
My dear brother Knights. I've tried to sit down and write this article for the past two months and I have not been able to put down the right words just yet, but here are some thoughts.

## Financial Secretary's Report 16 August–15 September 2002



council recorded expenses of The \$4,229.83 and income of \$4,27597 during the August 16, 2002 through September 15, 2002 period. In addition to normal expenses for general pantry supplies, office copying, and meeting refreshments, the 16 expense tems in Coke included \$1,412.64 expenses (mostly drink syrup); \$567 for sales tax on the Coke booth poceeds; \$958.77 for the Labor Day picine; \$703.04 for the Installation inner: \$164.43 for refreshments following PGK Stan Nowak's funeral: \$103.75 for new aprons for the Tootsie Roll drive to raise funds for the mentally retarded; \$108.66 in supplies for the breakfasts; and \$100 to Catholic Charities.

In addition to member payments and business meeting raffle and income, the income items incl**d**ed \$1.629.00 from the Portuguese/rish dinner; \$1,345.10 from the Labor Day picnic; \$707.00 from the Installation dinner; \$306.00 from the 25 Agust breakfast; and \$216.06 in reimbursement from the Assembly for Fourth Degree dinner supplies charged to the council's account.

One of our student members, Byan Duquette, took a withdrawal card during this period, since he is away from Santa Barbara attending college. Bryn's departure reduces our membership to 201.




