It Shouldn't Feel Ordinary

Legin by wishing all, my brother's in Christ a very happy New Year's and hope your Christmas season was blessed with joy and peace.

As our liturgical Christmas season ends with the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, we again enter into what we call "Ordinary Time". Ordinary time runs from the End of the Christmas season until Ash Wednesday (which is determined by a formula based on the moon and the spring equinox, and then is counted back from Easter).

This year we have a fairly long time from Christmas to Easter where we will have eight weeks of ordinary time. The Church decorations will go from the white of Christmas to green and we will hear Matthew's Gospel starting with Jesus's ministry in Nazareth and taking through the Sermon on the Mount, and will resume again after the Easter Season.

Although we call this Ordinary Time it certainly is not just ordinary. It is the time outside of the usual high seasons of Lent and Advent, Christmas and Easter; a time for us to reflect on Jesus's ministry and his teachings through the Gospels and certainly in the Eucharist.


My hope is, we all be attentive to the readings and Psalms at Mass during these weeks leading up to Lent and Easter to better understand the mystery of Christ and his saving grace.

General Meeting of Council 1684 Wednesday, December 7, 2016

welve members were present when Grand Knight Mark Weitstock called the Council meeting for December to order at 7:47 p.m. Upon closing the meeting doors, Acting Warden Ray Charpentier verified membership cards, and the Grand Knight led the opening prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.

The Minutes of October meeting were unavailable. There was no quorum.

The Worthy Grand Knight reported on the following items:

- The Worthy Grand Knight and Trustee John Green met with Homer Sheffield, an eminent attorney in this field, and set up a framework from which to turn our Home Association into a charitable trust.
- The Christmas social will be held December 14th with dinner served at 7:00 p.m. The menu will include chicken, mashed potatoes, mixed steamed vegetables and dessert. Seasonally appropriate entertainment will be provided. The six winners (three from Mt. Carmel School and three from Notre Dame School) of the poster contest will be awarded their prizes and certificates, and their posters will be on display. The Council received a record number of entries this year!
- The catering has been arranged for the Clergy Appreciation Dinner at Bishop Diego High School on January 25th. This wonderful annual event is a real highlight of the Council's Columbian year. Cocktails are at 7:00 p.m. and dinner at 7:30. Tickets are still available at \$20 per person.

Under the Treasurer's Report, the Treasurer reported a beginning balance of \$14,052.24. After deposits of \$250 and withdrawals of \$8,643.18, the ending November balance was \$5,659.06.

The Financial Secretary reported 13 bills paid.

Under Membership,

A discussion took place noting that there were no new members in the pipeline. There were suggestions on how to promote membership in our parishes. A free pancake breakfast was proposed to attract new members, but was tabled.

Under Communication,

The Council heard from:

Pro-Life Report

Pro-life Attorneys Fight to Save Young Dad from Being Starved to Death

The latest victim is Joe, a young father of three little children who might be starved and dehydrated to death soon.

Joe's nightmare began when he went to the emergency room with a sore throat. Suddenly, he stopped breathing. For some reason, the hospital didn't insert a breathing tube, leaving him without oxygen for several minutes and causing serious brain damage. While Joe can breathe on his own, he must use a feeding tube to receive nutrition and hydration.

Some of his relatives are seeking to remove Joe's hydration and make him die of thirst. They succeeding in getting his feeding tube removed, and his condition started deteriorating.

Joe can't talk, but he recognizes his little daughters and other relatives and "speaks" with them by blinking. His health is good otherwise, but he's getting weaker since the hospital cut off his nutrition.

In early December, attorneys from the Life Legal Defense Foundation got a temporary court order barring the hospital from permanently ending Joe's hydration. That saved his life, for the moment.

The pro-life attorneys are still fighting for Joe's life in court. But it won't be easy, because the relatives who want him killed would normally have priority as medical decision-makers over the other relatives (his siblings) who want to keep him alive.

Joe needs your prayers! Please pray that the court will rule in favor of Joe's siblings, who are trying desperately to save his life. Please pray for Joe, his three little daughters, and for the attorneys who are battling for him.

Also pray for the defeat of the assisted-suicide and euthanasia movements, this eventually will kill millions of people if they succeed in imposing their lethal agenda on our whole country.

The recent presidential election offers a bright ray of hope to all who uphold the sacredness of innocent human life. Please pray that we'll soon have a new, pro-life majority on the Supreme Court and that it'll ban assisted suicide and euthanasia in all 50 states.

Special thank you to the brother Knights that cooked and served the dinner.












