

The bulk of this section has been taken from various sources including The Way and Friends of God Homilies both written by St Josemaria Escriva de Balaguer. I've also included some excerpts from the In Conversation with God series by Fancis Fernandez. The text between the quotation marks is directly copied from the noted citation. The following thoughts from In Conversation with God and Christ is Passing By seemappropriate for the Easter season: "Jesus Christ lives. And this crowns us with happiness" (In Conversation With God, Vol 2, pg 294 by Francis Fernande). "This is the great truth which fills our faith with meaning. Jesus, who died on he cross, has risen. He has rlumphed over death; he has overcome sorrow, anguish and the power of darkness... In him we find everything. Outside of him our life is empty" (Christ is Passing By, pg 102, by St Josemaria de Balaguer).

St. Vincent de Paul Society



A St. Vincent de Paul conference was started at St. Raphael Church in February 2001. The Society is the oldest Catholic charitable organization in the World. The St. Raphael Conference currently has 34 members, including eight members of our Council and the wives of three Council members. The aim of this Catholic Society is to "encounter the suffering Christ, perceived as present in the persons of the poor." Members seek to alleviate the suffering of the poor. Being poor does not always, or necessarily, consist of needing material goods. Being poor can also mean being chehged mentally, physically, psychologically, etc. There are poor who are, or are made to feel, alone. There are those who have lost their contact with their faith One of the primary differences between the Society and other service organizations is that Vincentians visit the needy in their homes to determine the family's needs; the people requesting help are not required to come to the Conference. Vincentians are not trained to assist in all problem areas; where our Confreence does not have people trianed to assist in a particular field, we refer indviduals to Social Service agecies trained to handle problems in that field. Our Conference seeks to assist our Priests, too, by taking from their shoulders the burden of responding to many of the cries for help. In all cases, we are here to assist the Pastor while assisting the needy in our midst. No work of charity is foreign to the Society, but our Conference in no way wishes to conflict with other Parish ministries. In the four years since the initiation of our Conference, members have visited hundreds of families of our parish or community to provide needed assistance. We work in concert with Catholic Charities and other social service organizations within the larger Santa Barbara community.



We had Amy and Julie and Brian and Rick and Joe on the line serving our patrons while Jim and Terry and Rich and Mark fried the fish. And lest I forget We had AJ, Junior, Brian, Angel, and Jose who was there every Friday waking the dishes. As for me, Ijust jumped in where I was needed. While I'm sure I've missed some who helped out please know that every helping hand was greatly appreciated. You all have my sincerest thanks for a job well done!

A special word of thanks and appreciation goes out to "Farmer Boy Restaurant", "Orowheat", and "Santa Cruz Market" for lending us their buying power to gain better prices, and "Bedrock Building Supplies" who helped out financially to ensure that this Lenten Fish Fry was a success.

Ralph Wengler our faithful Financial Secretary has done the tedious work of figuring our costs and profits, so let me share hose figures with you. In 2005 we served 849 adults and 30 kids with a total gross income of \$551.50 less expenses of \$238517 for a total net profit of \$4166..33. In 2004 we served 862 adults and 77 kids with a total gross income of \$6541.05 less expenses of \$2951.59 for a total net profit of \$3589.46. Yes we served fewer people and made more money and God our Father, Jesus our Savior, and the Holy Spirit our Helper receive all the credit and the glory. Who but God can multiply the loaves and fishes!

While it has been both a blessing and a pleasure to coordinate the Fish Fry these past two years its time for me to hang up my hat. I will gladly help whom ever steps in to coordinate next year. NeverFarFromUs Ted


