**Financial Secretary's Report
16 September– 15 October 2002**



The council recorded expenses of \$1,407.87 and income of \$136.15 during the September 16, 2002 through October 15, 2002 period. In addition to normal expenses for office supplies, copying, and meeting refreshments, the 13 expense items included \$569.25 for Tootsie Rolls (which will be recovered from the proceeds of the drive to aid people with mental retardation); \$160.55 for printing of the September bulletin; \$200 deposit in our bulk mail account; \$116.92 for paper and ink for the bulletin and for recruiting flyers; and \$100 to Catholic Charities.

Income consisted of \$38 in donations at the 22 September recruiting breakfast, and \$98.15 from member payment (mostly dues).

Membership declined by two to 199 as Ken Devore transferred to Council 2498 in Ventura, and George Lopez transferred to Council 12819 Norman, Oklahoma.

Val Taylor's name was drawn for the attendance prize at the October business meeting, but Brother Taylor was absent. The attendance prize at the November business meeting will be \$35.

He is willing and helpful to assist brother Knights in doing work and sharing ideas and advice.

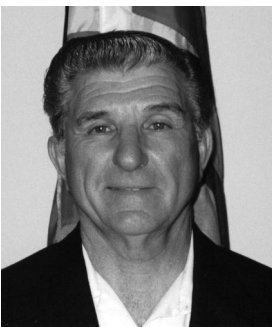
Terry's wife, Denise, is very supportive of his activities within our Council, for which I am very grateful. Thank you Denise.

The American Life League--ALL (<http://www.all.org>.) led by Judy Brown has incorporated both the young and the old in this fight for the unborn.

Senator Bob Smith is recognized by the National Pro-Life Alliance as a leader on several pro-life legislative fronts, including the partial-birth abortion ban as well as being the author of a Life at Conception Act (S.1373).

Priests for Life founded by Fr. Frank Pavone (www.priestsforlife.org) ask that our election choices reflect the Gospel of Life, Justice and Peace.

The Esther Project CD supports the post-abortion healing ministry of Rachel's Vineyard, which is a collection of ten songs from pro-life women and their bands (www.estherproject.org).

Those persons who had worked in the abortion industry and have now had a change of heart and mind founded the Centurions. For more information regarding this group contact Priests for Life.

When Jesus called out "Forgive them for they know not what they do," St. Augustine suggests that we notice where it was said. Jesus did it on the cross, not in heaven with the Father but as a man where he offered himself as an example to be followed by all. We are also called to follow His example by praying for those who work to overturn the culture of death; by praying forgiveness for those whose hearts accept still accept abortion; through financial support; and finally by becoming actively involved in the Pro-Life Movement.

