PROGRESS ON LIMITING MEDIA INDENCY By Rich Scholl

Due to the efforts of various organizations led by Morality in Media and the Parents Television Council, Congress has passed a law to increase the maximum fine for violations of the broadcast indecency law from \$32,500 to \$325,000.

Robert Peters, President of Morality in Media, had the following comments on action in the House of Representatives: "In a 1964 obscenity case, former Chief Justice Warren stated, 'There is a right of the nation and states to maintain a decent society.' Today, the House of Representatives is to be commended for making the FCC's exercise of that right easier. Broadcasting is now dominated by media giants for whom a maximum fine of \$32,500 can be treated as a readily affordable cost of doing busi-

ness, like corporate executive parking tickets. Now, in an appropriate case, the FCC can levy a much larger fine that will hopefully get the attention of both corporate executives and shareholders. creasing the maximum fine poses no threat to freedom of speech because the First Amendment was not intended to provide a license to pollute public spaces with indecent talk and pictures and because, as the Supreme Court has already held, enforcement of the indecency law does not constitute impermissible 'censorship.' While there is undoubtedly a market for sex and vulgarity, opinion polls indicate that most Americans are offended by and concerned about the glut of sex and vulgarity on the public While Americans cherish their First Amendment rights of freedom of speech and press, most also want to live and raise children in a safe and decent society. The V-chip may help some parents, but the V-chip is no substitute for corporate responsibility. Of course, the potential for large fines will only help if the FCC continues to enforce the broadcast indecency law. Congress must also address the problem of indecent programming on nonpremium cable and satellite TV channels."

The new fine can be assessed for each airing of an indecent or obscene broadcast, that is, for EACH station which airs the offending broadcast and EACH repeat broadcast. This is an important tool which can be used against the media giants who are polluting our public airwaves. In a future article, I will tell you how you can personally make complaints to the FCC. They have recently made the process of filing complaints more accessible.

<u>Pro-Life Catholic Group Launches</u> <u>Prayer Campaign for Abortion, 2006 Elections</u>

A leading pro-life Catholic group is launching an 18-week prayer campaign designed to help prepare the nation for the 2006 elections. The prayers are meant to help pro-life candidates at the polls and to encourage voters to choose candidates who are most likely to help reduce or stop abortions.

Fr. Frank Pavone, the director of Priests for Life, says the campaign will begin next week and end on Election Day.

"This is a double-novena, a pair of nine-week periods of prayer, starting on Tuesday the Fourth of July, and concluding on Tuesday, November 7, which is Election Day," Pavone explained.

"The intentions of the campaign are that citizens take an active role in the elections and understand that the most important issue is abortion," Father Pavone said.

Priests for Life has set up a special web site to go along with the campaign. People are invited to say each day a prayer specially composed for the campaign. The prayer can be found on the website, and visitors can indicate online their intention to participate.

To accompany the campaign, Priests for Life is also publishing a booklet called "Ten Easy Steps to Voting with a Clear Conscience" that helps pro-life voters make the best voting decisions possible when heading to the polls.

Stephen J. Schlesselmann Takes Reins of Knights, Becoming the 45th Grand Knight of Council 5300 in Goleta

Stephen Joseph Schlesselmann becomes the 45th Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus, Council 5300, serving as their leader for the July 2006-June 2007 Columbian year. He was installed as Grand Knight in a special installation ceremony on Monday evening, June 26th in St Raphael's Parish Hall. District Deputy Cherif Khoury performed the impressive rites as all the other officers were installed also (see page 15 for names of the officers). Stephen inherits a current membership of approximately 210 Knights according to Financial Secretary Ralph J. Wengler, who was the 15th Grand

Knight back in 1976-77. One of Stephen's goals is to increase Council 5300 by 15 new members.

"All men over 18 should join the Knights since they will be joining a group of like-kinded men who are committed to serving their Church and society with prayer and good works," stated the native of the San Francisco Bay Area. He added, "The Knights are very family oriented and are committed to defending the family from modern attacks that seek to destroy it. Finally, the Knights have a great insurance program that all young men can take advantage of when they join."

Stephen's parents, Herman and Marie, are living in San Rafael, CA, and are proud parents of two daughters and three sons. Barbara Purcell is married with five children and lives in Fairbanks, AK. Carolyn Todd has two children and lives near Aurora, CO. Rev. Greg Schlesselmann is serving as the Rector at Cardinal Muench Seminary in Fargo, ND and is also a 4th Degree Knight of Columbus. John lives in Goleta with his wife, Lisa and they have two children, Michael and Patrick. Stephen who is single, joined the KCs in November 2002 and became a 2nd, 3rd and 4th Degree in 2004. Stephen currently resides in Goleta.

A member of St. Raphael's Parish for the past seven years, Stephen is also active with the St. Vincent de Paul group. It didn't take him long to hold key KC offices. In less than three years, Stephen was the Council Activities Director, Advocate and Deputy Grand Knight. Stephen's proud sponsors were Mike Donovan and Sam Alfano.

