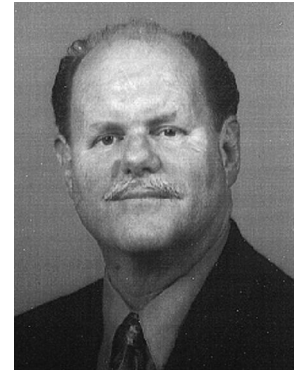

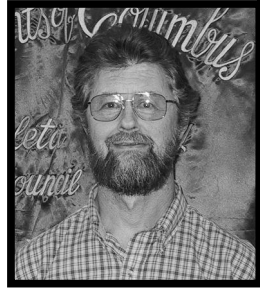

We ask God to ease the pain of the many refugees in the world, many of whom are driven from their homes by religious strife and suffer in foreign countries in sickness and poverty.

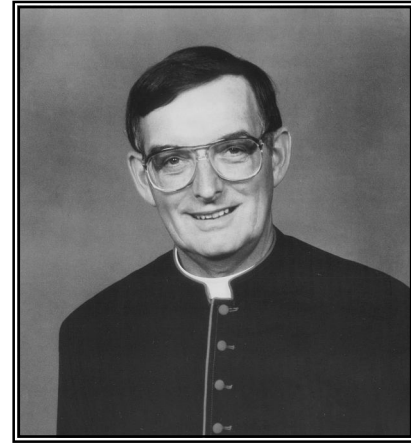

NOVEMBER 2001

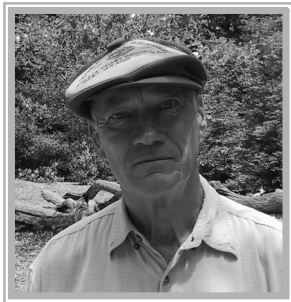

Financial Secretary's Report
16 Sept 2001 – 15 Oct 2001



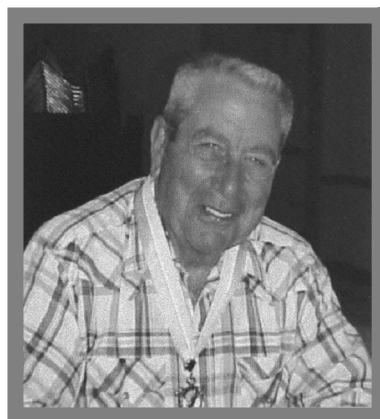
The council recorded expenses of \$3,465.88 and income of \$2,522.00 during the Sept 16, 2001 through Oct 15, 2001 period. In addition to normal expenses for pantry supplies, office copying, and meeting refreshments, the 23 expense items included \$319.82 total for the August and September bulletins; \$254.90 for the Labor Day picnic; \$526.00 sales tax for the Fiesta Coke booth; \$740.68 in food, beer, ice, decoration, and entertainment expenses for Oktoberfest; \$431.25 for Tootsie Rolls for the drive to aid the mentally retarded; \$210.52 for office supplies including first degree membership kits, badges, and a toner cartridge for our laser printer; \$280.00 for Christmas cards for the Keep Christ in Christmas program; \$115.00 in total expenses for the 23 September third degree exemplification; \$66.50 to Supreme for Catholic advertising; \$200.00 to the Knights of Columbus Heroes Fund to benefit the New York City police and firemen; and \$100.00 Catholic Charities. The income included \$585 from the September 23rd parish breakfast, \$1,627 from Oktoberfest, and \$288 in dues.

The council lost one member this period with the passing of Jak Stampe on October 1st, and gained a member when Father Leo transferred in from Los Crusads Council 1990 in Redondo Beach. Membership remains at 206.

Bill retired from SBCC and Frances retired from Lou Rose. They have two children and Nine grandchildren.

