### SENATORS HARRIS AND HIRONO MAKE BIGOTED ATTACK ON KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS, MEN AND CATHOLIC FAITH

Did you know that as a Knight, a man and a Catholic, you're a menace to America? Sen. Kamala Harris (D-CA) and Sen. Mazie Hirono (D-HI) believe you are, judging from the questions they've asked of Omaha attorney

Brian C. Buescher, a nominee for the U.S. District Court for Nebraska. Mr. Buescher is a Knight of Columbus.

LifeNews.com (Dec. 26, 2018) reports that the two members of the Senate Judiciary Committee recently sent written questions to him "proposing that he resign his affiliation with the Knights, which they call an 'all male society' that 'has taken a number of extreme positions'" on moral issues.

Democrats on the Judiciary Committee have displayed anti-Catholic bigotry before. During Judge Amy Coney Barrett's confirmation hearing for the 7<sup>th</sup> U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in September, 2017, Sen. Hirono suggested that the Judge's Catholic beliefs would make her a bad judge. Sen. Dianne Feinstein told Judge Barrett that "the [Catholic] dogma lives loudly within you, and that's of concern...." (Never mind that the U.S. Constitution bars any religious test for public officials.)

The LifeNews.com story says Sen. Harris asked Mr. Buescher whether he knew our Order's leaders oppose sodomite "marriage," and Sen. Hirono questioned his ability to judge fairly on issues such as abortion.

"The Knights of Columbus is a Roman Catholic service organization with approximately two million members worldwide," Mr. Buescher replied. "The organization has a religious and charitable purpose. I joined the Knights of Columbus when I was 18 years old and have been a member ever since." He also noted that the Order "does not have the authority to take personal political positions on behalf of all of its approximately two million members."

Democratic Senators also queried Mr. Buescher about his unsuccessful campaign to become his state's attorney general, during which he said he was "an avidly pro-life person." Sen. Harris complained that Supreme Knight Carl Anderson had lamented that abortion "has resulted in more than [60] million deaths."

*Newsweek* (Dec. 24, 2018) says Knights of Columbus spokesperson Kathleen Blomquist criticized the Senators' questions, telling the Catholic News Agency that "Our country's sad history of anti-Catholic bigotry contributed to the founding of the Knights of Columbus, and we are proud of the many Catholics who overcame this hurdle to contribute so greatly to our country."

"We were extremely disappointed," she added, "to see that one's commitment to Catholic principles through membership in the Knights of Columbus — a charitable organization that adheres to and promotes Catholic teachings — would be viewed as a disqualifier from public service in this day and age."

Historian Arthur M. Schlesinger, Jr. once called anti-Catholic bigotry "the last acceptable prejudice" in America. Some politicians are fanning its flames to new heights. In the past, our Order stood strongly against the Ku Klux Klan, and now we must speak out against a new species of haters.

Members are encouraged to attend. Being Council 1684's turn for holding the Annual Clergy and Religious Appreciation Dinner, Council officers agreed for holding the event on Wednesday evening January 23 at Serra Hall. Announcements need to mailed inviting clergy and religious, brother Knights and their wives, other guests as well as finding a guest speaker.

Issue of supporting the Safe Environment Training Program was discussed. A Council supporting this program requires the Grand Knight, Program Director, Community Director and Family Director from its membership. Purpose: Catholic Churches, schools, and youth organizations must ensure that children and youth who worship, study, or participate in activities sponsored by a parish can do so in the safest and most secure setting possible.





- I attended the State Deputy Forum on Sunday November 18, with State Deputy Jose Salaiz, State Membership Director Michael Brault and State Programs Director Eric Watson.
  - a. Recruitment and retention were very important themes. Michael Brault reviewed and presented several ideas for recruitment and retention:
    - i. Using the on-line Form-100. Basic idea: Get them signed up while they are thinking about it.
    - ii. Be a full time sales person/recruiter for Knights of Columbus.
    - iii. Hand out printed items after mass with your Council contact information: print your own postcards with the Council information on it.
    - iv. Have a regularly scheduled Formation (1<sup>st</sup>) Degree Ceremony, monthly if possible. This will facilitate getting new members (and new on-line members) involved in the Council.
    - v. There is more formalized procedure for removing non-dues paying Knights from the Council membership. It has been implemented to assure that every effort has been made to retain a Knight.

Suggested more frequent use of Form-1831 for Knights that may be in some distress physical financially or otherwise.

b. Bro. Eric Watson spoke about KofC programs and Star Council achievement. Bro. Eric volunteered his services to help any Council that has any questions or issues with California State Knights website.