Born October 3, 1955 at St. Mary's in San Francisco during the World Series, Stephen graduated from St. Patrick's Grammar School in Larkspur, Marin Catholic High School, College of Marin and the Univ. of California, Berkeley with a BA in Business Administration with emphasis in Accounting in Dec., 1977.

He is currently a tax accountant with the Family Business Center (Steve Pybrum, CPA). His previous employment included working with other accounting firms, with Calahorro Associates as a tax accountant and as a night auditor for Tiburon Lodge.

Other goals he wishes to accomplish as Grand Knight include:

- *Instilling more of an atmosphere of prayer;
- *Encouraging the Knights to make more visits and attend Mass more frequently;
- *Planning to push for a Blue Mass to honor law enforcement personnel in the community;
- *Encouraging members to get more involved in the Pro-Life movement, possibly by praying in front of Planned Parenthood;
- *Making more visits to the rest homes in the area.

His favorite current KC projects/activities are the Mothers Day Orchids, the Pancake Breakfasts and the Fiesta Coke Booth.

Stephen's most memorable experience as a Knight is the camaraderie and genuine friendship that each Knight has for his fellow Knights. He noted, "Some highlights include the Degree Ceremonies and the 4th Degree Color Corps participation at various Masses and events."

Responding to the question, what would be a few recommendations to the other Knights as to getting involved in some manner regardless of their ages, Stephen expressed it this way, "Just simply sign up for one or two events. As they say, many hands make light work, so the more Knights who volunteer for a project the less work each one has to do. Also, since all the work is for charitable purposes and the church, you know you are working for the right reason. Finally, the camaraderie and fulfillment of a job well done more than offsets any tedium from the work. It simply is a lot of fun to work with your Brother Knights."

Two priests stand out for Stephen since coming to Goleta. "Before moving to St. Raphael's Parish, whenever my family and I came to visit my brother, Msgr. Stephen Downes would be there," recalled Stephen. He added, "Due to Msgr. Steve's push to get people involved, I signed up for the St. Vincent de Paul group and was noticed by Mike Donovan who asked me to join the Knights of Columbus." Also he stated, "I liked Father Marco Ortiz since he was very orthodox, knew his faith very well and was not afraid to tell us the truth."

Personal highlights of St. Raphael Parish since becoming a member include:

- *The Masses have been a special highlight. They are very well attended and everyone actively participates;
- *The singing has especially been enjoyable;
- *The friendliness of all the parishioners has been great.

His other community involvements have included working as an Adult Literacy Tutor, working with the St. Vincent de Paul group and Toastmasters. Before moving here, back in the 1990s, he used to pray in front of Planned Parenthood in Santa Rosa with a group from Healdsburg and Santa Rosa.

"Before my back problems, I used to hike fairly regularly. I spent most of my adult life in Sonoma County before moving to Santa Barbara and really enjoyed the countryside," noted Stephen. He added, "In addition to hiking, I would take occasional car trips with friends just to see the area. Right now, I swim several times a week at the YMCA."

Only 50 years of age, Stephen's long range plans were expressed, "If possible I'd like to stay in the Santa Barbara area after retirement and continue serving the Knights of Columbus and the St. Vincent de Paul group."

His responses to the following are:

- *Favorite meal: hamburger, raviolis, vegetables and ice cream;
- *Favorite food: ice cream;
- *Do you cook? I cook for myself but only the foods mentioned above since they are easy to prepare;
- *Favorite sport to watch: football;
- *Favorite sport to play: none would be enjoyable due to my bad back;
- *Favorite teams (pro and college): San Francisco Giants and the 49ers and UC Berkeley Golden Bears.

Financial Secretary Wengler reports that of the approximately 210 members, 132 are associate members, 62 carry the KC insurance and 15 are inactive. Included in the total, 67 men are Honorary Life members, eight are Honorary and two are disabled.

The 2006-2007 State Pin was designed by Emilio and Rebecca Moure with the collaboration of Marilyn Willour and inspired by John Paul II's Papal Coat of Arms. The artwork depicts our faith in California. The selection of the octagon illustrates that, although being created by the perfection of God, we ourselves are imperfect creatures. The blue California represents the vastness of our faith established by Blessed Junipero Serra, whose journey founded the California Missions with the motto "Siempre Adelante". The cross in red represents the suffering at Calvary by our Lord for our salvation and his conquer of death. The letter M is for Mary; Mary's example of readiness to serve shows us the path to her son Jesus. With Mary, the Church fulfills its own vocation and mission, proclaiming Jesus Christ and exhorting us to do what he says, building a universal brotherhood in which every person can call God "Father". The words Totus Tuus Ego Sum, I am completely in your hands, is the motto of our late Pope John Paul II, who, in life, was the great example of overcoming imperfections and fully gave himself to Christ.
