Financial Secretary's Report
16 April – 15 May 2002



The council recorded expenses of \$2,525.24 and income of \$474 during the April 16, 2002 through May 15, 2002 period. In addition to normal expenses for pantry supplies, office copying, and meeting refreshments, the 11 expense items included \$160.55 for the March *Knightline*; \$200 bulk mail advance payment for future bulletin mailings; \$500 to St. Mark's (for the spring retreat); \$500 to the Santa Barbara Pregnancy Counseling Center; \$300 as the council's contribution to a going-away gift for Msgr. Steve; 566.15 to Columbian Charities (the amount collected as contributions to the 365 club); \$100 down payment for the entertainment at the Grand Knight's party on June 15th; and \$100 to Catholic Charities.

The income items were \$366 from the 28 April breakfast and \$18 from member payments.

The council suspended one member (John Sorosky) and added none during this period. Membership currently totals 205.

Petal Power: Orchids for Mothers' Day

Council 5300 once again celebrated an annual tradition: orchids for distribution to mothers on Mothers' Day weekend. A team of Brother Knights met at the Parish on Saturday, May 11th at 7:30 am to begin the time honored task. Mark Christman, Leonard Gonzales, Brian Holtz, Bob Marks and I headed to Carpinteria in the two trucks required to transport the orchids generously provided by Al Leonello's Orchid Farm. Tom Puerling arrived at the Farm on the previous Friday and picked orchids for distribution to the County Jail facilities.

As he has done in the past, Al welcomed the team to his Farm and invited us to *have the run of his place*. Earlier, he had constructed seven exceptionally large cartons into which we could place the orchid stems we would pick. Al pointed us in the direction of his finest stems and our team carefully collected orchids for every carton. The trucks were loaded and we returned to St. Raphael's,

To preserve the orchids, the cartons are unloaded and all stems are placed in buckets of water. Prior to the weekend Masses, the buckets are brought to the vestibule where ushers and greeters separate the flowers from the stem and begin pinning the flowers. As families arrive, it is a happy occasion to distribute the flower and to share the expressions of appreciation from the mothers.

Special thanks must be given to Carmelita Williams who carefully cut and then arranged all the unused stems. Carmelita's orchid arrangement beautified the sanctuary for the First Communion and Confirmation liturgies which followed Mothers' Day weekend. A special expression of appreciation to Tom Puerling for returning the flower cartons to the Orchid Farm.

