



As you read this I will be onmy way to South America with agroup of campus ministers. We¹re going to dialogue with campus ministers & students in Lima, Puno, Cuzco and La Paz. I signed on thinking "adventure!" And it's inexpensive, as we will be staying at Maryknoll houses The Maryknollers will give us a connection with people in the barrios as well as the universities.

Initially I was thinking of myself as a tourist. I've never been to those countries. We're taking a day to visit the Inca ruins at Machu Pichu. But this week I got a message from the organizers of the tours referring to us as "**pilgrims**" This puts the trip in a whole new light.

I¹ve been a pilgrim before. Once, unexpectedly, a journey to an international priests' retreat in Rome turned into a pilgrimage as we priests on the charter flight from New York told stories about the reasons for our journey, what/who we were praying for, the people who helped make the trip possible. The flight attendants were startled to learn that we wanted prayer time instead of the movie.

A few years later I felt called to walk 200 miles from Warsaw to the shrine of the Virgin at Czestochowa. On the way we prayed, sang hymns, shared our stories, food and places to sleep in the barns where peasants welcomed us along the way. Something wonderful happened, every step became a prayer, a lesson of how to trust in God, step by step, throughout the year.

A pilgrim is open to receive unexpected graces. A pilgrim is open to be a blessing to those he meets along the way. Sounds like a good way to approach life whether we go far a field or stay at home.


