## *first fish fry of the Lenten Season*

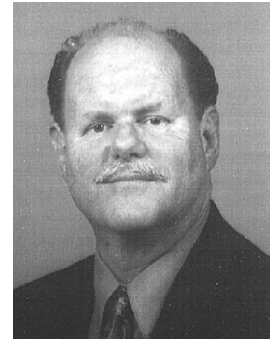

## **Grand Knight's Report Honor Our Founder**

Friday, March 29, 2002 is Founder's Day, the day on which the Knights of Columbus will celebrate the 12<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Order receiving its Charter from the State of Connecticut. 2002 marks the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary year of the entry of the State of California into the Knights of Columbus. For Council 5300, this year has added significance: the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its incorporation. Fr. Michael McGivney, the Founder, and the first officers of the new organization chose the name "Knights of Columbus" to recognize the contribution of Christopher Columbus, hailed as the discoverer of the North American continent in 1492. Too, the name identifies the Catholic presence in the exploration and colonization of the New World. The term "Knights" was chosen also as a significant reminder of the virtues of those knights of the Middle Ages in Europe, virtues of spirituality and service to Church, crown and countrymen. Our Lenten journey with Christ continues all through the month of March. We are walking with Christ towards Jerusalem and the celebration of his death and resurrection. Lent ends just before the Mass of the Last Supper on Holy Thursday. Throughout all the days of Lent we hear echoes of God's call to us on Ash Wednesday: "Come back to me with all your heart". Each day of Lent is an opportunity to begin anew our Lenten turning to God for mercy and forgiveness and to each other in the love of Christ. St. Patrick's Day (March 17<sup>th</sup>) and St. Joseph's Day (March 19<sup>th</sup>) fall in the middle of Lent this year. St. Patrick's life and spirituality are wonderful examples of turning one's life around and walking each day in the presence of God. At sixteen years of age Irish raiders brought him to Ireland as a slave. In the loneliness and isolation from family and friends and homeland he turned to God in prayer and found hope and consolation in the nearness of God. Years later when he returned to Ireland as a missionary bishop he was strengthened by daily prayer such as: "...Christ be with me, Christ before me, Christ be after me, Christ within me, Christ below me, Christ above me, Christ at my right hand, Christ at my left hand, Christ in the heart of every man who thinks of me, Christ in the mouth of every man who speaks to me, Christ in every eye that sees me, Christ in every ear that hears me..." The life and example of St. Joseph present another example of Lenten openness to God. Joseph's love for Mary and plans for life and future with her are changed and turned around with the discovery that Mary is pregnant with the child Jesus. Joseph's openness to God and his love and care for Mary and Jesus are magnificent examples of facing life and all that life brings with great faith and love for those nearest to us. His loving steadfast devotion to Mary and Jesus can inspire us on our Lenten walk with Jesus towards this Last Supper, the death and resurrection of Jesus at Easter.

**Financial Secretary's Report**  
**16 Jan – 15 Feb 2002**



The council recorded expenses of \$2,730.63 and income of \$2,688.87 during the Jan 16, 2002 through Feb 15, 2002 period. In addition to normal expenses for pantry supplies, office copying, and meeting refreshments, the 18 expense items included \$160.55 for the January bulletin; \$825.25 in per capita tax to the state council; \$139.79 in pantry supplies for the parish breakfasts; \$200 towards the purchase of a flag and pole for the Boy Scouts Venture Crew; \$310 for reservations of Stow Grove Park for our Memorial Day and Labor Day picnics; \$591.18 in starter cash and provisions for the Lenten fish fries; \$100 to Carmen Yee for sewing supplies for quilts for the homeless and for unwed mothers; and \$100 to Catholic Charities.

The income included \$445 from the 27 January breakfast; \$494.22 from the libation fund; \$968 from the first fish fry on 15 February; and \$736 in member dues.

Membership was unchanged during this period, and remains at 204.