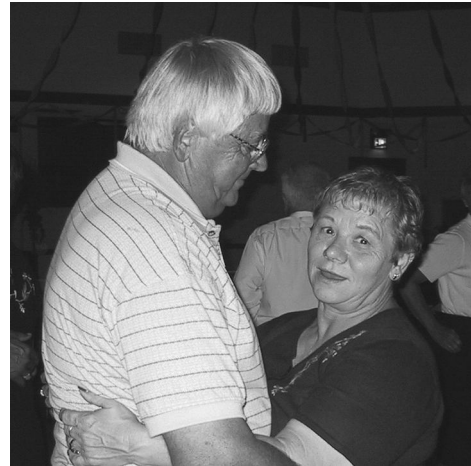
**Knight of the Month

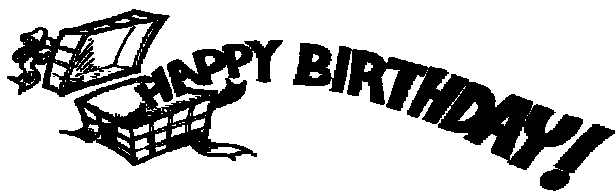

and thanks to the States 515 Councils for their dedication to our Church and our Nation. Those in the gathering then "went forth to love and serve the Lord and one another" in Council sessions. Business sessions convened from 9:30 am until 4:00 on Friday. During these meetings, approximately 530 voting delegates listened attentively to the discussions regarding 42 resolutions and reviewed the slate of new State officers. Heated debates ensued with respect to several of the resolutions with the result that a few of the recommendations did not achieve sufficient votes for passage. The slate of officers required only one ballot for the Office of Warden. The delegates were presented with reports from the Squire, MR Drives, Keep Christ in Christmas campaigns and various other activities completed by Councils during Columbian Year 2001-2002. At the conclusion of Friday's labors, delegates and guests enjoyed an evening of entertainment from within the Fresno area and the presentation of awards to Councils. Saturday presented a "shortened" business day when delegates convened from 9:30 am until 3:00 pm. A key issue addressed was the reduction in the per capita tax required from each Council. The tax has been reduced from \$11.00 to \$10.65 per member, an appreciable savings for Council 5300 as the new Columbian Year approaches. The delegates discussed and then approved the State budget for 2002-2003. As the session concluded, the announcement was made that a candidate had been elected to the Office of Warden. Independent of sessions for voting delegates were other meetings which discussed State and Chapter Chaplains and issues of note to the Chaplains. State Officers and Directors also convened in order to conclude the current Columbian Year and prepare for the succeeding one. It has been announced that the State Convention for 2003 is scheduled in Ontario from May 16th through May 18th at the Double Tree Hotel. The Vigil Mass for Pentecost was celebrated by his Excellency the Most Reverend John T. Steinbock and this liturgy marked the formal conclusion of the Convention. Bishop Steinbock offered his prayers of thanks and praise to the Knights of Columbus for listening to and following the Holy Spirit. Following Mass, the Knights and their guests joined together for an awards banquet which was highlighted by speeches from State Deputy James Scroggins and State Deputy Elect Robert Rodriguez.

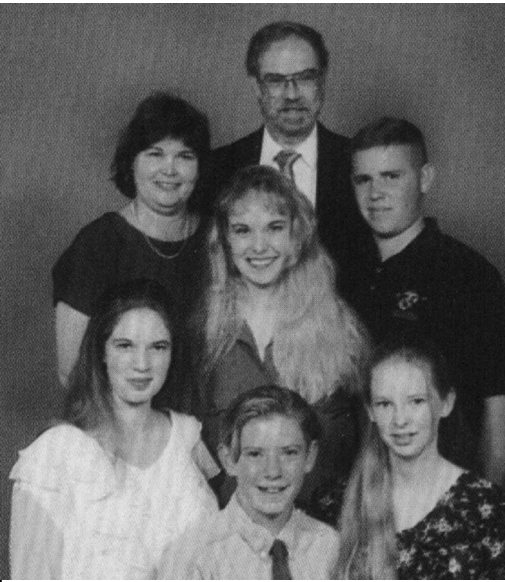

Contraception and the
Church Teaching, Part II

We will continue with the sweater concept of its unraveling, i.e., the sweater being the Gospel of Life. What was the major snag that occurred between 1960, when 66% of Catholics were living in uniformity with the teachings of our Church, and thirty years later when 80% of Catholics were using contraception and 30% were sterilized? In the 1960s, a revolution of contraception known as "The Pill" became the major change in the virtues and morals of Christians. The social soil was fertile for this seed to take root: The right to privacy laws had been thrown out which abolished all laws that prohibited the sale of contraceptives for inter state purchase. Obedience to the teachings of the Church was no longer seen as a virtue. There was a strong belief in studies regarding over-population and loss of natural resources to feed the peoples of the world. A rise in Feminism which stated women should become an active members of the work force. If a woman was at home having children then how could she have a career? A belief that marriages would become better if the stress of pregnancy was controlled. In the midst of this hoopla regarding this "gift to mankind", Pope Paul VI wrote In Humana Vitae and stated the Church was saying "no" to the pill. In Section 17 he states what would happen if wide spread contraception was used in society: There would be lowering of the morality in society. today: media abuse, abortion) There would be general disregard for the physical and psychological well-being of females by males. (today: pornography, sexual abuse to women, 60% of the poverty in America is single women with children.) Governments would use family planning for coercive programs. (today: United Nations programs, China) We would begin to treat our bodies as though they were machines. No longer affording the respect due to a human person with a body and soul. (today: surrogate motherhood, in vitro fertilization, embryonic stem-cell research) Today the "genie" is out of the bottle", "the fabric of our lives" is unraveled and the "seed is planted." Each of us must ponder our part in society's decay and then pray as to how we may be part in society's restoration.

