On Saturday, April 27, Grand Knight Mike Donovan presented the Santa Barbara Pregnancy Counseling Center (SBPCC) with a check for \$500 from Council 5300 to support the pro-life work of the Center. The occasion for the presentation was the annual Tea by the Sea fund raising event held at the beautiful Serena Cove, beach home of Jack and Frannie Morehart, on Pedaro Lane in Carpinteria. With about 130 people in attendance at the event, GK Mike Donovan presented the SBPCC Board, represented by Board secretary and brother Knight Stan Baran, with the check and reiterated Council 5300's ongoing commitment to the pro-life cause and, in particular, to the work of the Center. Mike noted how closely the work of the Center dovetailed with the goals of the Knights. The Pregnancy Counseling Center, established in 1972, has been serving the young women and men of the community who face an unplanned pregnancy. The Center provides free pregnancy testing through St. Francis Hospital and offers counseling on the alternatives to abortion to anyone regardless of race, creed or religion. Additional help and services are provided to women who elect to keep their babies or those choosing adoption. The Center is also involved in abstinence counseling for the youth of he With the exception of a part-time paid director, the community. organization is staffed entirely by volunteers, including the volunteer Board of Directors. Support for the work of the Center is provided by private donations and two fund raising events held each year, one of which is the Tea by the Sea. The Center extended its sincere thanks to Council 5300 for this donation and for the Knights' continued support over the years. Without this support, the Center would not be able to continue providing this valuable service to the community.


We are happy to report that Brian Klinge is recovering well from his surgery.

One of the old English Ballads goes as follows:

"There are twelve months in all the year,

As I hear many men say But the merriest month in all the year Is the merry month of May"

(from Robin Hood and the Widow's Three Sons) There are many reasons why we speak of the "merry month of May". As Catholics we celebrate May as the month of Mary, the Mother of Our Lord and Savior. Our joy in Jesus risen from the dead at Easter continues throughout the month of May. We can well imagine the joy of May who was so sorrowful at the foot of the Cross and then so joyful and exultant at the resurrection of her beloved Son. Our joy and happiness at the resurrection of Jesus are well expressed in the Easter hymn of "Regina Coeli" which we say in place of the "Angelus" at 6 am, 12 noon and 6 PM each day:

"Queen of heaven, rejoice, Alleluia The Son whom you were privileged to bear, Alleluia; Has risen as he said, Alleluia. Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, Alleluia! For the Lord **h**s truly risen, Alleluia."

This beautiful hymn or the Rosary can be wonderful prayers of love for Mary in the "merry month of May". We also see Mary with the Church at its beginning, waiting for the coming of the Holy Spirit after the Ascension of Jesus (Acts of the Apostles 1:14). May we follow Mary's example of openness to the Holy Spirit as we move towards Pentecost (on May 19 this year). May the Holy Spirit come to us, again and again, with "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, selfcontrol" (St. Paul's Letter to the Galatians 5:22-23)

Financial Secretary's Report 16 March – 15 April 2002



The council recorded expenses of \$1,747.03 and income of \$2,685.88 during the March 16, 2002 through April 15, 2002 period. In addition to normal expenses for pantry supplies, office copying, and meeting refreshments, the 16 expense items included \$1,268.98 for the final Lenten fish fries (Including \$120 to the Youth Group for their help; \$110.04 to the Supreme Council (\$73 for catholic advertising and the rest for place mats; and \$100 to Catholic Charities.

The income included \$2,021.25 total from the final fish fries, \$409 from the 24 March breakfast, and \$237.15 from member payments.

The council added two new members (Ignacio Andrade and J William McLafferty) at the fist degree on 8 April, and lost none during this period. Membership currently totals 206.


Council 5300 and Council 1684 were pleased to report the admittance of new members during the April 8^h Business Meeting.


Church Director's Report Traffic Control During Holy Week By: Chris Arnoult, Church Director and Michael Donovan, Grand Knight



Contraception and the Church Teaching

O Mary, bright dawn of the new world, Mother of the living, to you do we entrust the cause of life. Look down, O Mother, upon the vast numbers of babies not allowed to be born, of the poor whose lives are made difficult, of men and women who are victims of brutal violence, of the elderly and the sick killed by indifference or out of misguided mercy. Grant that all who believe in your Son may proclaim the Gospel of life with honesty and love to the people of our time. Obtain for them the grace to accept that Gospel as a gift ever new, the joy of celebrating it with gratitude throughout their lives and the courage to bear witness to it resolutely, in order to build, together with all people of good will, the civilization of truth and love, to the praise and glory of God, the Creator and lover of life.

Have you ever owned a beautifully hand knit sweater that you really liked and often? The color may have complimented a number of you other clothes or maybe it was one of those "comfort" things you could throw on when you wanted to relax. The down side of having a favorite knitted sweater is its vulnerability to snagging. When the yarn snags, it distorts the knitted stitch which makes it vulnerable to snag again. Once this happens, the yarn may break and the sweater will start to unravel. Once it starts to unravel, the sweater is never the same—it no longer serves the purpose for which it was made. We can apply this "sweater" concept to the understanding of the Gospel of Life.

Until 1930, the universal teaching in Christian churches was that contraception was wrong. It was equated to loose morals and loose living. Then in 1931 the Anglican Church broke with this belief and albwed contraception in marriage for special circumstances. In this same year, Pope Pius XI wrote his encyclical "On Christian Marriage" where he reiterated the teaching of the Church on contraception.

By 1960, 66% of Catholics were living by the laws of the Church. In 1994, 80% of Catholics were contraception and 30% of Catholics were sterilized making Catholics in line with non-Catholics. In a thirty-year period, what caused the snagging of our moral threads?

In the next article, we will show how the wide spread acceptance of contraception opened the door to abortion, euthanasia, etc.






