

#### FEBRUARY, 2002

Lent comes early this year. The Springtime call of the Church to renewal and conversion begins with Ash Wednesday, February 13th. "Ashes to Easter" is the title of a book of prayer meditations by the Auxiliary Bishop of the Green Bay Diocese, Bishop Robert Morneau. "Ashes to Easter" is a good title for the Lenten season. We begin with ashes on Ash Wednesday and the call of the Lord to "return to me with all your heart'. The ashes symbolize how temporary everything is and how we are called as disciples of Christ to die to self during Lent so we can rise with Christ to new Ife at Easter as we celebrate the death and resumection of Jesus. Fasting, prayer and almsgiving are mentioned by Jesus in the Gospel of Ash Wednesday and are an important part or our turning to God and each other in these Lenten days of renewal. We can fast from food or alcohol as a way of opening ourselves to God and neighbor each day. One writer suggests a fast from discontent, anger, bitterness, self-concern, discouragement, laziness, suspicion, guilt and a feast on gratitude, patience, forgiveness, compassion for others, commitment, truth, the mercy of God. Daily prayer in Lent is life giving and life renewing. Take time to open your heart to God each day in Lent in thanksgiving, in praise, in petition and in cries for mercy. Almsgiving, sharing what you have with the poor and needy can mean giving money (through the Poor Box in Church or the parish St. Vincent de Paul Conference or Catholic Charities). Almsgiving can also mean giving you time to those nearest to

#### Financial Secretary's Report 16 Dec 2001 – 15 Jan 2002



The council recorded expenses of \$3,923.13 and income of \$4,929.55 during the Dec 16, 2001 through Jan 15, 2002 period. In addition of normal expenses for pantry supplies, office copying, and meeting refreshments, the 12 expense items included \$160.18 for the December bulletin: \$1,562.77 for church \$479.80 Bil calendars: to McNamara for the financial secretary's fee; \$421.61 for food at the Christmas party; \$267.25 in per capita tax to the Supreme Courcil; and \$767 to Catholic Charities. The contribution to Catholic Charties includes both our regular \$100 monthly donation and \$667 proceeds from the Christmas party. The income included \$291 from the December breakfast \$4,638.55 in member payments. The member payments included \$441.55 contributions to Columbian Charities (365 club), which will be donated at the state convention.

The council lost one member and gained two during this period. Don Sweet transferred to council 6856 in Selma, Texas; and Sean Gross and Dr. Joe Castro joined the council at the first degree on 14 January Membership now is 204.



Families are the primary teachers of society's youth and the Council supports activities, which bring families together: parish breakfasts, the Italian dinners, the Parish Picnic and the Lenten














Talk to your children about religious life.





Located next to Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church in downtown Santa Barbara is a beautiful meditation garden. Our own Knights of Columbus Council 5300 in conjunction with the Santa Barbara Council 1684 constructed and built this special memorial for all children lost to the world in the holocaust of abortion. A statue of St. Ann with her child, Mary, is surrounded with life-reflecting vegetation and two large sandstones for sitting in prayer and reflection.

One of the beautiful aspects of our Catholic faith is the belief in the Communion of Saints: the spiritual union that exists between the souls in heaven, those in purgatory and the faithful living on earth. In faith, each of us can join our voice in prayer with the whole body of Christ that this scourge be removed from our country and from the world.

As one sits in this special garden, and meditates on the Annunciation, the words of the Archangel Gabriel to Mary come to mind: "Nothing is impossible with God" With that answer, two unlikely women became mothers, i.e. Mary, a virgin, and Elizabeth, a senior citizen. We are given hope for the future that Life will once again be cherished.

Inscribed below the statue is the quotation from Isaiah 49:15-16 "I will never forget you. See, upon the palms of my hand have written your mme." These words show the love the Father has for each of His children. Clothed in this love we have the strength to continue in the struggle to change hardened hearts so that they too can embrace Love.

To have a physical place to go and to know that something has been done to NOT forget so many innocent souls is a great comfort to me and I hope to you also.


