• Brother Edward Corral is suffering through some age-related problems.


Good of the Order:

COURT ALLOWS FEDS TO SLASH UP TO \$60 MILLION FROM PLANNED PARENTHOOD FUNDING

ometimes the "Nutty Ninth" gets it right. A panel of the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals says the administration may refuse U.S. tax dollars to groups such as abortion giant Planned Parenthood that kill unborn babies on their premises (see story at LifeSiteNews.com, June 20). This is a temporary

win, though, and the court will consider lawsuits against the policy.

In February, the White House declared that entities that get Title X "family planning" dollars must be physically and financially separate from those that abort babies or "refer" mothers for abortions. Experts say the new Protect Life Rule will keep as much as \$60 million out of Planned Parenthood's coffers.

Planned Parenthood President Leana Wen called the court ruling "devastating" and whined that the baby-saving policy was "unethical, illegal, and harmful to public health."

According to the LifeSiteNews story, the Department of Health and Human Services says the Rule also ends "referral for abortion as a method of family planning," eliminates a "requirement that Title X providers offer abortion counseling and referral," and requires "more complete reporting by grantees about subrecipients and more clarity about informal partnerships with referral agencies."

"This ruling is a victory for President Trump and the majority of Americans who do not want to fund the abortion industry with their tax dollars," said Marjorie Dannenfelser, President of the pro-life Susan B. Anthony List. "The Protect Life Rule," she added, stops "abortion businesses like Planned Parenthood from treating Title X as their private slush fund...."

Twenty-one states and the District of Columbia are suing to abort the Protect Life Rule. Politico reports that "Some states challenging the rule, including Oregon and Washington, have said they will withdraw from the Title X program if the new rules are allowed to take effect, potentially forfeiting millions of dollars."

On June 19, the Democrats in the House passed a spending package that'd kill the Protect Life Rule, but their bill will gain the approval of neither the Senate nor the President.

Swald J. (John) Moreno was born to Salvador Moreno and Margaret Castelo in Ventura California on November 19, 1930. Sadly Salvador perished several months before John was born. His mother Margaret later married Mauro Bonilla who raised him and his five siblings. The family moved to Goleta when John was 8. He attended Goleta Union School. Later, attending Santa Barbara Junior High and Santa Barbara High School where John was a Seal Bearer and a member of the Honor Society, John was very active in sports, participating in basketball, football and track. John graduated Santa Barbara High School in June 1948 with Honors and attended UCSB when the campus was on the Riviera.

In 1951 John met Olive Motz, and they fell in love. John transferred to the University of California San Francisco to attend Pharmacy School. In June of 1952 John and Olive were married in San Francisco. They welcomed their first child Salvador Michael in July of 1953. 
