



Infant Protection Legislation
Deserves Our Support

Recently, House and Senate Republicans introduced legislation to protect infants who survive abortions. Bills introduced in both houses of Congress would grant federal protection to newborns who are fully outside the mother, regardless of their stage of development. Several eyewitnesses testified during hearings last year that infants who survive abortions are allowed to die. "On one occasion, a living infant was found in a soiled utility closet, and on another occasion, a living infant was found on the edge of a sink. One baby was wrapped in a disposable towel and thrown in the trash," Senator Rick Santorum, Pennsylvania Republican, who introduced an infant protection, measure last year that languished in committee said: "I never imagined that a bill that protects the life of a newborn baby would be Senators on both sides of the abortion necessary. debate should agree that when the child is outside the mother, it is a person deserving the protections and dignity afforded to all other Americans" "However, it has become clear through recent court decisions, congressional testimony and the debate over the horrific partial-birth abortion procedure that the lines defining when a human life begins have been blurred to the point that it is now neessary to pass legislation in order to guarantee legal protections for newborn babies," he said. The legislation is opposed by pro-abortion groups, who say it is an attempt to criminalize abortion. The National Organization for Women is urging members to contact their senators about the "dangerous" bill, which they say is a "poorly disguised attempt to devate fetal rights." "We should not be fooled by their rhetoric. Antichoice lawmakers introduced this bill with the specific intent of furthering their goal of ending legal abortion," said Kate Michelman president of the National Abortion Rights Action League. "This act is part of a concerted effort to capitalize on the anti-

Financial Secretary's Report 16 May 2001 — 15 June 2001





The council recorded expenses of \$4,719.99 and income of \$1,980.42 during the May 16, 2001 through June 15, 2001 period. In addition to normal expenses for pantry supplies, office copying, and meeting refreshments, the 22 expense items included \$404.31 for the May 18th dinner honoring those who helped with the fish fries and the April breakfast, \$514.55 for St. Raphael's Golf Dinner (The council wil receive more than this amount from the church for this event), \$151.98 for the last fish fry, \$200 towards the Youth Group's San Francisco trip, \$109.89 for the school's auction dinner, \$902.13 for the Memorial Day picnic, \$320.08 for a Past Grand Knight's ring for the outgoing grand knight, \$200 for a bulk mail advance for postage for the Knightline, \$60 to the Conventual's Franciscans for exminarian support, and \$100 to Catholic Charities. The expense items also included \$1113.80 to Columbian Charities (This is the sum of the funds that knights voluntarily contributed to the 365 Club during the year), and \$114.42 for food for a Fourth Degree function (Reimbursed by the Fourth Degree). The income included a \$500 donation from Terry Mohr to be used for youth purposes in Dick's memory, \$114.42 in expense reimbursement from the Fourth Degree, \$1,159 income from the Memorial Day picnic, and \$207 from dues. The council lost no members during this period, and gained five at the June 11 First Degree: James Bradbury, 964-Ricardo Garcia,9685953; 8001; Robert Marks, 968-6008; James McCann, 9678865; and Nicholas Vitalari, 683-2238. With these new members our active membership is up five from last month, and now stands at 207.