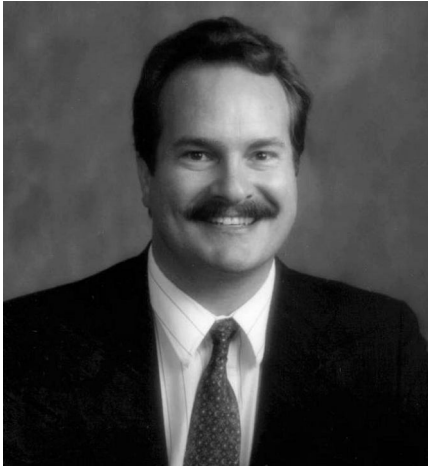

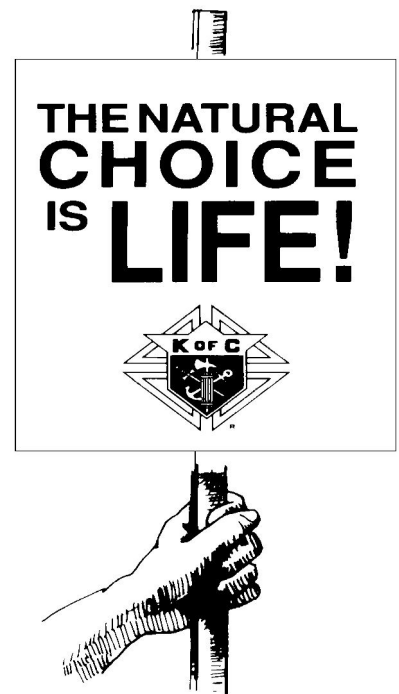
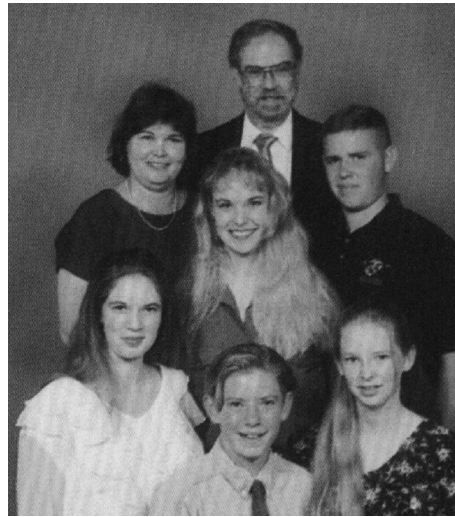

COUNCIL 5300 SCOUT SPONSORED UNITS RECOGNIZED

On Friday, January 11, St. Raphael's Hall was host to the Annual District Dinner of the South Coast District of the Boys Scouts. Adult leaders from different Scout units in the Santa Barbara-Carpinteria-Goleta area came to recognize outstanding accomplishments of the last year.

Council 5300 cooked the meal for these leaders under the guidance of Terry Sliger. As always it was a special meal prepared from Terry's vast treasury of tasty recipes. Assisting Terry with the cooking were Paul Coyne, Mike Donovan, and Marie Lundfelt. Scouts from Troop 105 (sponsored by Council 5300) assisted with the serving and the clean-up afterwards under the direction of Scoutmaster Tom Good and Asst. Scoutmaster Rick Cerialle.

On February 27, Venture Crew 105 hosted a Backpacking Expo for Scouts and parents. The program consisted of display tables featuring tents, sleeping bags, and backpacks. There were slides of past adventures and a skit on proper packing for a weeklong backpacking trip. Council 5300 presented crew 105 with its Venture Crew flag earlier in the month. These senior Scouts are preparing for this summer's two weeks Philmont Backpacking Trek.

The Archdiocesan Catholic Committee will recognize venture Crew Advisor Tom Gross on Scouting on March 2. For his work with Catholic Scouting Tom will be presented with the Bronze Pelican Award.
