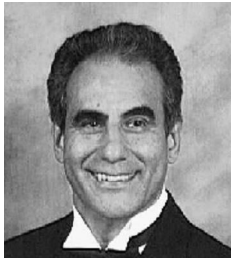

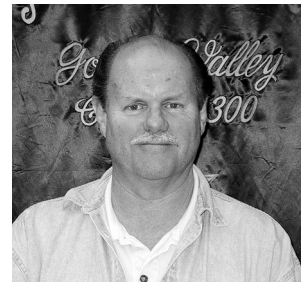

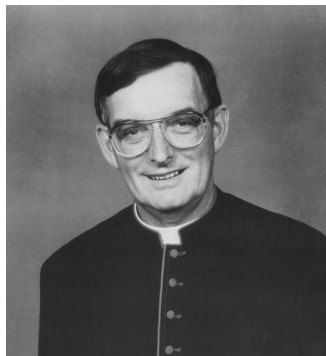

February begins with what has been called “the last echo of Christmas” — the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord Jesus in the Temple forty days after birth. As Mary and Joseph fulfill the requirements of the Jewish Law by presenting the child Jesus to God in the Temple, the prophet Simeon takes the child Jesus in his arms and praises God that he has lived to see this day of the coming of Jesus who is “a light for revelation to the Gentiles, glory for your people Israel.” Because Jesus is hailed as “a revealing light for all”, this feast is a festival of light. 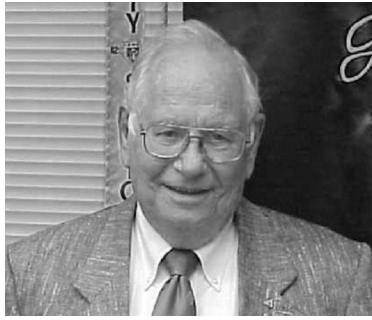

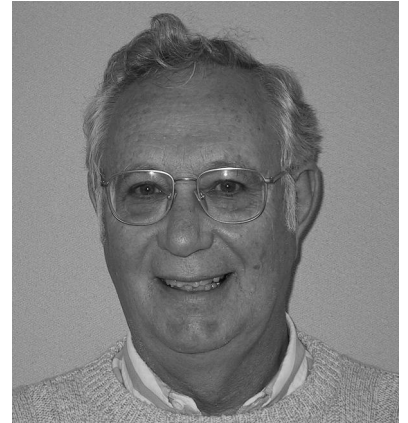
During January contacts were made with some prior members of the council to encourage them to reactivate.

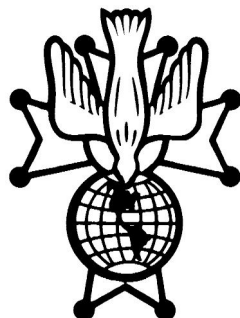

to 1997, said Monday's demonstration reminded him of a conversation with John Paul II in 1993 at World Youth Day in Denver. "The Holy Father told me, 'I've seen the face of young America, and the future of America is promising,' " Flynn said. "John Paul is right, and the future is promising." Flynn was one of the prominent Democrats who broke ranks with his party to publicly support Bush. "I made my statement because it is more important to be a good Catholic and a good American than to be a good Democrat," he said. "President Bush needs to send a clear message of his commitment to pro-life causes and his commitment to supporting legislation that protects the unborn." Flynn said that Bush could use his influence on Capitol Hill to move the pro-life agenda. "He can also get some of the weak-kneed politicians to vote the right way, instead of where the liberal media tells them to vote."

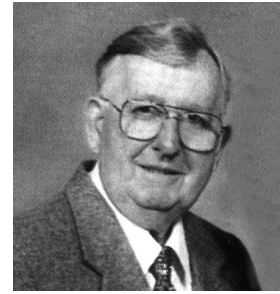

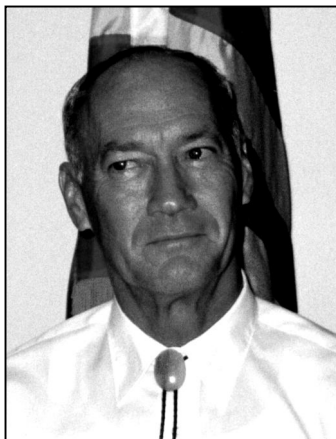
### **4th Degree Knights Report Faithful Navigator Edmund Page**



#### **Junipero Serra Assembly with Assemblies across the USA in support of World War II Memorial**

In consonance with the 4th Degree Principle of Patriotism, the Assembly is lending its support to a long overdue tribute to the individual Americans that served in World War II, by honoring the veterans who bravely fought to defend freedom, those on the home front who contributed to the war effort, and the high moral purpose that motivated the nation's call to arms. The Memorial which will cost \$ 100 million and will be located on 7.4 acres of the National Mall in Washington D.C., directly between the Lincoln Memorial and the Washington Monument. The World War II Registry of Remembrances will list the names of individual Americans who participated in the war effort. Anyone who served in the Armed Forces during World War II will be eligible for the Registry. The goal of the Assemblies is to raise \$ 500,000 and as of December 7, 2000, \$343,723 has been raised from 494 different Assemblies. The average amount per Assembly is \$690.00 With 28 % of the Assemblies reporting we have raised 69 % of the goal. To be part of the World War II Memorial for the "Greatest Generation" is an honor for the Knights of Columbus and our Assemblies. Our commitment to raise additional funds ends on February 22nd to reach our goal of \$ 500,000. leadership of Sir Knight Paul Coyne, Color Corps Commander. As is the custom, Junipero Serra Assembly furnished the ushers for the Christmas Eve, 12:00 Midnight bilingual Concelebrated Mass.

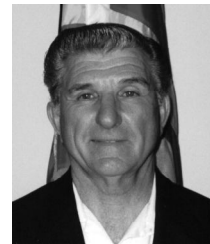

The council recorded expenses of \$4,077.37 and income of \$4,656.90 during the period of December 16, 2000 through January 15, 2001. In addition to normal expenses for pantry supplies, office copying, and meeting refreshments, the 18 expense items included \$321.10 for two issues of *Knightline*, \$1,550.88 for church calendars, \$239.10 for the financial secretary's fee, \$119.40 for web site hosting for one year, \$339.61 for the trustees Christmas party, \$100 for the Catholic Charities pantry, \$820.00 for the second half of the per capita tax to the state council, and \$275.70 for the January statement from the Supreme council. The income included \$3,216.50 from dues, \$406.40 as contributions to Columbian Charities (365 Club), \$399 from the 17 December breakfast, and \$550 from the libation fund. The council had no membership change during this period. Our active membership stands at 204, including 15 Honorary members and 46 Honorary Life members.
