Tuesday evening, July 9 at 7:30 PM, our Council will have its monthly General Meeting, a First Degree Exemplification and a Home Association Meeting. Deacon's Corner:

KNOWING SCRIPTURE HAS ITS BLESSINGS

A new pastor moved into town and went out one Saturday to visit his parishioners. All went well until he came to one house. It was obvious that someone was home, but no one came to the door even after he had knocked several times.

Finally, he took out his card and wrote on the back; Revelation 3:20; and stuck it on the door.

The next day the pastor was counting the collection and found a card, on it was written a message, Genesis 3:10.

I'm sure our Protestant friends would be laughing, and you will too as soon as you look up the passages.

The fact is, it's not so important to know every passage by number and be able to quote scripture, as it is to understand the message Jesus gives us. As we are back into what we call Ordinary Time in our Liturgical Year, and more focused on the teachings of Jesus rather than experiencing his birth or passion, as we do in Advent/Christmas and Lent/Easter, we will hear Jesus' teachings from Mathew's Gospel, as he and his decuples travel

throughout Galilee and eventually to Jerusalem. We will hear of Jesus's rejection by the Pharisee's and others, which leads up to the parable discourse followed by Jesus shown preparing for the establishment of his church.

Regardless if we read the bible daily, I encourage all of us to read the Scripture readings before Mass which will be read on the upcoming Sunday. Listening or reading along in the pews doesn't always give us enough time to reflect personally on what the Words of God are speaking to us as individuals, or understand what the Priest or Deacon is presenting in the Homily, or Sermon.

God's words are eternal, and often times the same passages may have different meanings at different points of our lives. God's continuing love is shown through his continual guidance, and this is received through the constant revisiting of the Sacred Scriptures, Psalms and the Gospels.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 14, 2014

Nine members were present when Grand Knight Steve Romofsky called the May Council meeting to order at 6:32 p.m. Upon closing the meeting doors, it was determined that there was not a quorum to do business. The Worthy Grand Knight led the opening prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

The Minutes of the April meeting were not read.

The Worthy Grand Knight reported on the following items:

- The Essay Contest social was a joyous event, even with a smaller than usual attendance.
- The May 9 Chapter dinner came together without difficulty. The Grand Knight thanked those who attended and helped with the food, preparation, and cleanup.
- The Scholarship social is May 28 with Chef Bruce and his brotherly brigade barbecuing tri-tip. Do not miss the opportunity to see and hear our scholarship winners.
- Our new Fiesta trailer is under construction and on schedule.
- Preparations for the June 21 Officer Installation and Latin Mass were discussed.
- Grand Knight Steven Romofsky and Trustee Mark Weitstock will be the Council's representatives at the State Convention.

Under the Treasurer's Report, the Essay Contest social showed 16 dinners paid and 15 guests of the

Council. This resulted in revenue of \$240.00, counting the Bar contribution. The cost of food was \$253.00, with a net loss to the of \$13.00.

The Financial Secretary reported three bills paid.

Under Membership, a First Degree Exemplification is tentatively planned for the July 9 meeting.

Pro-Life Report

MURDERED PRIEST WAS LOVED FOR PRAYING FOR UNBORN BABIES AT MODERN-DAY CALVARY

When Jesus was being crucified, one of his priests - St. John - was praying there in solidarity with him. Today, when Jesus is being re-crucified in His unborn babies, we sometimes see a priest praying in front of an abortion center.

Fr. Kenneth Walker was that kind of priest. Writing for LifeSiteNews, Pete Baklinski reports that the young priest, murdered recently in Phoenix by a burglar, was known and loved for his pro-life activism and homilies.

The writer says Bp. Thomas Olmsted of Phoenix recalls that “He and Fr. Terra, FSSP, [would] invite the whole congregation to say a prayer begging God for mercy regarding *Roe v. Wade* and the ‘scourge of abortion’ before they [began] their sermons.”

According to the *Catholic Sun*, the bishop also said, “Every time that I went to pray during the 40 Days for Life at the abortion places, [Fr. Walker] was there with Fr. Terra. They are faithful priests, joyfully serving their people.”

40 Days for Life leader José Calzadilla says the two priests prayed every week at Family Planning Associates and at Planned Parenthood. “Fr. Walker helped lead the Good Friday rosary at the Glendale Planned Parenthood this past spring,” he told *STOPP Report*. “They attended pro-life luncheons and rallies. Their support for the unborn came across as a natural part of their lived faith and priesthood. As a member of the pro-life community in the diocese, you just KNEW of or saw their support.”

In a recent homily you can watch on YouTube, Fr. Walker mentions the “evils of abortion and contraception” that “so plague our world.” (Google “Fr. Kenneth Walker” and “Mercy and Justice.”)

Lisa Blevins of Phoenix called Fr. Walker a “tireless pro-life prayer warrior.” “He was definitely always out there praying for all of those going into and coming out [of the abortion center]. He was just a wonderful witness to life,” she told LifeSiteNews. He’ll be “pouring down blessings from up high for us down here, especially for the 40 Days for Life campaigns.”

In his homily on YouTube, Fr. Walker reminds us that “Our Divine Savior loves us and desires our eternal happiness. Let us not disappoint Him or offend Him, for He is already so much offended. Nor let us seek perfect happiness in this world, with its fleeting joys and empty promises... Let us rather spend our lives in preparation for the eternal life of Heaven, where there is no more death or destruction, but the perfect attainment of all joy and peace.”

