This means we believe that the source of the rights of all people is the God who created us. No mere human or human institution can alienate us from those rights. All over the world in our time the right to life is being threatened. In our own country we face the terrible alienation of the right to life called abortion. Our order is in the forefront of the effort to build institutions which support the right to life of the unborn. There is no other group than the unborn who need as much the protection which can be provided by men who subscribe to the ideals of knighthood. Knights are called to stand in the forefront of the defense of life. When good people stand aside, evil has free rein.

Our Supreme Knight, Carl Anderson, has said our Order is "entering a new, higher level of involvement" in the pro-life movement. To this end, I call upon all Knights to attend with me the Walk For Life at 9AM on Saturday August 9 beginning at Stearns Wharf. Bring friends and carpool from St. Raphael's. Clergy of the Month
Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary



The Order was originally established in France but disappeared during the revolution when religious were severely persecuted. In 1844, under the patronage of Bishop Bourget of Montreal, a religious congregation was founded at Longueuil, Quebec, for the Christian education of young girls and based on the original order. The first Mother Superior, Blessed Marie Rose, organized the order in Montreal where the Mother House is now located and rapidly expanded its work. The order has branched out to other educational ministries including refuge for destitute and orphaned children, residential and parochial schools, and colleges, especially for teacher training. Those desiring of leading a hidden life in the apostolate of education, or possessing little aptitude for instruction, could enter the order as auxiliary sisters.

In 1859, twelve sisters came to the United States at Oregon City, Oregon. Since then, the Order has expanded on the East and West coasts. The order first came to California in 1868 under Bishop Alemany and established their local Provincial House in Los Gatos. The province operates Holy Names College in Oakland and 6 other schools in California and 8 outside California. The sisters arrived in Santa Barbara in the 1970's when they (including Sister Grace Briare) taught at St. Raphael School. Sister Grace is the only member of the Order here in Santa Barbara at the present time and is in charge of the Religious Education Program at St. Raphael Church.

Currently the order has 1532 sisters, 470 associates and 12 novices or postulants. They order has spread as far as Peru, Haiti and Basutoland in their generous service.
