

BISHOPS FIGHT MOM'S EFFORTS TO SAVE HER BABY'S LIFE

hen Baby Jesus was born, there was no room for Him in the inn. Today there's no room in the Texas Catholic Conference of Bishops for a baby targeted for death. In a shocking report, LifeSiteNews (Dec. 13) says the Mike Engler Conference has filed an amicus brief that sides with a hospital that wants 10month-old Tinslee Lewis to die.

The prematurely born baby, a patient at Cook Children's Medical Center in Fort Worth, has had surgeries for a heart defect, lung disease and severe, chronic pulmonary hypertension, and is on a ventilator. In October, doctors said they couldn't save her and wanted to cut off her life support. Tinslee's parents got a court order stopping them, and state Attorney General Ken Paxton also filed a brief defending her life.

But the bishops and two pro-life (!) groups went to court, backing the hospital against Tinslee, according to the lay Catholic watchdog group Church Militant. The bishops' brief purported that treating the little girl would "unnecessarily prolong" her life. It said nothing about parents' rights to protect their children's lives in hospitals.

The bishops said they backed the 1999 "Texas Advance Directives Act" (TADA), which prolifers say gives hospitals and their "ethics panels" dangerous power over the lives of patients, even patients who aren't dying.

Church Militant notes that it wasn't some terminal condition that made Tinslee's doctors want her to die, it was because the hospital's "ethics panel" said her "quality of life" didn't measure up. But the Daily Mail says her mother, Trinity Lewis, testified that Tinslee is a "sassy" girl who enjoys cartoons and toys, and expresses her views, e.g., about which nurses are her favorites.

Last March the Texas Bishops backed hospital officials when doctors sought to remove patient Chris Dunn's feeding tube against the wishes of his mother. At the time, Texas Right to Life president Jim Graham said the Bishops' Conference had "kind of become an arm" of left-wing politicians.

Texas pro-life groups are asking lawmakers and Gov. Rick Abbott to reform TADA to protect patients' lives. In the meantime, please pray for Baby Tinslee.