Columbus Day Dinner By Sam Alfano



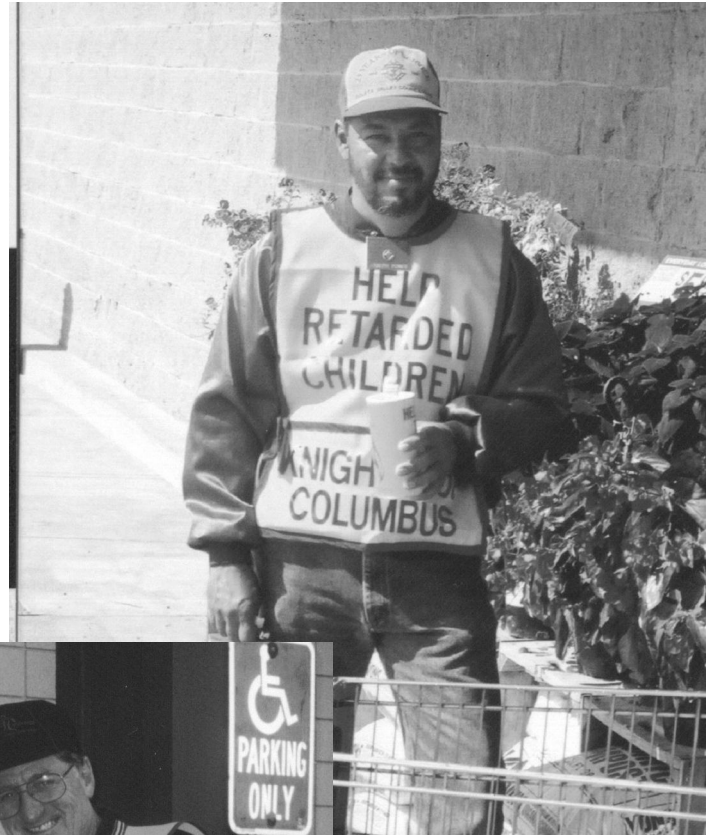

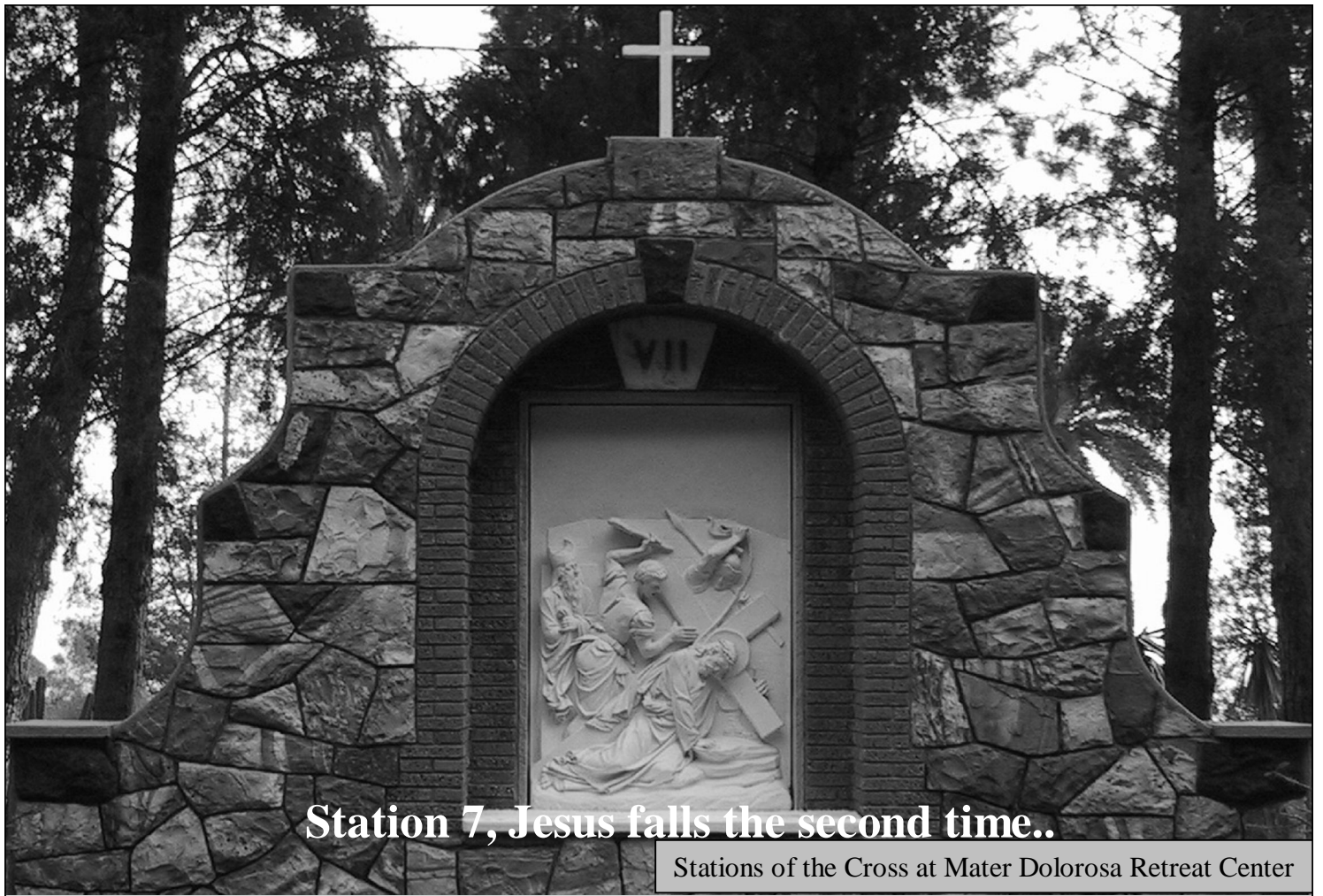
