## Grand Knight's Report, by Rich Scholl

This month I am titling my report the same as last month. The reason is that on January 22, I was given the privilege of raising a voice for the Knights of Columbus and our children on this anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision for the 6:00 evening news. KEYT news reporter Michelle Cole called me to ask if I would make a statement and that they would be at my workplace in 15 minutes with their cameras. I hope that my statement, which follows, will find meaning in your hearts as well as in some of those who were watching the news and were not yet confirmed in the prolife position. I welcome comments from any Knight or family member.

In our society today we are at the unfortunate position where women, and men too, do not feel supported by our culture in that fundamental human activity of creating and bearing children and nurturing them into adulthood. Any society which does not unonditionally accept its children and does away with them is impoverished at its core. The Roe v. Wade decision has contributed to this unfortunate social climate. The Knights of Columbus is committed to taking positive actions toward fostering cultural values promoting the sanctity of life. We work for a society where all humans are created equal with a right to Ife that cannot be alienated by the state or any individual.

That evening I attended the pro-life prayer vigil at UCSB Storke Plaza. Attendance was very light with 27 people, 7 of them Knights from Councils 5300 and 1684. I know from personal

contact that some of you were there in prayer even though you could not be present. As Knights we sometimes carry ceremonial swords, but let us remember that our real sword is the Word of God. Let us raise our voices more often publicly with our testimony to that Word.

# **Paulists**



The Missionary Society of St. Paul the Apostle as the Paulits are officially named is a community of priests for giving missions and doing other Apostolic works, especially for making converts to the Catholic faith. The order was founded in New York in 1858 by Father Isaac Hecker and fellow priests who had been members of the Redemptorists. Father Hecker had received from the Holy Spirit distinct and unmistakable intimations that he was "set apart to undertake in some leading and conspicuous way the conversion of this country". Due to misunderstandings, they had been suspected of disloyalty to their order and expelled. This action was appealed to the Holy See and Father Hecker and his fellow priests were dispensed from their vows. They proceeded to form the new community with blessing of the Holy See and Archbishop John Hughes of New York

Father Hecker and his associates were all Americans and all converts, making the Paulists one of the first completely "homegown" American religious order. Under their founder's inspiration, they soon developed their high gifts of preaching, of writing, and of the guidance of souls. Father Hecker especially was known as a remarkable man, a leader in Catholic thought possessing a saintly interior spirit of prayer, joined to such a zeal for souls. The fundamental rule of the order is expressed by Father Hecker thusly: "The main purpose of each Paulist must be the attainment of personal perfection by the practice of those virtues without which it cannot be secured -- interior fidelity to grace, payer, detachment and the like." From this basis, Paulists are to proceed in their mission.

Paulists are most commonly known both in and out of the Church as convert makers. Missions for non-Catholics are given as well as Catholic missions and missions to diocesan clergy to leverage their apostolic work. Paulists care for 21 parishes and operate Newman Centers at 10 universities. the Paulists have vigorously engaged in the apstolate of the press. The first fathers printed and circulated their sermons in the earliest years of the community, and in 1865 Father Hecker started the "Catholic World Magazine", then the only Catholic monthly in the country; and this was followed by the Paulist Press for missionary books and pamphlets which continues today. Paulists are also active in video media and movie production. Paulists leverage their small community of about 130 priests by training active Catholics to bring alienated Catholics back to the fold through their "Landings' program. Locally, the Paulists operate the Newman Center at UCSB and St. Mark's Parish. Father Paul Rospond, a Paulist, is currently a candidate for membership in our council.


# Paul & Roberta Coyne Family of the Month


# LENT






# RELIGIOUS APPRECIATION BANQUET
