

Deacon's Corner:

THE MYSTERY OF FAITH

Levery week at Mass we remind ourselves of the mystery of our faith — that by his death and resurrection Jesus set us free, and he will come again in glory. How do we know this? Could we convince someone else that this is true?

If what we mean by "true" is factual evidence backed up by science, we will not be able to "prove" this to anyone. But God provides us with a different way of knowing. It comes from the revelation of God in creation, Scripture, and Christ. Our faith is a gift from God, the ability to recognize the truth of the mysteries we proclaim at Mass and in our daily activities.

In scripture God rewards Abraham's faith, which led him to obey a God he did not even know. Abraham wasn't worried about proving that God spoke to him; he lived it. In the same

way Jesus calls his disciples and all of us to be ready and waiting for the Lord's return.

We can't convince everyone that the resurrection and baptism affect salvation that the consecration is real, or that Jesus will come again. We can, however, show the difference our faith makes in our own lives as we encounter others, work for justice, and spread the Gospel. Our obedience, virtues, and good works are proof of our faith and reveal the truths that we accept. Nowhere is this truer than at the Eucharistic table, where we celebrate the mysteries in community with and joyful expectation of the One who is forever and ever.

n completion of the Second Degree Ceremony, the August General Meeting of Council 1684 was called to order at 8:15 PM by our Grand Knight Mark Wietstock. Nine officers were present. Our Grand Knight led the brothers in prayer followed by a pledge of allegiance to the American Flag.

Since there was no quorum for holding the July Council Meeting, no minutes were reported.

Under the Grand Knight's Report:

- Grand Knight thanked the Second Degree team for performing the ceremony. Two brother Knights earned their Second Degree: Alexis Herrera from Council 1684 and Stephen Dewalt from Council 5300.
- Grand Knight reviewed Fiesta event. While the sale of soft drinks was again down, execution of sales went smoothly. A full report will be reported at the September Council Meeting.
- Grand Knight reported on the meeting that he and other grand knights and deputy grand knights had with Bishop Barron on Saturday, August 6. The meeting was held at the Old Mission. The Bishop will push for pastors to support the Knights within their parishes.
- On the progress for Dissolution of the Home Association, a recurring agenda item, the Grand Knight will be meeting with a lawyer to review tax matters with regard to the dissolution.
- On future events, a Third Degree is planned for August 27 at Serra Hall. Following the ceremony will be a luncheon. Our Council's next dinner-social is scheduled for Wednesday, September 28. David Borgatello has made arrangements for having the dinner catered. Knights' Nite Out is scheduled for October 26. This event is a major fund raiser with funds distributed to eight local charities. Tickets are \$125 per couple. Wednesday November 16 is the Council's Memorial Mass. Our Christmas dinnersocial is scheduled for Wednesday December 14, and the Clergy-Religious Appreciation Dinner supervised by our Council at Bishop Garcia High School on Wednesday, January 25, 2017.

Pro-Life Report



SANSUM, VISITING NURSE WILL FACILITATE PATIENTS' SUICIDES

There is a way which seems just to a man, but its conclusion leads to death. (Proverbs 14:12)

id you hear the awful news? Sansum Clinic has announced that it will assist patients who ask doctors to give them a deadly drug under the new "assisted suicide" law that "Catholic" Gov. Jerry Brown signed into law. Dr. Fred Kass of the Sansum-affiliated Cancer Center said, "we have a

responsibility" to do what the legislature wants. Our local Visiting Nurse & Hospice Care said it won't participate directly, but will be "educating and supporting" its patients who want doctors to give them the death potion. (*The Independent*, July 21, 2016.)

Doctors don't have to take part in this evil—for now. But how long will it be till the courts rule that all Americans have a previously unnoticed "constitutional right" to death, and that any doctor who says no is violating the patient's "civil rights?" (Canada's new "assisted suicide" law requires every doctor to give the death cup to his or her patients—no moral objections allowed.)

And how long until the courts rule that doctors may kill patients <u>directly</u>, and that it's a crime for any doctor or hospital, including Catholic hospitals, to refuse? Rest assured, pro-"mercy killing" activists, lawyers, judges, politicians, journalists, editorial writers, celebrities and billionaires are working right now to give you and me our "constitutional right" to be murdered.

As Catholics and Knights, we have a duty to fight California's "assisted suicide" law (which our State Senator, Hannah-Beth Jackson, co-sponsored). Here are some ways we can do that:

ONE, we should pray that Almighty God, His Mother, His angels and His saints get the law removed from the books.

