic hospitals, hundreds of Catholic colleges and universities, and countless other Catholic businesses are in the federal government's crosshairs, along with countless businesses and schools run by other believers.

This shocking attack on the religious liberty enshrined in the Bill of Rights is the worst form of religious persecution in our country's history: it's even worse than <u>killing</u> Catholics, because if Catholics collaborate in mortal sins, they risk losing their <u>souls</u> forever in hell.

Catholic and Protestant businesses have filed 60 lawsuits against Obama's brutal "mandate." Eventually the U.S Supreme Court might decide the issue, but as of August 1, enforcement will begin. One Protestant-owned business, Hobby Lobby, is facing fines of \$1 million-plus per day.

What can we Catholics do to resist this tyranny? The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops launched the second Fortnight for Freedom (Quincena por la Libertad) on June 21. Running through the Fourth of July, these two weeks include Masses, prayers, protest rallies and other actions designed to celebrate our religious liberty and stop the federal government's attack on this most precious of all liberties.

We Knights and our families can offer Masses and Holy Communions, pray the Rosary and other prayers, fast, offer other acts of self-denial, write a letter to the editor, contact our representatives in Congress, hold a picket or a protest march, stage a rally, etc. For more ideas for things we can do locally, visit <u>www.fortnight4freedom.org</u> Of course, we'll need to take actions such as these <u>after</u> the Fourth of July as well.

The chief reason most of us are Catholic today is that for century after century, our forebears stayed true to the Catholic Faith, despite every kind of persecution. Now it's our turn. With the help of God and Mary, let's defend the Faith they preserved for us.

Deacon's Corner:

Am I a Good Neighbor?

I 'm often asked by the teens that I'm preparing for Confirmation, "Who goes to Heaven and who goes to Hell?"

My easy answer is that "you have to want to go to Heaven, or you have to want to go to Hell."

Jesus doesn't make too many references to Hell (or Gahanna), He says if part of you sins cut it off, it's better to lose your bad habits even if it's part of your personality; we need to change our ways sometimes.

Jesus also tells us the greatest commandments are love God, and love your neighbor.

But, who is my neighbor? According to Jesus, this isn't the right question. Instead we should ask, "Am I a good neighbor?" To whom should I be a good neighbor? To whoever is on our path today would be my guess.

But what if I'm too busy with important matters? Even if it's my elderly parent or my friend or my literal neighbor, the homeless, or my children or grandchildren who need me, what about *my* plans?

In the Gospel of the Good Samaritan, the Levite and the priest who passed by the robbers' victim probably had plans. They may have been on their way to temple, or maybe they didn't want to be seen as unclean by touching a dead man, or maybe they were just going about their important business, and didn't want to be bothered at that moment; but Jesus tells us every moment is important to somebody.

To get into heaven and to get through the week, we need only to love God and be a good neighbor. It's really not so very complicated; it us who make it complicated, by not keeping Jesus teachings in the forefront of our minds; by not wanting to do Jesus's will, or by remembering our faith and wanting to do as Jesus asks.

Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic achievement, extracurricular activities, and recommendations from the principal or head of school, with preference to relatives or close friends of active or deceased members of the Knights of Columbus. All of the young students honored by Council 1684 attend local Catholic schools, having demonstrated their unique skills in and out of the classroom.
