
GRAND KNIGHT'S REPORT By Brian Klinge, Grand Knight

Financial Secretary's Report 16 October– 15 November 2002



The council recorded expenses of \$585.18 and income of \$4,140.61 during the October 16, 2002 through November 15, 2002 period. In addition to normal expenses for office supplies, copying, and meeting refreshments, the 8 expense items included \$150 for the annual bulk mail fee; \$105.63 for the dinner for the Regional Religious Conference; \$69 in per capita dues to Los Padres Chapter; and \$100 to Catholic Charities.

The Tootsie Roll drive for the mentally retarded provided the largest income item at \$2,311.55; almost \$1,640 of this income will ultimately go to **b**arity. Other large income items were Fiesta Italiana at \$931, the 27 October breakfast at \$661, and member payments (mostly dues) at \$167. Donations at seeral events provided the remaining income.

The Council suspended two members, Kenneth Herrera and Charles Cohen, for lack of payment, and lost a third member with the transfer of Fr. Vaughn Winters to Santa Maria. The First Dege Exemplification on 11 November provided two new members: Stephen Schlesselmann and Raul Guzman. With these losses and additions, membership declined by one to 198.

Jerome Becker's name was drawn for the attendance prize at the Novembr business meeting, but Brother Becker was absent. The December business meeting attendance prize will be \$40.

In fact, as pointed out by Supreme Knight Carl Andersen in speech delivered at the National Congress of America September 26, is that fraternalism matters today more than ever.


(When I was recuperating from my stroke and Felix took me daily to have my blood tested at SBMF Clinic, thank you Felix for being there).


As previously mentioned, Ralph has helped us with numerous pancake breakfasts, Fish Fry's, Memorial Day and Labor Day.





Not only does it sin against God, against the Child Jesus, against the sacredness of human life, but it kills one of the most noble and tender qualities rooted in the female heart: The vocation to protect what is weak."




