STAY AWAKE

s we are approaching the end of Pope Francis's Jubilee Year of Mercy; what have we done to serve our neighbors and those who are in the most need of Christ's love and compassion? Have we acted as Christ would have?

What can we do to prepare ourselves and our families for Christ's coming on Christmas, in the Eucharist, and at any other time in our lives?

Pro-Life Report

NO CATHOLIC MAY VOTE FOR A PRO-ABORT CANDIDATE, SAYS SUPREME KNIGHT

Abortion "has resulted in more than 40 million deaths," he reminded us, and isn't "just another political issue." "What political issue could possibly outweigh this human devastation?" he asked. "Abortion is different. Abortion is the killing of the innocent on a massive scale." "We need to end the political manipulation of Catholic voters by abortion advocates," the head of our Order insisted. "It is time to end the entanglement of Catholic people with abortion killing. It is time to stop creating excuses for voting for pro-abortion politicians." "We will never succeed in building a culture of life if we continue to vote for politicians who support a culture of death," he told his listeners, including 11 cardinals, 95 bishops and numerous priests. Many bishops have stated that it's a sin to vote for pro-abortion candidates.

It's shocking that one prominent candidate for President constantly proclaims her support for unlimited abortions. She gushes praise for abortion giant Planned Parenthood (PP), whose foundress, Margaret Sanger, used insulting names for Hispanics, Blacks and Italians, and said Catholics shouldn't be allowed to "breed." PP has killed seven million unborn babies and even sells babies' body parts.

This presidential candidate vows to give us Supreme Court justices who'll keep abortion legal. She also vows to kill the Hyde Amendment, which has saved two million babies' lives by barring the use of our taxes for abortions. She says pro-life religious beliefs "must be changed." Plus, she backs assisted suicide, homosexual "marriage," and forcing all girls to register for the military draft. Her running mate is almost as pro-abortion as she is.

The other leading candidate says he's pro-life, pledges to give us pro-life Supreme Court justices, and promises to end all tax funding for PP. His running mate is strongly pro-life and says the two will send the 1973 Supreme Court ruling that legalized abortion to "the ash heap of history." Both men promise to defend our religious freedom against attacks such as the Obamacare "death mandate," which will force Catholic institutions to provide abortion pills to their employees. Their party's 2016 Platform opposes euthanasia, assisted suicide and "gay marriage."

Millions of lives — *including yours and mine* — are at stake. Before God, we must vote only for pro-life candidates at all levels of government: national, state, county, and city.