TWO, we should support the Life Legal Defense Foundation (<u>www.lldf.org</u>), which is fighting in court to get the law ruled unconstitutional.

THREE, we should warn our family and friends about Sansum's and Visiting Nurse's deadly plans.

FOUR, we should write or call those institutions and tell them (politely, of course) why we oppose their horrific decision.

FIVE, we should ask our doctors and other healthcare workers whether they approve of giving death drugs to patients. If so, we should find new doctors.

SIX, we should write letters to newspapers, go online, and call in to talk shows, saying why we oppose the new law.

SEVEN, we should ask candidates for State Assembly, State Senate, State Attorney General, U.S. Congress and U.S. Senate whether they favor giving sick people deadly poison. If so, they're enemies of God, our Faith, us and our families. Let's vote accordingly.

K OF C-SPONSORED MERCY CENTER CLOSES OUT WITH A PAPAL SEND-OFF



In his last public visit before leaving Poland, Pope Francis met with 12,000 World Youth Day volunteers at the Knights of Columbus-sponsored Mercy Center at Tauron Arena Kraków, Sunday, July 31.

The arena counted 10,000 volunteers from Poland and 2,000 from other parts of the world, who came together to celebrate their hard work and to rejoice in the presence of the Holy Father. Many of the volunteers had been working for months to plan World Youth Day, which drew approximately two million young people to Kraków.

Pope Francis, who was accompanied by Cardinal Stanisław Dziwisz of Kraków and Auxiliary Bishop Damian Muskus, O.F.M., the coordinator-

general of WYD Kraków, arrived at the Mercy Center around 5:00 p.m. CET. The Holy Father was privately greeted and welcomed by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori of Baltimore.

When the Holy Father arrived on stage, he paused in prayer before the WYD cross and the image of Our Lady of Kalwaria, a 17th-century Polish painting of Our Lady of Calvary. The presence of the miraculous image was especially significant as it was only the third time it traveled out of the Church of the Angelic Mother of God adjacent to the Franciscan Monastery in Kalwaria Zebrzydowska — one of the most visited pilgrimage sites in Poland.

It was also before this painting that young Karol Wojtyła's father had entrusted his son to the protection of the Blessed Mother following the death of his wife, Karol's mother. Young Wojtyła is today's St. John Paul II, who as pope had an unshakeable devotion to the Blessed Mother.

Pope Francis then spent some quiet moments venerating the relics on stage of five Polish saints: St. John Paul II and St. Faustina Kowalska, co-patrons of World Youth Day 2016; St. Albert Chmielowski, St. Maximilian Kolbe and Blessed Jerzy Popiełuszko. The relics will return to the United States and remain at the Saint John Paul II National Shrine in Washington, D.C., which is owned and operated by the Knights of Columbus.

Archbishop Lori, together with Dominican Father Jonathan Kalisch and Szymon Czyszek, representing the Knights of Columbus, were among those sitting on stage with the Holy Father throughout the event. The college Knights, who had volunteered all week at the Mercy Center, formed part of the excited crowd, a lucky few receiving front row seats.

Having prepared a five-page speech in Italian for the volunteers, Pope Francis referred to it, telling the WYD volunteers that 'it was a little boring.' To an eruption of cheers and applause, he set it aside, choosing instead to speak off-the-cuff in his native Spanish.

"Preparing the World Youth Day is an adventure, a real adventure. I wish to thank all you volunteers for all you've done, for those hours you sacrificed for prayer."

"Do you want to be the hope for the future?" he asked. "Well, there's no need to pay an entry fee — you just have to meet some conditions. The first is to preserve your memory: of your people, your family and where you come from, the memory of your journey and what you received from those closest to you."

The pope added, "But the second condition for the future of hope, aside from memory of the past, is to have courage — to be courageous, not fearful."

Dominican Father Patrick Briscoe, a member of the Knights of Columbus organizing team for the Mercy Center, had the best vantage point on stage, assisting the Holy Father with the microphone throughout the event.

"It's so clear that the Holy Father loves being with pilgrims," Father Briscoe said. "You can tell he was speaking from the heart when he spoke to the volunteers, appreciating all they did to make this event possible."

Offering words of encouragement to the volunteers, the Pope Francis concluded:

"Once Mary had finished assisting Elizabeth, she went back home to Nazareth ... You too, dear volunteers, will not witness all the fruits of your work here in Kraków. Your brothers and sisters whom you served will see them in their lives and rejoice in them. That is the 'gratuitousness' of love! Yet God knows your dedication, your commitment and your generosity. You can be sure that he will not fail to repay you for everything you have done for this Church!"
