

Society of Jesus



Ignatius of Loyola was born in 1491, the son of a privileged family, and grew up around the court of the Spanish King. He led a somewhat dissolute life. For adventure, he signed up as a soldier, and in 1521 was severely wounded in the leg. During his long recovery, he began to read the lives of Christ and the saints and decided there was more to life than revelry. By 1530 Ignatius had begun to gather a group of men wishing to lead a Christ-like life in the Holy Land. Living there proved impractical during those times of great upheaval. In 1534 they took vows of poverty and chastity and finally in 1540 were accepted as a religious order with the additional vow of obedience. The new Society of Jesus was to be at the service of the pope, who immediately sent them to propagate the faith among distant peoples and to defend the faith during the Reformation. The members of the Society of Jesus came to be known as "Jesuits", originally a derogatory term. Changing the meaning of this term is a tribute to their grea zeal in imitating Christ and effectiveness in spreading the gospel.

Jesuits emphasize training their will and mind during a period of formation lasting about 17 years. They are then capable of taking on diverse assignments such as preaching, administering the sacraments, taking care of parishes or collegiate churches, teaching in schools of every level, writing, and foreign missions As missionaries, the Jesuits were pioneers of Christianity in China, Japan, India, Canada, and central and south America. The motto of the Society is Ad Maiorem Dei Gloria-For the Greater Glory of God.

Jesuits arrived in Santa Barbara in 1908 to serve the parish of Our Lady of Sorrows, which is the oldest parish in town as successor to the Presidio chapel. After the 1925 earthquake, the order built and ran the catholic high school and in 1929 built the present Our Lady of Sorrows church. At one time the Jesuit novitiate was in Montecito. Five members of the society now serve the parish and one other is attending UCSB in a doctoral program Worldwide, there are about 22,000 members of the Society of Jesus, making it the largest religious order.

Financial Secretary's Report 16 January – 15 February 2003

The council recorded expenses of \$2,858.79 and income of \$1,517.81 during the January 16, 2003 through February 15, 2003 period. In addition to normal expenses for office supplies, copying, and meeting refreshments, the 17 pense items included \$797.85 for the state per capita tax; \$380.27 in final payment for the Keep Christ in Christmas cards; \$321.10 for printing the January and February bulletins; \$109.39 for postage and copies (mostly for postage for the Religious/Clergy Appreciation dinner); \$105 for repair of the Council's laser printer; \$100 advance for food for the Blue/Gold cub scouts dinner; and \$100 to Catholic Charities. During this period, the council also worked with Los Padres Chapter to prepare and mail the chapter's solicitation for Columbian Charities; related expenses are \$455 in bulk mail advances and \$259.80 for mail setup. The chapter will reimburse these costs, which are included in the above total expense.

Income was primarily from the 26 January breakfast at \$453 and member payments of \$982.

The council gained two members at the February 10th First Degree: Francisco Cabrera and Daniel Knauss. Since there were no losses during this period, membership increased to 200.

The attendance prize went unclimed at the February business meeting. The March business meeting attendance prize will be \$55.

The following incident from Major General Van Antwerp may give us an insight. Gen. Antwerp is president of the Officers' Christian Fellowship. He lost nearly all his staff when the Pentagon was attacked Sept. 11. His executive officer LTC Brian Birdwell was badly burned and in the hospital when President Bush visited him. Our President spent time and prayed with Brian. As he was getting ready to leave, he went to the foot of Brian's bed and saluted. He held his salute until Brian was able to raise his burned and bandaged arm, ever so slowly, in return. The Commander-in-Chief almost never initiates a salute, except in the case of a Congressional Medal of Honor winner. The injured soldier did not have to return the salute. But he did, out of respect to his President ...a Soldiers' President.


Congressman JC Watts (R. Oklahoma) said, 'Character is doing the right thing when nobody is looking,' (My favorite quote of all time.) The nation and world learned some of what our last President did when nobody was looking. That President has been disbarred, the worst disgrace (other than imprisonment) to a lawyer. CNN will have a difficult time shining his or his wife's tarnished images. In this time of war and danger, I am so grateful to have a President whom the soldiers salute -- fully.

On Special Report with Brit Hume, at the close of the show when they normally would have some funny video clip, they showed President Bush and the First Lady leaving for Camp David for the weekend. As the video starts, the First Lady is leading the way into the helicopter with the spaniel dog on the leash, and the president is right behind her with the Scotty on leash. As the First Lady entered the chopper, the Marine at the gangway saluted and held his salute. The Scottie, the president was walking, decided it wanted to sit right when he got to the steps. The president pulled on its leash, but the stubborn Scottie persisted in sitting. The president bent down, scooped up the pooch, and entered Marine One. After he entered, the Marine cut his salute and returned to the position of attention. Moments later the president reemerged from the helicopter and out onto the steps. The Marine was standing at attention, head and eyes straight ahead. The President leaned over and tapped him on the left arm. The startled Marine turned his body toward the president and received his president's returned salute!

I was so impressed by this true act of respect for our military people by our President! He really does get it. Most any other person of his stature would have just continued his journey, disregarding the neglected return salute. Not George W. Bush. He has <u>earned</u> the respect of the military community, not simply expecting it -- as most have and would.

President George W. Bush...the man who admitted to having a drinking problem in younger years, and whose happy-go-lucky lifestyle led him to mediocre grades in college and an ill-fated oil venture; who mangled syntax, and whose speaking missteps became known as Bushisms. He came within a hair's breadth of losing the election in November.

While in my late teens, I read an account of a daughter of a well known actor informing her father of her conversion to Catholicism. His response was, "Why would you wish to take on all that additional baggage?" In my ignorance I could not understand his question. Having been a cradle Catholic, I loved the Church and never saw the following of its rubrics as a burden. What was this "baggage" this father was referring to? Now in my fifties I understand the actor's comment.

Imagine God giving you an envelope with the following words written on it: "Mission Impossible." As you open the envelope and remove the neatly folded paper and you read: "You did not choose Me, it is I who chose you."--John 15:16 I AM calling you to a lifetime mission. If you accept this mission, I will never leave you or disavow you. My Son preceded you so He will be your example, your Way, to carry out this mission--rely on Him for He is "Faithful and Trustworthy." Should you err, just ask for My forgiveness and I will always grant this to you. For added measure, I will give you the Bread of Life to sustain you and to give you courage. I hope you accept this invitation for no one else can do this mission exactly as you can.....Love, Your Father"

What does this have to do with abortion? Each of us has a mission in life. We are mothers and fathers, teachers and preachers, doctors and lawyers, politicians and gardeners. As a Catholic we are called to uphold the standard of Christ; to hold steadfast to the Gospel even when others are not.

The American Life League has launched the "Crusade for the Defense of our Catholic Church." Its goal is to convict publicly those Catholic politicians who support and/or advocate abortion. Pope John Paul II teaches in the Gospel of Life, #58:

"The moral gravity of procured abortion is apparent in all its truth if we recognize that we are dealing with murder..."

Canon Law 915 states:

"Those who have been excommunicated or interdicted after the imposition or the declaration of a penalty as well as others who obstinately persist in manifest grave sin are not to be admitted to Communion."


