

FATHER ALBERTO ON PILGRIMAGE

Father Alberto was accompanied by eight parishioners from St Raphael's church on a recent pilgrimage to Israel and Italy conducted by the Pastor and an Associate Pastor from Mission Santa Barbara. Father is preparing his story of the visit, but I want to tell you some of the things he might not dwell upon. It was, of course, Father's first trip outside the Americas. The trip was intense and our time was fully occupied but Father never missed an event. (We were very fortunate to have left Israel before the current problems began.) The most wonderful part of being on the pilgrimage with Father was being present at Masses he and the other priests celebrated in some of the most famous Christian sites in the world. He concelebrated with Father Vincent and Father Daniel at Ste. Catherine Church (next to The Church of the Nativity) in Bethlehem, The Church of the Visitation in Ein Karem, The Emmaus Church and The Church of the Cenacle (Room of the Last Supper). He was the principal celebrant at the Church of the Transfiguration and The Church of the Beatitudes. At this last site the Church was completely booked so we had Mass out-of-doors in a beautiful amphitheater where the altar was backed up against a spectacular view of the Sea of Galilee. In a later conversation with Father he talked of the thrill of celebrating the Mass at these holy sites. The high point of his trip, though, was in Rome. There he was the principal celebrant at Mass in Saint Peter's Basilica! Our Mass was held in the Chapel of Saint Barbara, just to the left of Bernini's famous main altar of the Basilica. The last two Masses he concelebrated in Italy were at the tomb of St. Francis in the lower level of The Basilica of St. Francis in Assisi and in the little Church of Porziuncola that sits in middle of the Basilica of Saint Mary of the Angels, also in Assisi. All of us from St. Raphael Church were as proud of our Parish Priest as though we were his parents. Father confided later that he never, in his wildest dreams, expected to one day celebrate Mass in St Peter's Basilica. This pilgrimage involved a series of deeply moving experiences for all of us and having Father Alberto with us made them even more special.



Membership Director's Report <u>Three new Members Join</u> <u>KOC In October,</u> <u>Membership report</u>








Front Row October Initiates: Roy Fong, Frank Lynch, John Vasellina. Back row September Initiates: Ted Osborne, Chris Arnoult.

This past Saturday (Oct. 20) I attended the Santa Barbara Pastoral Region's Religious Education Congress at Bishop Diego High School. One of the vendors at the Congress was the Archdiocesan Vocations Office. I had an interesting conversation with Father Michael Ume of the Vocations Office. Amid all the pamphlets and brochures were several tha caught my interest for use in youth ministry. Classes were in session, so Father and I had a chance to talk uninterrupted. He told me about the recently held "Come and See Retreat" held at St. John's Seminary. This was one of several that will be held this year to allow youth to explore a vocation. The weekend had 36 youth inquiring about a religious future. These youth were described as bright and eager to explore the calling within them. Hopefully, some of them will realize that calling and respond in a most generous way to the Lord. I would encourage each one of you to pray for these youth as they discern their vocation. One of the pamphlets on the table was published by this Archdiocese. One of the short articles was titled An Archdiocesan Priest in Los Angeles. I would like to share with you the points brought out about the life of a priest.

 \emptyset Leads the people into unity with each other and unity with God through the Eucharist.

 \emptyset Prays for the people daily through the Liturgy of the Hours, sacrifices and intercessory prayer.

 \emptyset Brings people into peace with God, self and others through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

 \emptyset Loves all people inclusively within a celibate lifestyle. \emptyset Prays, studies, and preaches the Gospel in such a way that people in a specific place and time can hear the Word and put it into practice.

Ø Animates, stimulates and coordinates the gifts, desires, and talents of people in the parish community.

 \emptyset Works with lay leaders and pairsh ministers in creating communities of faith and justice.

Ø Helps a multi-cultural community of people do what is pleasing to God. What a beautiful job description! We pray that many will respond to the call. Financial Secretary's Report 16 Sept – 15 Oct 2000



The council recorded expenses of \$3,439.51 and income of \$2262.00 during the period of September 16 through October 15 2000. The 31 expense items included Tootsie Roll supplies for the MR Drive (\$431.25), Keep Christ in Christmas supplies (\$291.38), support for a St. Mark's retreat (\$500), liability insurance for the November 2000 through October 2001 period (\$198.60), Catholic Charities (\$100), Catholic advertising assessment by the Supreme Council (\$65.20), Knightline (\$130.89) publication expenses and Octoberfest supply and entertainment expenses of slightly more than \$700. The income included \$639 from the September dinner and breakfast, \$369 from dues and initiation fees, and \$1.254 from Octoberfest.

The council added three new members at the 9 October First Degree, and lost no members during this period. Our active membership stands at 199, including 16 Honorary members and 45 Honorary Life members.
