A Spiritual Thought

On May 18, we will be celebrating the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity: Three Persons in one God. We will be receiving grace that day just as we do each day of our lives. As **St. Josemaria de Balaguer** states in the Furrow: "The Most Holy Trinity grants you grace and expects you to make use of it responsibly. Given such an endowment, there is no place for your adopting easy, slow, lazy attitudes, because, apart from everything else, souls await you." (page 957 of the Way/Furrow/the Forge by St. Josemaria de Balaguer).

This last week has been a great one for us Catholics and for the nation. Our Pope, Benedict XVI, paid us a visit. I hope all of you had a chance to watch or read about the Pope's time here in Washington, DC and New York. The Knights of Columbus were very much a part of the event from their Color Corps presence on the south lawn of the White House (an historic first) to guest commentaries by several Knights including our Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. You can read all about the visit at www.kofc.org and the April issue of the Columbia is filled cover to cover with details about Pope Benedict, his itinerary and quotes he has made. It is worthwhile reading the issue.

Also, Supreme Knight Carl Anderson's new book, "A Civilization of Love" made the New York Times best sellers list; so it is worthwhile reading it. You can order a copy of the book at the Knights of Columbus web site.

Finally, as I'm writing this report, the State is in the middle of their Spring membership blitz drive. I hope several of you councils participated in it and gained new members as a result.

Degrees:

Only two degrees took place in April but there a few more coming up in the next month or two. Here are the details (unfortunately, there are no 3rd

degrees planned until the fall):

- 1) A 1st degree was held on Monday, April 14 at Council 5300 in Goleta. Seven new Brother Knights joined the council that night: Brothers Mauricio Cuevas, Abel Salcedo, Matthew Drammer, Leonardo Curti, Patrick Donohoe, Dr. Robert Pacheco and Andrew Nguyen. Congratulations, to our new Brother Knights!
- 2) By the time most of you read this report, the 2nd degree at Council 750 on April 30 will have already occurred. I'll pass on the district results of that 2nd degree in my emails and in my June report.
- 3) Council 1684 will be hosting a 1st degree at Serra Hall on May 14. Candidates should be there for that degree at 7 PM.

Programs:

Council 1684 has been busy hosting their dinner socials and events. A scholarship dinner was held on April 23 for the essay contest winners from various local elementary schools. On May 28, the council will be hosting their annual high school scholarship awards dinner.

Council 5300 was very busy during the month of April with a number of events: In addition to the first degree mentioned above, the Council also hosted their regular monthly pancake breakfast and a Past Grand Knight's party on April 28. Events coming up include: the Mother's Day orchid distribution on May 11 and the Memorial Day picnic on May 26 at Tucker's Grove Park. Also, GK Ray Centeno from Council 750 will be coming the council on Monday, May 12 to talk about the Squires.

Council 10067 (Saticoy) had a very busy business meeting in April: the local Scout troop presented their charter to the council and a resolution was passed to give the proceeds of the March tri-tip sale (\$1,500) to Jeannette, a local 4th or 5th grader who is dying of cancer. On April 27, the council hosted a pancake breakfast and blood drive and did some recruiting as well.

Finally, Council 13756 (Carpinteria) continues to be busy with projects around the church. The council also hosted a very nice birthday party for their pastor, Fr. Beto on April 26. Both Brother Cherif Khoury and myself took the opportunity to do some recruiting and were able to recruit one new member for the council with a potential for at least 3 or 4 more.

Other Notes:

- 1) Right now, the district is at 100% membership and 67% of insurance. However, those numbers don't reflect several insurance transactions that our insurance agent, David Farebrother has completed in the last week or so nor do the numbers reflect members that could be potentially dropped nonpayment of their dues. It is imperative that we make every effort to continue contacting the late paying members to encourage them to stay with the council. Again, as I state every month, there are plenty of potential members who can join our Order. All we have to do is ask. When you are recruiting, mention to potential members that they will be joining a fraternity that was founded by a future saint.
- 2) As I stated in point 1 above, the membership and insurance percents do not reflect the potential dropped members due to late payment. Unfortunately, as I recently learned, Council 13756 (Carpinteria) has many members in the late payment category. Only 9 members have paid their dues so far this Columbian Year. I'll be working closely with GK Rufino Murillo, Chapter Vice President Cherif Khoury and Brother David Farebrother to solve this problem. We have much work to do and only a short time to get it done.
- 3) The next Chapter meeting is on Wednesday, May 7 in Santa Barbara. Every Brother Knight is more than welcome to attend. The Grand Knights and Deputy Grand Knights are especially encouraged to do so.
- 4) Several of the Knights who joined Council 5300 at the April first degree are from the Santa Ynez area and are anxious to start a council there. I will be contacting the pastor at Mission Santa Ynez shortly for a discussion on starting the council.
- 5) The election process for the next Columbian should be well under way. I know that most councils in the district have already started the

