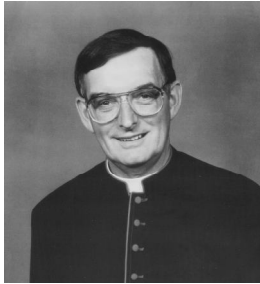


## Chaplain's Message

*For Advent and Christmas*

*"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light.."*

These are the opening words of the First Reading at Christmas Midnight Mass (words from Isaiah 9:1) and express very well the Good News of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany. Jesus, the Light of the World, comes, the Savior of the world, born for us as a baby in Bethlehem. Our Advent preparation for the coming of Christ begins this year on December 3<sup>rd</sup> just as the days grow shorter, colder, and darker. In the growing darkness of December, the Advent wreath candles grow in light and remind us that we are waiting in joyful hope for the coming of Jesus, the Light of the World. The Readings and prayers at Mass each day in Advent encourage us to wait "in joyful hope" for Jesus who comes: at Christmas as we celebrate his birth; at the end of the world when he will come in glory; and each day as he comes in Holy Eucharist, in our prayer and Advent Bible reading, in our meeting and greeting each other, in each

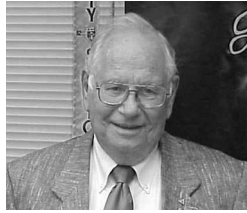

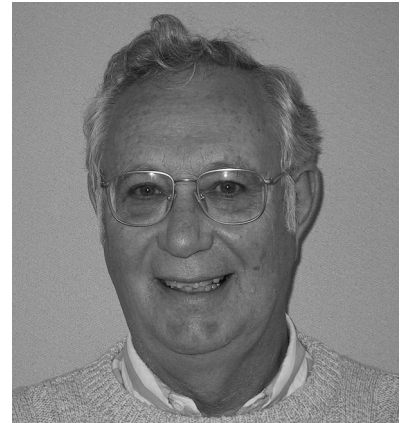

## **A Pro-Life Message**

It is sometimes hard to believe how deeply the "Culture of Death" has permeated society over the past several decades. From Paris, France came this recent news that a handicapped teenager was entitled to damages for having been born. In a decision that opened the way to suits for "wrongful birth," the highest French appeal court accepted the argument of Josette and Christian Perruche that doctors should have advised the abortion of Nicolas, their 17-year-old son, who was born deaf, badly mentally handicapped and nearly blind. The couple, from the western Paris suburbs, launched their case more than a decade ago after it emerged that Mme Perruche had suffered from rubella (German measles) during pregnancy in 1982, causing the child's malformation. A doctor and a laboratory accepted that their tests on her had failed to diagnose the disease. She had requested an abortion in the event that she had been

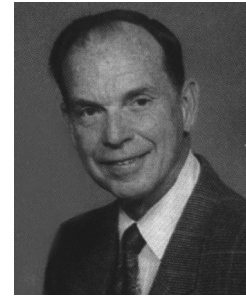

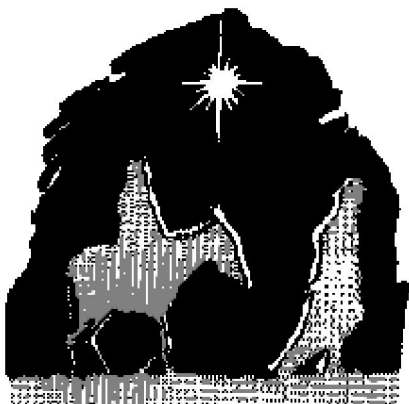

suffering from rubella. The court rejected arguments against the claim by the public prosecutor and ruled that the errors of the doctor and the laboratory "prevented the mother from exercising her choice to terminate her pregnancy in order to avoid the birth of a child afflicted with a handicap." The ruling was denounced by France's main pro-life group as a dangerous precedent that created "institutional eugenics." The court was "implying to all handicapped people that their life is worth less than their death," the Alliance for the Right to Life said. Some medical authorities were appalled by the implications of the decision, which they said would expose doctors to the threat of American-style lawsuits after the birth of handicapped children. Several US courts have awarded damages against doctors after the birth of handicapped children. Anyone who scoffs at the idea of the "slippery slope" only need look at cases such as these to be convinced otherwise. Let us get down on our knees and pray to God for an end to this abortion mentality. Join fellow K of C members and fellow Catholics from various local parishes on December 8 for the Night of Prayer for Life to be held at St. Raphael's. Let us bow down in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in adoration and reparation for the sins against the innocent pre-born and helpless ones in today's society. Further details on the Night of Prayer for Life are provided elsewhere in this issue of the Knightline.

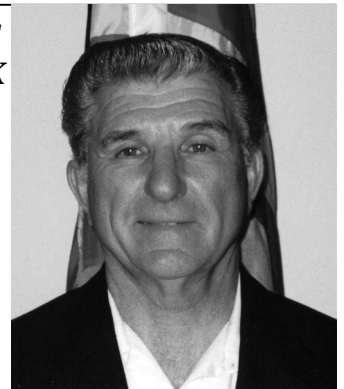