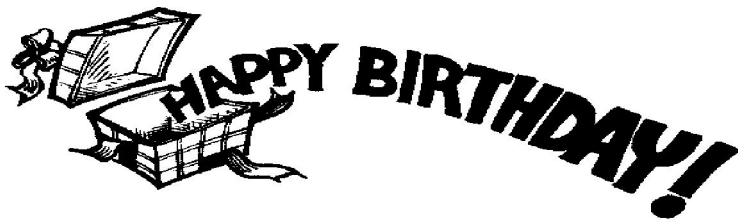

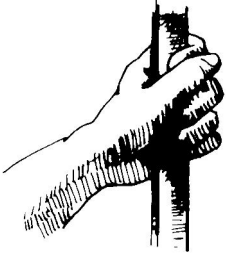

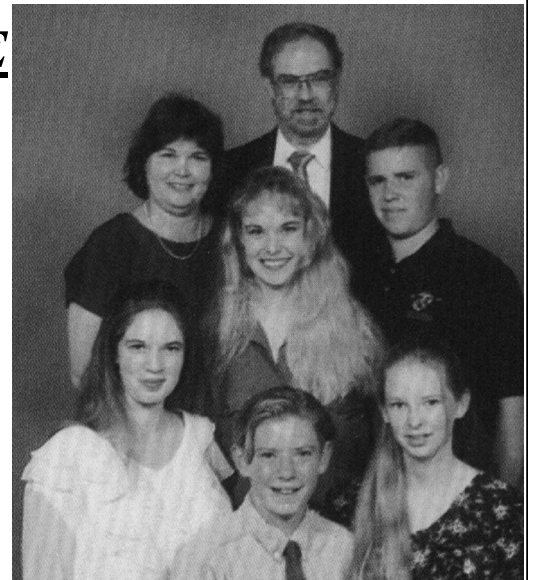

GOSPEL OF LIFE

In Vitro Fertilization

When discussions pertaining to the Gospel of Life are mentioned, the two issues that immediately come to mind are abortion and euthanasia. However, two additional issues must be added to this arena of discussion, i.e., contraception and in vitro fertilization. At this time we will touch upon the latter. While the Catholic Church has strongly advised against this practice, many couples have not understood this ban. I gained a new perspective on this process through an associate at my workplace. Although this co-worker has no religious beliefs, she precluded her story with the statement "I don't believe in InVitro Fertilization." This statement peaked my interest and made me more ready to listen to her reasons. She had seen a video on human reproduction with narration by Desmond Morris. The video showed actual photos of the process whereby the female ovum (egg) is fertilized by the male spermatozoa. We know that for one egg to be fertilized there need be several hundred thousand spermatozoa which are reduced to several hundred to several thousand spermatozoa in the natural process of traveling to get to an egg. What most of us are not aware of is the reason for the large number of sperms. In nature, a large number of spermatozoa surround the ovum forming a protective barrier around it. Then a single sperm from this "protective barrier" is allowed to enter the ovum. My co-worker stated, "It's obvious to me that a natural selection process is taking place!" Indeed, I also agree this is the case. How can anyone know which spermatozoa is the proper candidate to fertilize this egg? Human reproduction is much more complicated than we truly comprehend—God's selection, not man's, is at work.

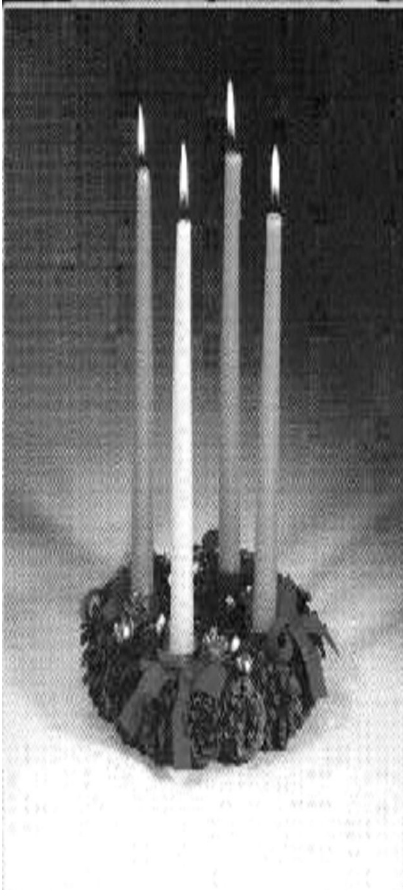
Celebrate the Coming of Christ with Family Advent Wreaths

Spend time together as a family during Advent preparing for the approaching celebration of the birth of Christ. An Advent wreath can be a great focal point for your family's prayers and holiday celebrations.

An Advent wreath is a wreath of laurel, spruce or similar foliage with four candles that are lighted successively in the weeks of Advent to symbolize the light that the birth of Christ brought into the world. Traditionally three of the candles are purple, the color of kings and of penance. A rose-colored candle is used to mark the third Sunday of Advent as a time to rejoice over the closeness of Christmas and the coming of Christ.

Each day the family should gather around the Advent wreath, generally before the evening meal. The proper number of candles is then lighted and a prayer is said. The blessing of the Advent wreath takes place on the first Sunday of Advent.

In addition to having an Advent wreath as part of your family's Christmas celebration, create your own Advent calendar of actions you and your family can take each day to bring you closer to Christ. Write the scheduled activities on a calendar that is prominently posted. These activities could include donating toys to a drive for needy children, bringing used clothing to a collection for homeless people, volunteering at a soup kitchen, reading a Christmas poem or story aloud, attending Mass together or placing a crèche in your home.

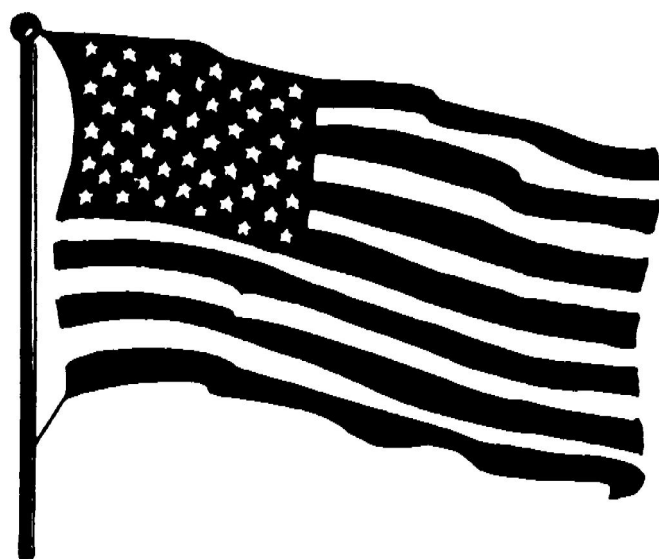
