FATHER McGIVNEY'S CANONIZATION



Regarding Father McGivney's canonization, I was asked to reprint the following by our Chapter President, Tim Carvahlo. It is excerpted from the Supreme Convention report by rF Gabriel B. O'Donnell, O.P., on the Cause of Fr. McGivney.

He began with the status of the cause in the forms and formalities. He then went into the following:

"...But it leads to a second, and a way more important, question in light of our theme, Now is the Time for the Great Catch." Because when I first began the work of postulating the Cause of Father Michael J. McGivney, in talking to brother Knights, I was quite astonished by the numbers of different attitudes toward the promotion of Father McGivney's canonization.

"Of course most Knights were ethusiastic. But many thought that this possibl canonization of Father McGivney would be goodfor the Order because it would give the Order greater status.

Clergy of the Month Vincentians



YMEN Depaul

Founded in 1625 by St. Vincent de Paul as Priests of the Congregation of the Mission. They were originally organized to give missions for the poor country people at that time so neglected by their clergy in a time of religious and political turmoil. They were secular priests, rather than a religious order. In Europe they were known as Lazarists after their original house in St. Lazare, near Paris. They were known in English speaking countries as Vincentians, and in Spanish speaking countries they came to be known as Paules. They spread their work throughout Europe within the life of their founder. The congregation spread later throughout the world. In Barbary and Madagascar, they even fulfilled the duties of consul, when it was too difficult to find a layman for this office. Some were imprisoned and others were put to death at the cannon's mouth.

Vincent's method was to render all services gratuitously. Therefore, a mission house must have a sufficient foundation to allow the missions to be given without charge. In the United States there are no foundations and it has been the custom of St. Vincent's missionaries to accept whatever offering is made. From 1652 to 1660 more than seven hundred missions were given from the house of St. Lazare alone. Mission preaching has been employed in every age of the Church, but the modern form of systematic parish missions was commenced by St. Vincent de Paul and the Congregation of the Mission. St. Vincent cites an instance: "A mission was given among the banditti and these wretched people were converted by the grace of God." Elsewhere he says: "Of all the means which the Almighty has left to mankind for the correcting of their lives there is none that has produced effects more striking, more multiplied and more marvelous than the exercises of a mission."


Vincent also founded his community to serve priests. In France in his day many priests, especially in the country, had no practical means of formation. Clerics received their formation chiefly at the universities or in the colleges of the chief cities. The Lazarists provided seminaries as small homes for clerics who attended the universities and colleges. In their seminary, priests received support from other priests and there was a course in liturgy and practical study of moral theology, and when the time came they were aided by a retreat to prepare for ordinations. Later they organized seminaries similar to what we know.


During the French Revolution, the Lazarists were suppressed and their houses taken over by the government. Many of them died martyrs or in prison. At this time, there are 4085 Vincentians worldwide in 84 countries.

The first Vincentians came to the United States in 1816 and to Santa Barbara in 1964. Father Felix Andreis was the first Superior of the Order in the United States. He arrived with one other priest and a brother. Their Retreat Center, formerly their seminary, is located above Santa Barbara on Los Canoas Road. Fathers Walter Housey, Jim Galvin, Roy Persich and Pat Mullen are in residence. They give missions for engaged persons, ecumenical gatherings, clergy, high school and confirmation classes, and parishes.



The council recorded expenses of \$1,728.36 and income of \$2,43387 during the April 16, 2003 through May 15, 2003 period. 
The main items of income were \$1,120 from the golf dinner, \$1,069 from the 11 April fish fry, and \$158 in mater payments.


