



Well, another colorful and festive Old Spanish Days Fiesta has come to pass. As co-chairmen, John Kestel and I want to thank you all, Knights, spouses, family members and friends, who helped in making this event such a success. The Knights of Columbus realized over \$4100 in net income that will be used for helping those in need and supporting our charitable causes.

We served nearly 5300 cups of Coke and other beverages in the four days we operated. On the first three days, we were about 12% behind last year's results, but we rallied strongly on Saturday to close the gap. This year we experienced more drink competition from other booths serving lemonade, water and tea. In spite of this we still did extremely well. I have included a summary of the day-by-day, shift by shift; gross sales results and number of beverages sold.

# Financial Secretary's Report 16 July 2001 – 15 Aug 2001




The council recorded expenses of \$5,343.78 and income of \$12,364.32 during the July 16, 2001 through Aug 15, 2001 period. h addition to normal expenses for pantry supplies, office copying, and meeting refreshments, the 22 expense items included \$203.26 for the Grand Knight's Award Dinner, \$640 for the second half of the Coke booth rent, \$1,748.93 in operational costs for the Coke booth (Soft drink product, dispenser rental, ice, and other supplies), \$160.18 for copies of the June Knightline, \$139.71 for a cordless microphone, \$825.25 for the first half of the 2001/2002 state per capita taxes, \$417.52 for the Installation dinner, \$541.33 for food and entertainment at the Pre-Fiesta party, \$156.78 for place-mats and other supplies, \$250 to the St Vincent De Paul Society, and \$100 to Catholic Charities. The income included \$8,180 in ending cash from the Coke booth. \$1.472.17 in from other reimbursements supplies organizations for and assistance provided by the council, \$254 from the PreFiesta party, \$560 from the Installation dimer, \$428 from the 29 July parish breakfast, and \$537.65 in member payments.

The council lost one member this period when Brother Scott Rothdeutsch transferred to the Lompoc council. Membership now stands at 206.



Michael John Donovan is the 40th Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus, Council 5300 serving as their leader for the July 2001-June 2002 Columbian year. Membership is at 207, including 13 honorary members and 49 honorary life members. The native of San Luis Obispo, CA., has been in St. Raphael Parish since 1963. Mike attended Dolores Grade School in Santa Barbara and Santa Barbara Catholic High School. He joined the U.S. Air Force and from 1960-63 served in Texas and England. Donovan married Marion Rayner in 1962 in Colchester, England. His wife passed away in 1994. Their two grown children, Trina Turner 37 South Carolina) and Kristina Brown 35 and granddaughter Rachel Brown live in Santa Barbara. Mike, born on Nov. 27, 1941, is one of five children born to Elna and John Donovan. Residing locally are his sisters Patricia Hoosier, Cecelia Bunch and Rhonda Donovan and brother John Donovan Jr. Their parents are deceased. Donovan joined the Knights of Columbus on March 24, 1987 (Bernie Jochum was his sponsor) and became a 4th Degree in November 1998. He has held positions as Deputy Grand Knight (2000-0 1), Chancellor (1999-2000) and Community Director (1998-99). Among his goals as Grand Knight are to increase membership in Council 5300, and raise the awareness of Catholic men to opportunities for charitable works for strengthening their Catholic Faith, for exercising good citizenship and for increased involvement with their families in corporal and spiritual works. Two of his many favorite Knight projects include the Lenten Fish Fries to help raise funds for charity and bring parishioners together socially and the final Italian Dinner in 1999 with Father Antonio Cacciapuoti. Mike keeps very busy in the parish as Eucharistic Minister at Mass and to the sick/home bound, St. Vincent De Paul Sodety, garden volunteer, Parish Council, past home visitor for the Parish Community Center Development Program and past member of the Welcoming Committee. A few of the special highlights of the parish that stand out for Mike include: Msgr. Steve's Monday Night Bible Study, Parish Development Program and Prayer Groups meeting for support, sharing and growing spiritually. Donovan said, "My greatest pleasure is visiting the homebound to give Holy Communion and see their pleasure and feel the gratitude they give. At times I think I receive more from the visits than the homebound."

Priests that have impressed Donovan the most in recent years include Msgr. Dowries from Ireland, Fr. Antonio Cacciapuoti from Italy, Fr. Alberto LeDesma from Mexico and Fr. Sabas Mallya from Africa. These priests have brought us their gifts, talents and treasures from their homelands to share with us, to enrich our lives to the world around us, to give us new ways spiritually to look at ourselves and others. Current hobbies and interests besides the Parish and the Knights include: bowling, bicycle riding, walking, hiking, traveling and his Agatha Christie books. He says he has been fortunate to visit Great Britain several times, Ireland, Italy and most of the western United States. For five years Mike was a volunteer at United Way reviewing requests for funds by various non-profit organizations. Mike has worked at AGIA (Association Group Insurance Administrators) in Carpinteria for the past 11 years as an Information Management Manager.
