GENERAL MEETING OF COUNCIL 1684 WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 11, 2013

Thirteen members were present when Grand Knight Steve Romofsky called the Council meeting for September to order at 7:40 p.m. Upon closing the meeting doors, Warden James Bauer verified membership cards, and the Grand Knight led the opening prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the August meeting were corrected as follows: Serra Hall in place of Serra Chapel for the Third Degree Exemplification, and Edward Quay was added to the list of those receiving their First and Second Degrees on that date.

The Worthy Grand Knight reported on the following items:

- The Worthy Grand Knight thanked all who participated in our successful Third Degree Exemplification on September 8. Candidates came from as far as Artesia and Redondo Beach to receive the full Knighthood of the Third Degree. Brother Bruce García received special praise for his outstanding work producing pancakes for the breakfast.
- The September social will be quite special as Brother Bruce García's world famous Taco Bar (Super Cucas) will be served. Brother Al Anglin will present a short pictorial account of his recent stint on the Camino de Santiago in Spain. He will also present a short synopsis of the Council's achievements during the centennial year.

The minutes of the September meeting were accepted as read.

The Worthy Grand Knight reported on the following items:

- The Worthy Grand Knight thanked Brother Bruce García for the taco bar success at the September social and well as Brother Al Anglin for the Camino de Santiago presentation.
- The Knights Nite Out ticket sales are continuing with hopes of a record setting event. The tickets are still just \$125 for the reverse raffle and two dinners.
- The Knights of Columbus will be recognized at the St. Barbara Parish 9:00 a.m. Mass by Chaplain Fr. Charles Talley on Sunday, October 13 in recognition of Columbus Day. Following Mass, Knights will be meeting with parishioners seeking candidates for Knighthood. The Council will provide some doughnuts after Mass.

Pro-Life Report

"Catholic" Gov. Brown Expands Number of Abortionists

From the start of their campaign in the 1960's to legalize aborting babies, and ever since then, the pro-aborts have argued that only "qualified physicians," not "back-alley butchers," must be the ones who commit abortions. That is, until now

Now the anti-lifers have changed their tune: Suddenly non-doctors are perfectly qualified to kill babies. So say "Catholic" Gov. Jerry Brown and his fellow pro-abortion politicians in Sacramento. On Oct. 9, Brown signed into law an abortion-expansion bill that the Democrats who control both houses of our state legislature had passed overwhelmingly. The new law lets midwives, nurse practitioners and physicians' assistants use suction curettes to kill first-trimester babies. Four other states have similar laws.

State Sen. Hannah-Beth Jackson of Santa Barbara has such an anti-life record that pro-lifers have nicknamed her "Hannah-Death." Arguing for the new law, she insisted, "The growing shortage of abortion providers creates a significant barrier for women." She failed to mention that 500 abortionists – 30 percent of the entire country's total – already infest our once-Golden State.

Young pro-life activist Lila Rose, who goes underground to expose the USA's giant abortion industry, says the new law will let Planned Parenthood "kill unborn children at lower costs, as they would not have to pay a doctor." She continues, "In the wake of [convicted "House of Horrors" murderer] Kermit Gosnell, in whose abortion facility a woman died from an untrained staff member's mistake, it's unthinkable for lawmakers in California to push a law like this." "Abortion backers say they care about the health and safety of women," she adds, "but their actions show they just want more abortions, even if that means lower medical standards."

Pro-life sidewalk counseling leader Wynette Sills of Sacramento, who heads the Coalition for Women and Children, says, "It's very disappointing, particularly from a women's health standpoint." She remarks that by signing the new law, Gov. Brown "has put the profits of the abortion industry above the health and well-being of women and children."

Pro-aborts, someone once observed, don't mind if mothers die from abortions, because it's for the greater good of killing their unborn babies. As Knights, let us pray and act with more determination than ever against the monstrous evil of abortion.

Deacon's Corner:

CELEBRATING THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

I hope everybody is enjoying the changing seasons. The temperatures are dropping, as much as do in Santa Barbara, and we are coming to the end of another Liturgical year.

The last Sunday of November we will celebrate Christ the King, which brings us to the symbolic end of times when Jesus will indeed be King of all that exists, and evil will be defeated for all eternity.

The following week, we start our journey all over again with the onset of Advent and thus the beginning of a new Liturgical year.

I encourage all of you to participate fully in the weekend celebrations of the high seasons this year, beginning with the practice of keeping an Advent wreath, in anticipation of the coming of Jesus into the World.


Most Advent wreaths have three purple candles and one rose similar to the liturgical colors of the Church's Advent celebrations.

Whether the wreath is being used at home or in a church, the lighting of the candles should follow the liturgical colors of the Sundays of Advent. The vestments at Mass are purple during the first two weeks of Advent, and we light a purple candle on the first and second Sundays of Advent.

On the third Sunday, the Church celebrates "Gaudete Sunday" or "Rejoice Sunday", named after the first word of the day's traditional entrance verse (Philippians 4:4–5). The priest and Deacons wear rose vestments at Mass as a sign of our brightening hope and joy, and on the Advent wreath we light the rose candle to reflect the action in the liturgy.

The fourth Sunday of Advent sees the lighting of the last purple candle. Some churches and families add a fifth candle to their Advent practices by placing a white candle in the center of the wreath. They light this at Christmas, again echoing the Church's liturgical color for the season and rejoicing in Christ our Lord, whose birth brings light and life to our World.




