

Financial Secretary's Report 16 Oct 2001 – 15 Nov 2001



The council recorded expenses of \$1,243.23 and income of \$5,772.57 during the Oct 16, 2001 through Nov 15, 2001 period. In addition to normal expenses for pantry supplies, meeting office copying, and refreshments, the 12 expense items included \$160.18 for the October bulletin; \$125 annual fee for our bulk mail permit; \$200 advance deposit for the bulk mail permit; \$270.10 for liability insurance for the period November 2001 through November 2002; \$145.84 for a BBQ dinner for those who helped set up the Regional Congress at Bishop High School; and \$100 to Catholic Charities. The income included \$807 from the October 28^h parish breakfast; \$1,489 from Festa Italiana (Columbus Day dinner); \$309.50 from the sales of Keep Christ in Christmas cards; and \$3,003.24 from the Tootsie Roll drive to aid those with mental retardation. Except for expenses, we will remit the proceeds from he Tootsie Roll drive to Columbian Charities.

The council lost three members during this period. Honorary Life member Cornelius Van Son passed away on October 29h. We lost a second member when PGK Dick Martinez transferred to Council 7904 in Mesa, Arizona. Finally, we were compelled to suspend Ignacio Morales for lack of payment. Membership currently is 203.

Whenever I read the bumper sticker: "Pro-Choice/Pro-Child" the phrase from Hosea 4:6 comes to mind: "My people perish from lack of knowledge." In these times when words are used to manipulate the "political correctness" of our minds, we need to know the Word of God as it is taught by the Catholic Church.

God's personal regard for the embryo from the moment of conception is seen in Psalm 139:13: "You created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb." The word "me" indicates personhood, not just an organism; therefore, abortion is a direct killing of an innocent person. If we proceed to verse 14: "I am wonderfully made," we see that all genetic elements that mark the future adult are already present from the moment of conception. Again in verse 16 we read: "Your eyes saw my unformed body. All the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be." When a child is aborted the plans God had for that child are no more. Ecclesiastes 11:5 reminds us, "You do not know how the body is formed in the mother's womb, so you cannot understand the work of God, the Maker of all things," including the unborn child.

The month of December is "pregnant" with signs of Life:

On December 8th we celebrate the Immaculate Conception. In 1858, the first apparition of "the Lady" appeared to a fourteen year old girl named Bernadette Soubirous in a grotto of Lourdes. On the feast of the Annunciation in the same year, Bernadette was told to ask "the Lady" her name. In response to this question, the answer was given: "Que soy era Immaculada Councepciou" (I am the Immaculate Conception). God made a masterpiece as a tabernacle for His Son.

On December 12th we celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Guadeloupe. The first apparition of the Virgin of Guadeloupe was on the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, which was celebrated at that time throughout the Spanish Empire on December 9h. In this apparition Our Lady comes as the Theotokos, the God-bearer, pregnant with her Divine Son. She said to Juan Diego: "I am the ever Virgin Mary, Mother of the true God." The Indians read this 'picture-letter' on Juan Diego's tilma and within seven years 8,000,000 natives converted to the Catholic Faith and human sacrifice was immediately stopped.

On December 25th we celebrate the Birth of the Son of God, because His mother chose the right to life for her Son. A woman's choice regarding her so-called "right" is seldom a life-or-death alternative for her, but it is always a life-or-death alternative for the child she carries. Her issue is only her so-called "right" to her convenience. "I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Now choose life, so that you and your children may live." (Deut. 30:19)

Celebrate with Advent Wreaths




Use an Advent wreath as a focal point for your family's prayers and holiday celebrations.

An Advent wreath is a wreath of laurel, spruce or similar foliage with four candles. Each candle is successively lit in the weeks of Advent to symbolize the light that the birth of Christ brought into the world.

Traditionally three of the candles are purple, the color of kings and of penance. The rose colored candle marks the third Sunday of Advent as a time to rejoice over the closeness of Christmas and the coming of Christ.

Each day gather your family around the Advent wreath, generally before the evening meal. Light the candles and pray together.

After the fourth week, the penitential season of Advent is over and the time to rejoice is at hand. Transform the Advent wreath into a Christmas wreath. Replace the candles with long red tapers (to be lighted at breakfast on Christmas mourning) red ribbon and, if desired, other festive decorations.



Keep Christ In Christmas

Keeping Christ in Christmas sæms like an old cliché, after all what would we celebrate if there were no Christ, no babe of Bethlehem! But as absurd as this may seem to those of us of faith, it seems more and more that distractions of all types are encroaching on all sides pushing Christ out of the picture. If the secular world had it's way Xmas would be no more then the