- process, but for any that haven't, please start now.
- 6) The discussion regarding Bishop Lori's article in the Columbia is going full steam ahead. Council 10067's chancellor, Brother Andy Stay has already been doing a great job of not only recapping the article but also leading a brief discussion of it. GK Mark Wietstock of Council 1684 asked another member Brother Jim Garland to recap it and ask a few questions during the April meeting. Council 5300 skipped it at the April meeting due to the first degree but will resume discussions on it in May. Thanks Brother Knights for allocating time for this important endeavor. Let's keep up the momentum on this project and make it a routine part of every meeting. Again, remember that the article is available online at www.kofc.org.
- 7) As stated for the last few months, all new first degree Brother Knights who take their first degree between December 1 and June 30, 2008 will be presented with a limited edition certificate acknowledging their joining the Knights during the 125th year of our Order. Also, the Knight's recruiter will receive a minted medallion acknowledging their efforts.
- 8) Thank you again to all the councils who participated in the "California One Man, One Woman Marriage Initiative" signature drive that was recently held. We did it! The initiative made onto the ballot for the November election. However, as GK Mark Wietstock (1684) put it, the real hard work is about to begin. Since the initiative is an amendment to the State constitution, GK Mark stated that it will take 67% of California's voters to vote for it in order for it to become law. Keep praying!

Please continue to pray for all our sick and deceased Knights in the district including Brother Richard Rink's (1684) brother, Brother Sam Alfano's (5300) brother, Brother John Naour (1684) and Judy Klinge (PCP Brian Klinge's wife) who is suffering from Parkinson's disease. Also, Brother Ray Ruiz (10067) recently lost 3 family members.

<u>Grandson Priest says: William Wilberforce would</u> <u>have fought Abortion</u>

A letter from Fr Gerard Wilberforce, a Catholic priest in Exeter, who is the great grandson of the famed William Wilberforce:

TORONTO (LifeSiteNews) - I am writing as the great great grandson of William Wilberforce, who campaigned vigorously for the ending of the transatlantic slave trade in 1807, which ultimately paved the way for the abolition of slavery itself throughout the entire British Empire in 1833.

I am often asked what would be the campaigns Wilberforce would be fighting if he were alive in 21st century Britain. I believe that there would be a number of different issues among them human trafficking and the scourge of drugs. But almost certainly at the top of the list, would be the issue of abortion.

As the Human Fertilization and Embryology Bill comes before Parliament over the next few weeks, the opportunity presents itself to amend the Abortion Act. With the number of abortions having reached 200,000 per year in the UK alone, the time is right to tighten up the law that was designed to protect women by ending illegal abortion, but never to allow such a high degree of deprived life.

There are great similarities between the status of the fetus and the status of African slaves two centuries ago. Slaves were considered a commodity to do with whatever the vested interests of the day decided.

Today, in our desire to play God in our embryology experimentation, with all its' unfulfilled promises of miracle cures, and our decision to abort unwanted children, we are no better that those slave traders who put their interests and world view higher than they placed the sanctity and value of human life.

Most people at the time didn't believe the evil of slavery could ever be defeated, as so much of the economy at the time was dependent on the trade. It's easy for us to think that is the case today with abortion, but I believe William Wilberforce would not take such a view.

Whilst our hearts go out to those who have chosen abortion, there should now be much greater emphasis on the alternatives that exist. Many of us would like to see far more support to those who have made such a significant and difficult decision but whilst we recognize the trauma many women have gone through, we also have a duty to 'Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves' (Proverbs 31).

The Psalmist says 'My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place.'

With abortions in the UK reaching 600 a day, it seems to me that the 'secret place', is one of the most dangerous places to be in modern day Britain.

As with my great ancestor, the battle took many years, even decades. But now, with the passage of time we look back in horror at how we devalued human life. I truly believe we will look back in years to come, repent and ask forgiveness for what we let happen to the unborn child.

There is something deeply depressing about a society in which abortion is so easy, yet alternatives such as adoption are made to appear so difficult.

Jose de Jesus Meza, a Knight Since 1981 Has Served Council 5300 for Many Events

Brother Lawrence L. Stigney was his sponsor back on October 12, 1981 and in rapid succession, Jose became a 2nd Degree on Nov. 9 and 3rd Degree on Nov. 15. On July 20, 1985, Jose became a 4th Degree member.

Jose explained, "The reason I decided to join the Knights of Columbus was that I always wanted to be active in helping others." He added, "And the best thing about being a member is you work together as a unit to reach a goal. I enjoy helping at all the picnics, breakfasts, dinners and other KC socials."

The native of Toluca, Mexico would like to see the Knights of Columbus attract more young men as new members by doing events that they like. Jose exclaimed, "Younger men would discover that the Knights of Columbus is a good organization, it helps you and the family and the community."

Jose has sponsored three men in becoming Knights. They were Jerome Becker, 1986, Luis Parfecto, 1989 and Robert Znovena, 2000.