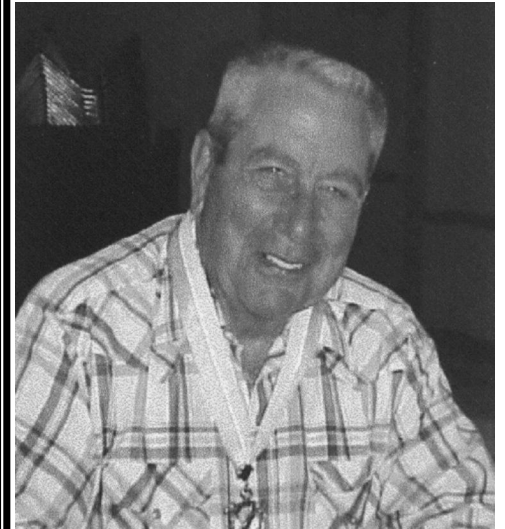

Knights in Action

Grand Knight Mike Donovan received a *May-day* call for some urgent work required to help students from St. Raphael's School perform their annual play. Mike contacted me on May 6th with his request for a team of Knights to respond to the situation.

Several years ago, Allen Schol had built twenty nine wood platforms or risers which can be used as extensions to the stage in the Parish Hall. The wood structures had been stored outdoors and were showing the ill effects of weather and the aging process. The platforms, which varied in size, approximated 700 square feet of surface area. The risers' painted surfaces required scraping and coats of new paint. The screws which supported the platforms' planks were loose and in need of tightening.

A crew of Richard Scholl, Ralph Wengler and I reported to the Parish on May 9th to do the necessary preparatory work. Promptly at 9 a.m. on May 10th, the team was back in action: my airless sprayer in full operation – until the seventh platform. Following that, we used the brushes supplied by Ralph and were able to apply both the primer and finishing coats that day. The project has been a success thanks to the team and the School had its refinished structures ready for use on May 14th.

Fourth Degree Report

I am pleased to continue with the second of my three columns which introduce activities and events of the 4th Degree Knights of Columbus. The focal point of the series is to present 3^d Degree Brother Knights with information and to encourage membership in the 4th Degree. The previous column discussed the Assembly practice of honoring deceased Brother Knights through memorial presentations of a Pyx or Chalice to their families. The final column will outline the various social events and activities available to members of the 4th Degree. The column in this June issue of the Knightline presents the Color Corps. In the Church and to the greater society, the Color Corps is the highly visible and most familiar unit of the Knights of Columbus. The members of the Corps appear in formal dress, standing at attention as an honor guard. The regal attire of Corp is based on tradition with each piece relating a bit of the member's own history in the Knights of Columbus. Each member wears the chapeau and cape and carries a sword. The color of the cape's lining defines the rank of the Knight: purple denotes the Commander; white identifies the Past Faithful Navigator; red symbolizes a member of the 4th Degree. Participation in the Corps is the call to members of the Assembly. Presently, twenty four members of the Assembly march with the Corps led by Commander Paul Coyne. Commander Coyne schedules participation in events and "calls out" the Corps for service.

Events in Columbian Year 2001-2002 included: July 4th: Spirit of 76 Parade; August: Fiesta Parade 2001: standing as honor guards during the funeral Masses, rosaries and graveside services for seven Brother Knights of our Assembly December 12th: Our Lady of Guadalupe commemoration parade March 12th: procession with the Santa Maria/Lompoc Assembly to honor Fr. Charles during his installation as pastor, St. Louis de Montfort May: honor guard during four celebrations of the Sacrament of Confirmation at Our Lady of Guadalupe, St. Raphael's and St. Joseph's June 23rd: the Corps will honor Msgr. Stephen N. Downes, Pastor of St. Raphael's, during the Parish's 9:30 am and 12:30 pm liturgies as Msgr. Steve and his Parish prepare his Farewell A concluding observation: the service of the Color Corps is a visible symbol of the Knights of Columbus and our patriotic commitment to our Nation and our faithful service to our Church.