### **REMEMBERING OZZIE DA ROS**

Ozzie Da Ros, born April 28, 1921 to Antonio Da Ros and Marianna Mautino; died November 13, 2018. Ozzie graduated from Santa Barbara High School, later serving with the US Army in Persia during World War II. He was active in the Parks Department of Santa Barbara serving with Mayors Don McGillivary and Gerald Firestone. He was a member of Knights of Columbus Council 1684, the El Pescatore Club, E Clampus Vitus and the Westerners, serving on boards of the St. Francis Foundation, Santa Barbara Historical Museum, Santa Barbara Carriage Museum, Old Spanish Days and as well as Catholic Charities amongst others.

Ozzie was involved in previous restorations of Mission Santa Barbara, Santa Barbara Museum of Art and La Arcada and the Museum of Natural History. He built the Santa Barbara Historical Museum producing the adobes in his own yard. He will be remembered for extensive masonry and landscape work on many well recognized estates in Santa Barbara and Montecito. He participated in the development of many of the garden areas at Lotusland working closely with Madame Ganna Walska for decades taking over for his father who had worked under the previous owners and carrying forward into the third generation with his son, Peter Da Ros.

Predeceased by his wife Kathleen Lennon Da Ros in 2004 and his sister, Mary Devine in 2012. He is survived by his children Kathleen Mackins and Peter Da Ros (Christina) of Santa Barbara and Ann Martin of Fort Worth, Texas. Also survived by grandchildren Bradley Mackins (Kristen), Danielle Leholm (Ryan Bailey), Katie O'Toole, Rachel Da Ros and Marianna Da Ros, Keegan Anderson (Dustin) and James Martin; great-grandchildren Chase and Austin Mackins, Kaylie Leholm and Brixton Bailey. A memorial service for Ozzie was given on Friday afternoon November 30th at Our Lady of Sorrows Church. 



#### KNIGHTS GIVE MORE THAN \$200,000 TO WILDFIRE VICTIMS by Andrew Fowler 12/4/2018

In California, ash is all that remains of 69 Knights' homes.

The state's most destructive and deadliest wildfire, now fully contained, devastated over 150,000 acres, causing at least 85 deaths and destroyed approximately 19,000 residences and commercial buildings. Some Knights barely escaped the raging blaze as all their possessions became engulfed in flames

In response, Knights from local, state and nationwide councils are sending assistance, collectively giving more than \$200,000 to the victims. Knights from San Francisco came in with \$9,000 in gift cards as well as backpacks filled with supplies. Aurora Council 53 in Seymour, Conn., hosted several movie nights to raise money for the California wildfire victims. Meanwhile, some Knights have individually written checks up to \$5,000.

The Supreme Council is providing more than \$132,500 for recovery efforts.

While donations like these bring hope, the trauma is ever-present in what Jim Collins, grand knight of St. Thomas More Church Council 7773 in Paradise, Calif., the epicenter of the destruction, describes as a wasteland.

"In my own neighborhood, there are six homes out of about 60 left," said Collins. "Other areas it is zero, where you had one hundred homes. It is zero." For other victims, the question yet unanswered is whether to rebuild in the same community or not.

"A lot of people are walking around kind of in a zombie-state, just overwhelmed by having to rebuild and trying to figure out what their next move is," said Collins.

The support from Knights at every level throughout the country has brought their brother Knights hope.

"People break down in tears because they figured there was no hope," said Collins. "I think it shows what the Knights are really, truly all about."

Among the buildings destroyed in the fire was St. Thomas More Catholic Church in Paradise. With no parish building of their own, parishioners now attend Our Divine Savior Catholic Church in the nearby town of Chico. There, on Dec. 2, a Mass was said for wildfire victims, attended by 250 people.

Following the Mass, California State Deputy Joe

Salaiz, distributed disaster relief funds to the victims as well as mentioned that the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council in New Haven, Conn. gave \$132,500 to disaster relief efforts, with \$120,000 allocated to charity and an additional \$12,500 for clean-up supplies and gift cards.

"This is a perfect example of Father McGivney's mission, to be there for the families and to take care of our families," said Salaiz.

The Knights of Columbus, founded by the Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney in 1882, established an insurance program for the protection of Catholic families during a period when Catholic men often held dangerous occupations. The tradition of Knights securing a life insurance policy continues today, as it not only protects their families in dire circumstances, but also funds the Order's charitable outreach.

"Across the board, whether they are Knights or whether they are not Knights there is this incredible regard, a very positive, high regard for the Knights of Columbus and how we take care of our brothers," said Collins.