KC events that stand out as cherished remembrances never to be forgotten include the former Friday night BINGO parties, the monthly Sunday breakfasts and the yearly Coke Booth during Fiesta Days.

Jose was a member of St. Raphael's Parish from 1960-1964 and then joined Our Lady of Sorrows in 1965 after marrying Maria Rebeca Franco on July 25, 1965 at Senor de la Ascension Church in Teuchitlan, Mexico by Rev. Jose de Jesus Garcia. They first met while working at Cottage Hospital in 1961.

One of nine children born to Francisco and Josefina Aceves Meza in Mexico, Jose's brothers include Pedro, Francisco, Adolfo and Gabriel and sisters are Socorro, Dolores, Carmen and Teresa.

Jose was born on January 2, 1939. 

Be Proud of Being Catholic

But the press is vindictive and trying to totally denigrate in every way the Catholic Church in this They have blamed the disease of pedophilia on the Catholic Church, which is as irresponsible as blaming adultery on the institution of marriage. Let me give you some figures that you as Catholics should know and remember. example, 12% of the 300 Protestant clergy surveyed admitted to sexual intercourse with a parishioner; 38% acknowledged other inappropriate sexual contact in a study by the United Methodist Church, 41.8 % of clergywomen reported unwanted sexual behavior; 17% of laywomen have been sexually harassed. Meanwhile, 1.7% of the Catholic clergy has been found guilty of pedophilia. 10% of the Protestant ministers have been found guilty of pedophilia. This is not a Catholic Problem. A study of American priests showed that most are happy in the priesthood and find it even better than they had expected, and that most, if given the choice, would choose to be priests again in face of all this obnoxious PR the church has been receiving.

The Catholic Church is bleeding from self-inflicted wounds. The agony that Catholics have felt and suffered is not necessarily the fault of the

Church. You have been hurt by a small number of wayward priests that have probably been totally weeded out by now. Walk with your shoulders high and you head higher. Be a proud member of the most important non-governmental agency in the United States. Then remember what Jeremiah said: "Stand by the roads, and look and ask for the ancient paths, where the good way is and walk in it, and find rest for your souls". Be proud to speak up for your faith with pride and reverence and learn what your Church does for all other religions. Be proud that you're a Catholic.

Move Forward in Hope, Urges Pontiff

Celebrates Bicentennial of 1st US Archdiocese

NEW YORK, APRIL 20, 2008 (Zenit.org).- Build a future of hope, Benedict XVI told the Church in the United States on the last day of his apostolic trip to the country.

Speaking to more than 58,000 people gathered in Yankee's Stadium for the last major event of his five-day visit, the Pope recalled the bicentennial this month of the creation of the Archdiocese of Baltimore.

"Today," he said, "we recall the bicentennial of a watershed in the history of the Church in the United States: its first great chapter of growth."

Cardinal Edward Egan, archbishop of New York, was on hand to greet Benedict XVI, and to thank him on behalf of the Church in the United States for the Pontiff's visit.

The cardinal recalled, "200 years ago this month, your wise and heroic predecessor of happy memory, Pope Pius VII, elevated the Diocese of Baltimore, the only diocese in the nation at the time, to the dignity of an archdiocese."

Along with the elevation of Baltimore to an archdiocese, Boston, New York, Philadelphia, and Bardstown, which is now Louisville, were all created as dioceses.

"Our celebration today is also a sign of the impressive growth which God has given to the Church in your country in the past two hundred years," Benedict XVI said. "From a small flock [...] the Church in America has been built up in fidelity to the twin commandment of love of God and love of neighbor.

"In this land of freedom and opportunity, the Church has united a widely diverse flock in the profession of the faith and, through her many educational, charitable and social works, has also contributed significantly to the growth of American society as a whole."

Unity

The Pontiff spoke of the "linguistic and cultural tensions" that posed a challenge for the first apostles, and said the success of the Early Church demonstrated "the power of the word of God, authoritatively proclaimed by the Apostles and received in faith, to create a unity which transcends the divisions arising from human limitations and weakness."

He continued: "Here we are reminded of a fundamental truth: That the Church's unity has no other basis than the Word of God, made flesh in Christ Jesus our Lord.

"All external signs of identity, all structures, associations and programs, valuable or even essential as they may be, ultimately exist only to support and foster the deeper unity which, in Christ, is God's indefectible gift to his Church."

"In these 200 years," the Pope continued, "the face of the Catholic community in your country has changed greatly. We think of the successive waves of immigrants whose traditions have so enriched the Church in America.

"We think of the strong faith which built up the network of churches, educational, healthcare and social institutions which have long been the hallmark of the Church in this land.

"We think also of those countless fathers and mothers who passed on the faith to their children, the steady ministry of the many priests who devoted their lives to the care of souls, and the incalculable contribution made by so many men and women religious, who not only taught generations of children how to read and write, but also inspired in them a lifelong desire to know God, to love him and to serve him."
