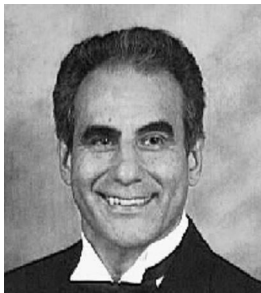

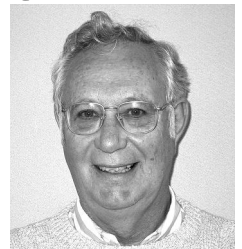

A Successful Prayer Vigil for Life

On Friday, Dec. 8, the feast of the Immaculate Conception, a number of faithful gathered at St. Raphael's Church between the hours of 9:00 PM and Midnight to participate in the Eleventh Annual National Night of Prayer for Life 2000. The Vigil took place during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Prayer leaders led the recitation of the Rosary along with various other prayers. Time was also available for silent prayer and meditation. An estimate of the number of participants during the earlier hours was about 30, during the last hour about 15 – 20.

This evening of prayer was nationwide and during the hour of 9:00 to 10:00 PM, prayer was being offered up in unison in Churches throughout the United States. Locally, this event was sponsored by Council 5300 in conjunction with St. Raphael's Respect Life Committee. All parishes in the deanery had been invited, courtesy of Maggie Stapp of the Bishop's Office.

Special thanks to Prayer Vigil co-chair Larry Stigney, who along with Al Mecklenburg and Ed Page provided Fourth Degree color guard presence in the Church during the event. Also, thanks to Earl Pugh who arranged for prayer leaders during each of the three hour time increments and to Dae Wenzinger who created the publicity flyer for the event.

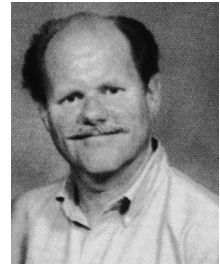

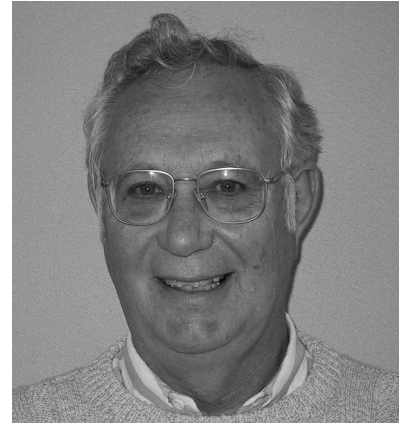
Grand Knights Report

A Pro-Life Message

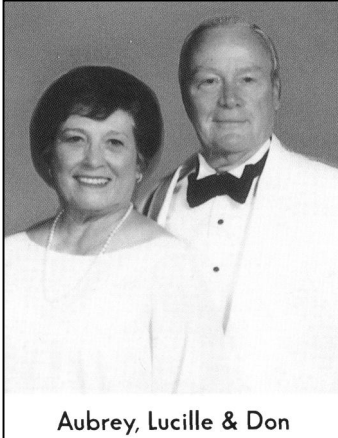

Here is some news about pro-life activities in other parts of the country. The Most Rev. John W. Yanta, bishop of Amarillo, Texas, led 40 faithful Christians in the rosary outside of the gates of the exclusive Citadel Community in Amarillo on Sept. 22, 2000. Inside the community, at the home of a Planned Parenthood supporter, the "Friends of Planned Parenthood" were holding their annual party to honor ten longtime contributors and to increase membership. Bishop Yanta has been an outstanding champion for life and opponent of Planned Parenthood. Joining the bishop on that day, were fourth degree Knights of Columbus, dressed in full color guard regalia, and holding a large picture of baby Malachi, a 21-week-old pre-born child found dead at an abortion facility. Planned Parenthood partygoers had face the reality of what Planned Parenthood does to children. A pro-lifer in attendance commented, "This child received honor and dignity from the Knights.

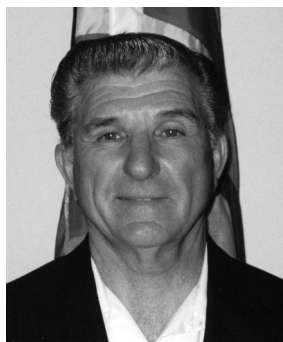
The council recorded expenses of \$1,924.01 and income of \$1,044.75 during the period of November 16 through December 15 2000. The 14 expense items included \$600 for Fr. Sabas' trip to Africa, a \$210 advance deposit for our bulk mailing fees for Knightline 5300, more than \$250 for supplies for Santa's Photos, \$190 for Christmas candy for our widows, and \$100 each for Catholic Charities and St. Mark's food pantry. The income included \$91 from Santa's Photos, a \$400 collection for Fr. Sabas, and just under \$450 from sales of Keep Christ in Christmas cards.

The council had no membership change during this period. Our active membership stands at 204, including 15 Honorary members and 46 Honorary Life members.
