
Our first major fund raising event is the Fiesta Coke Booth, from July 31 to August 3, 2002. Please plan to participate now.



**Financial Secretary's Report
16 May – 15 June 2002**




The council recorded expenses of \$11,557.58 and income of \$1,225 during the May 16, 2002 through June 15, 2002 period. By far the largest expense item was the council's sixth of ten annual pledged contributions of \$10,000 to the Parish Development Program. In addition to normal expenses for pantry supplies, office copying, and meeting refreshments, the other 12 expense items included \$160.55 and \$238.26 respectively for the April and May editions of the Knightline; \$694.80 for the Memorial Day picnic; \$200 in partial support for our representatives at the state convention; and \$100 to Catholic Charities.

The income items were \$1,179 from the Memorial Day picnic and \$46 from member payments.

The council gained no new members during this period, but lost one with the death of Rudolf Maynez on 27 May. Membership currently totals 204.




“The pro-life members of the House of Representatives have promised to introduce a bill to outlaw partial-birth abortion, and expect to hold a floor vote by August recess.” This was reported by the Newsletter of the National Pro-Life Alliance in their spring issue.

The Partial-Birth Abortion Ban passed both the U. S. House of Representatives and the U. S. Senate in an over-whelming vote in previous congresses but it was vetoed by the then-President Bill Clinton.

The fact that this abortion procedure is so grotesque that polls show an amazingly large majority of the public agrees partial-birth abortion should be outlawed. This procedure is basically the same as delivering a fully developed child. For this very reason, the American Medical Association is on public record saying that the practice is “never medically necessary.”