Over the years, a number of priests have prayed at the abortion mills of our town: Fr. Art Najera, Fr. John Love, Fr. Larry Gosselin, Fr. Andrew Garcia, Fr. Mike Ravenkamp, Fr. Vaughn Winters, Fr. Tom Hayes, Fr. Joe O’Gara, Fr. Brian Crawford, Bp. Pat Ziemann, Bp. Thaddeus Shubsda, Fr. Paul Marx and others whose names escape me. God bless them all!

**GENERAL MEETING OF
COUNCIL 1684
WEDNESDAY, JUNE 11, 2014**

Sixteen members were present when Grand Knight Steve Romofsky called the June Council meeting to order at 7:40 p.m. Upon closing the meeting doors, Warden James Bauer verified membership cards, and the Grand Knight led the opening prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the May meeting were approved as read.

The Worthy Grand Knight reported on the following items:

- Discussed the Scholarship Dinner, commenting that it was well attended. Serena Soto, daughter of Robert and Delores Soto, was complemented on her catering skills during the Scholarship Dinner. The Council is pleased with her service and will be partnering with her on catering future events.
- With Ralph Karleskint in semi-retirement, our Council is in need of a well-qualified catering service for the Knight's Nite Out.
- At the Officers' meeting Matthew Najera provided a brief introduction on the new Catholic High School, Saint Thérèse Classical Academy. This school is scheduled to be opened Fall 2014. More information can be found at www.thereseacademy.com.
- The procedures for the Latin Mass, Installation of Officers, and Pancake Breakfast scheduled for Saturday, June 21 was reviewed. Incoming officers were asked to follow a dress code for the installation as well as arriving by 8:45 a.m.
- A draft of the new membership roster was submitted for review by Brother Richard Rink.
- The proceedings of State Convention, held on the weekend of May 16-18 in Santa Clara, were reviewed. Grand Knight commended that the convention was a great experience.

- Progress continues on the trailer.

Under the Treasurer's Report, The Council's May bank statement reflects a balance of \$7,502.64 after deposits of \$29,375.00 and withdrawals of \$23,940.61. The Scholarship Dinner Social showed income of \$475.00 and expenses of \$319.16 for a profit of \$155.84. Attendance included 56 guests and 17 paid members.

Under Communication, the Council received a letter of appreciation acknowledging our gift of \$185.00 given to the Special Olympics Southern California – Santa Barbara County Region.

The Financial Secretary reported payment of two bills.

Under Membership, Brother Ray Charpentier reported on two new applications from Ricardo Herrera, First Reading, and Javier Briones, Second Reading, and readmission by Robert (Bobby) Sanchez.

Under Old Business:

- Second reading on the slate of officers 2014 – 2015 was given. On a motion to accept the slate of officers, there being no discussion, motion was approved unanimously by voice vote.
- Second reading of the Council's 2014-2015 budget was given. On a motion to accept the budget, there being no discussion, motion was approved unanimously by voice vote.

Under New Business:

- Brother Matthew Najera provided a brief presentation on the new Catholic High School, Saint Thérèse Classical Academy serving Carpinteria, Santa Barbara and Goleta. Primary goals of the school is a Catholic secondary education that is affordable for lower income families, accessible to children within our three communities with emphasis on teaching the Catholic Faith, Western Culture and Civilization, along with language and science.

- The statue of Christopher Columbus has been moved from the main hall to the meeting room. The move provides more space for the grand piano, and less risk for the statue being damaged. The Mission has requested that the Council pay the moving expenses.
- David Borgatello has raised concerns about having a quality catering service for the next Knight's Nite Out scheduled for October 22. We also need members to sell tickets.
- John Green stated that he has derived a formula for periodically withdrawing funds earned annually by Home Association investments.

Under the Field Agent's Report, Mike Rachford commented on the importance for protecting our families financially, and why our families are important to our lives. He also announced that our Council has made Star Status. He concluded his message by stating that he is celebrating his first year as a field agent for the Knights.

There was no District Deputy's Report.

Prayers for the Sick or Distressed,

- Members are asked to pray for our District Deputy Ray Centeno on the death of his uncle.
- In addition, members are asked to pray for Armando Vasquez, John Connolly, Joseph Connolly, Joseph Corsaro, and John Balster and his wife.

Under the Good of the Order,

- Grand Knight provided a signup list for members seeking further information on Saint Thérèse Classical Academy.

Following a closing prayer by Worthy Grand Knight Steve Romofsky, the Council meeting was adjourned at 8:40 p.m.



Fourteen students from three local Catholic schools had four things in common — a high grade point average, outstanding extracurricular activities, a clear focus on their priorities in life, and a scholarship in their pocket from the Knights of Columbus.

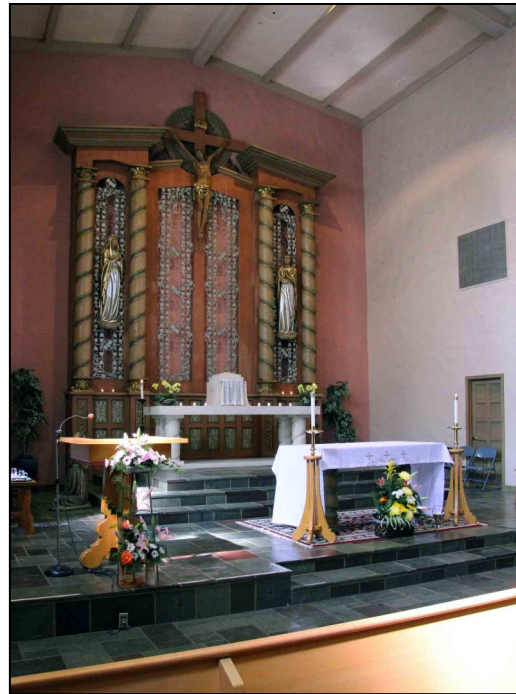
