I was honored when Brian asked me to be your Chaplain, thank you. This organization has done such wonderful work and ministry here in the parish and community,

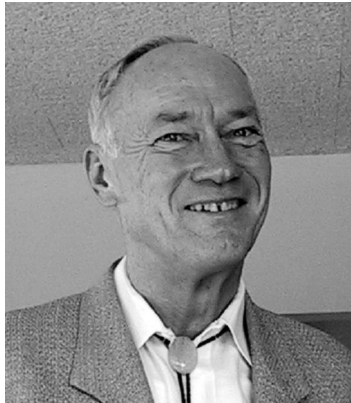
I'm glad to be a part of a group like this.

**Financial Secretary's Report  
16 August– 15 September 2002**



The council recorded expenses of \$4,229.83 and income of \$4,279.97 during the August 16, 2002 through September 15, 2002 period. In addition to normal expenses for general pantry supplies, office copying, and meeting refreshments, the 16 expense items included \$1,412.64 in Coke booth expenses (mostly drink syrup); \$567 for sales tax on the Coke booth proceeds; \$958.77 for the Labor Day picnic; \$703.04 for the Installation dinner; \$164.43 for refreshments following PGK Stan Nowak's funeral; \$103.75 for new aprons for the Tootsie Roll drive to raise funds for the mentally retarded; \$108.66 in supplies for the breakfasts; and \$100 to Catholic Charities.

In addition to member payments and business meeting raffle and sack income, the income items included \$1,629.00 from the Portuguese/Irish dinner; \$1,345.10 from the Labor Day picnic; \$707.00 from the Installation dinner; \$306.00 from the 25 August breakfast; and \$216.06 in reimbursement from the Assembly for Fourth Degree dinner supplies charged to the council's account.

One of our student members, Bryan Duquette, took a withdrawal card during this period, since he is away from Santa Barbara attending college. Bryan's departure reduces our membership to 201.

This is how every organization ensures its own longevity, as new members mature and are shepherded by older members within the group and take on responsibilities and become an integral part of the organization.

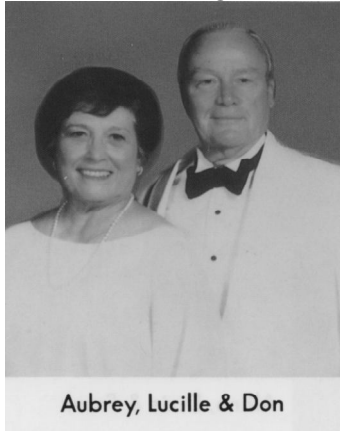