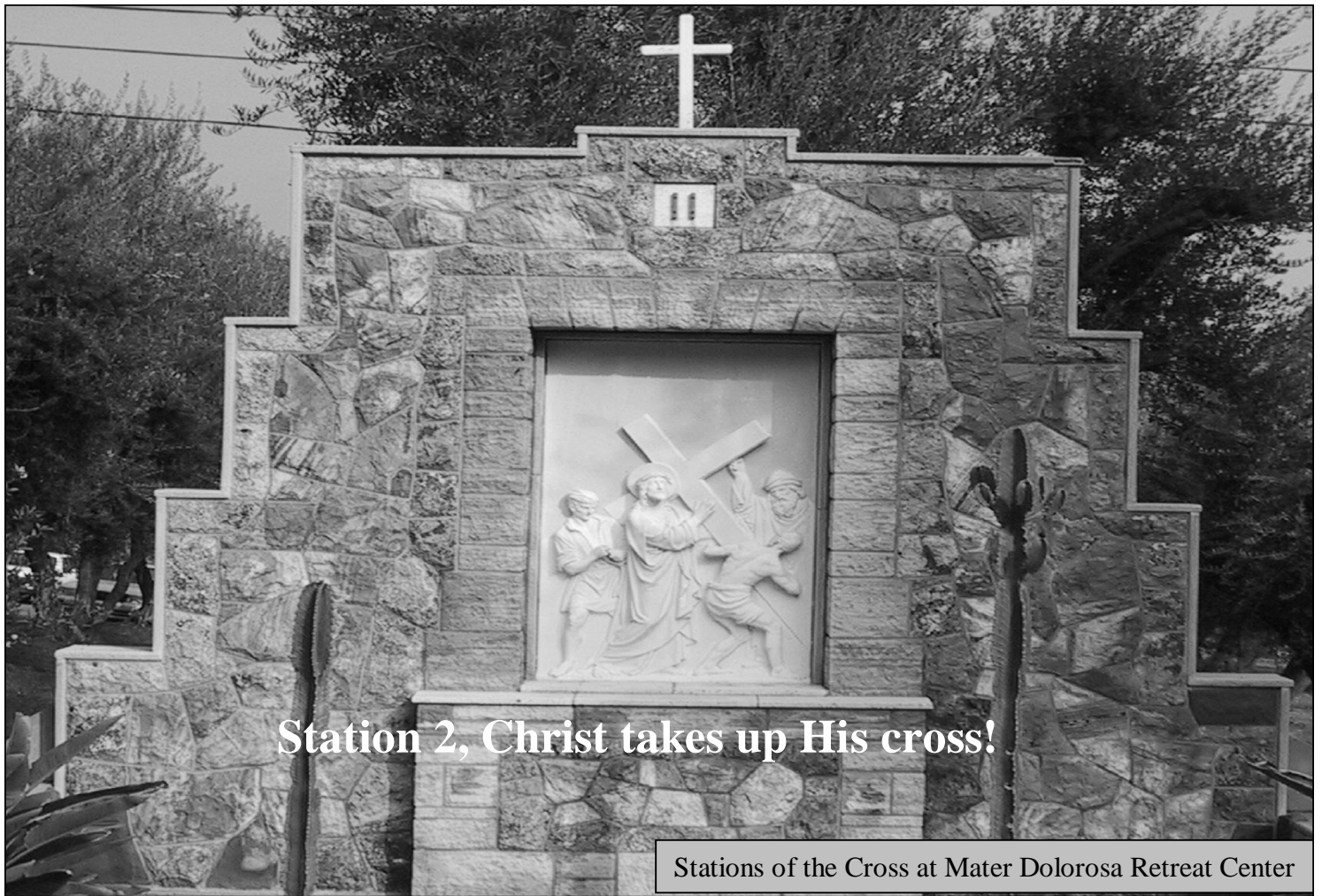
