The following resolution was submitted at the August 9th business meeting, and will be voted upon at our next business meeting on September 13th.

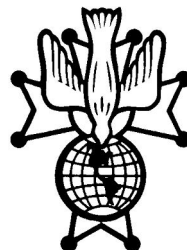
RESOLUTION

Similarly, when a visiting dignitary, such as the District Deputy or State Officer or similar VIP, visits the Council his arrival will be announced in a similar manner and he will be escorted to his place in a similar manner. If, when the GK calls a meeting to order one of these VIP is present, they should take a seat in the Chamber and the GK will then direct that he be escorted to his proper place (as above). If the Chaplain or VIP departs before the meeting is adjourned he will be escorted to the door by the Warden, at the direction of the GK.

Watch next month's lesson.

Remember PROTOCOL.

PROTOCOL II: A second courtesy is that of standing when members of the Clergy enter or leave the Chambers. When, for example, the Chaplain enters the Chambers the Inside Guard must salute the GK and announce in a loud voice, "Worthy Grand Knight". When recognized by the GK he will announce, "The Chaplain of this Council has entered the Chambers." At this time the GK will rap the gavel three times (directing the membership to rise) and announce, "Worthy Warden". The Warden will go to the center of the Chamber and salute the GK. The GK will announce, "Worthy Warden, please escort the Chaplain to his seat at the head table." The Warden will then salute the GK and DGK, proceed to where the Chaplain waits and escort him to the center of the chambers. There both the Warden and the Chaplain will salute the GK and DGK and the Warden will escort the Chaplain to his seat by the most direct route. When the Chaplain has taken his position the GK will rap the gavel once to seat the assembly. Note that the Chaplain does not come in and proceed to a seat by himself as does most any other member.
