



The council recorded expenses of \$3,945.52 and income of \$708.00 during he June 16, 2001 through July 15, 2001 period. In addition to normal expenses for pantry supplies, office copying, meeting refreshments, and our ad in the Spirit, expense items included \$1,565.77 for the Grand Knight's Award Dnner, \$150 total farewell gifts to Frs. Alberto and Sabas, \$500 seed money for the Fiesta Coke booth, \$130 to support attendance at the state convention, \$160.18 in copying costs for the May Knightline, \$255.67 to the Supreme Council for per capita taxes, \$500 budgeted contribution to the Pregnancy Counseling Center, \$500 budgeted contribution to St. Mark's for support of the spring retreat, and \$100 to Catholic Charities. The income included a \$300 transfer from the bar fund, \$210 in ticket sales from the Grand Knight's Award Dinner, and \$180 from dues.

Membership was unchanged during this period and remains at 207, including 13 honorary members and 49 honorary life members.

recognition.









"God SO loved the World..."

On January 19, 1973, our first born came into this world. Shortly thereafter, two major events occurred, i.e., Roe vs. Wade which opened the door to legalized abortion and a treaty was signed to end the Vietnam War. One event ended a war and another declared war on the most innocent in our society. For twenty eight years we have allowed the taking of innocent blood in our country and a whole generation of children have been raised believing that they have a "choice" to discard Life. We, as Catholics, who profess the Gospel of Life with our mouths have not lived the Gospel with our actions. If this had been the case, our elected officials would not be those who have allowed partial birth abortions, euthanasia and now having to deal with the idea of embryonic stem-cell research.

It was while searching for early Christian traditions that we ran across the following letter from an anonymous letter to Diognetus dating from the second century A. D. as quoted by Eerdman's Handbook to the History of Christianity.

'For Christians are not differentiated from other people by country, language or customs; you see, they do not live in cities of their own, or speak some strange dialect, or have some peculiar lifestyle. This teaching of theirs has not been contrived by the invention and speculation of inquisitive men; nor are they propagating mere human teaching as some people do. They live in both Greek and foreign cities, wherever chance has put them. They follow local customs in clothing food and other aspects of life. But at the same time, they demonstrate to us the wonderful and certainly unusual form of their own citizenship. They live in their own native lands, but as aliens; as citizens, they share all things with others; but like aliens, suffer all things. Every foreign country is to them as their native country, and every native land as a foreign country. They marry and have children just like everyone else; but they do not kill unwanted babies. They offer a shared table, but not a shared bed. They are at present "in the flesh" but they do not live "according to the flesh." They are passing their days on earth, but are citizens of heaven. They obey the appointed laws, and go beyond the laws in their own lives. They love every one, but are persecuted by all. They are unknown and condemned; they are put to death and gain life. They are poor and yet make many rich. They are short of everything and yet have plenty of all things. They are dishonored and yet gain glory through dishonor. Their names are blackened and yet they are cleared. They are mocked and bless in return. They are treated outrageously and behave respectfully to others. When they do good, they are punished as evildoers; when punished, they rejoice as if being given new life. They are attacked by Jews as aliens, and are persecuted by Greeks; yet those who hate them cannot give any reason for their hostility. To put it simply--the soul is to the body as Christians are to the world. The soul is spread through all parts of the body and Christians through all the cities of the world. The soul is in the body but not of the body; Christians are in the world but not of the world"

We need to ponder upon the words that Our Holy Father, Pope John Paul II, stated on the importance of lay involvement in evangelization: "The new evangelization that an make the twenty-first century a springtime of the Gospel is a task for the entire People of God, but will depend in a decisive way on the lay faithful being fully aware of their baptismal vocation and their responsibility for bringing the good news of Jesus Christ to their culture and society."




