One evening, he came home quite intoxicated after indulging in a number of substances with a friend.

Needless to say his parents were hurt, but in this case there was much more. His older brother, less than a year earlier, chose this same path, a path that he continued for some time until it finally caught up to him in the form of a badge, a courtroom, and a cell. As I talked to him about his choices and those of his older brother, I talked a little about how lucky his older brother was. I clarified that by saying he could have easily ended up much worse, because as of now he still had a second chance.

We talked for sometime about decision making, and how important the right choices versus the wrong are at this point when he starts out on his own life path. After about an hour, he knew that he really blew it big-time, with his parents. He knew how mad his parents were at his brother, but he didn't understand that this was just a mask for how hurt they really were. Now, he was in just about the same situation. Having gone through CCD and Confirmation years earlier, we talked about God's eternal love towards his children and his willingness to forgive us for our sins. I then used that as a way to represent his parents, and how they feel towards him.

As we go through our lives we will make mistakes; as humans this is inevitable, but we are always loved by whom we are created. As we have learned from our Lord, love and forgiveness go hand in hand. Without love, there cannot be forgiveness.

'Crack was my friend,' ex-addict says

ATLANTA, Georgia (CNN) -- Crack-addicted Felicia Anderson was pregnant with her third child when an ultrasound changed the direction of her life.

After inpatient rehab, Felicia Anderson sought help from Mothers Making a Change to help beat her addiction.

"You could hear that baby's heartbeat strong and steady. Really, that's her personality today, a strong, vibrant little girl. And at that time, laying there, tears starting rolling down my face," Anderson, 44, recalled.

In that moment, Anderson vowed to stay off drugs, something she'd been unable to do in more than a decade addicted to crack cocaine, even when she was pregnant with her first two children.

Anderson didn't think she could do it alone, so, like almost 2 million Americans a year, she entered a treatment program. Anderson spent three weeks in residential treatment -- all she could afford -- but didn't think that was enough, so she enrolled in Mothers Making a Change, a year-long outpatient drug and alcohol program in Atlanta, Georgia.

Three times as many Americans choose outpatient treatment as residential treatment, or rehab. It costs less, is more likely to be covered by insurance and does not require participants to leave work or their families for a month or more.

The outpatient program Anderson chose, Mothers Making a Change, is designed especially for pregnant women and women with young children. Anderson was both. At the time, her oldest daughter, Sierra, was 5; her middle child, Anicia, was almost 2.

In addition to therapy and education, Mothers Making a Change provided transportation and offered free child care while Anderson was there. When she completed the program, Mothers Making a Change helped her find a job.

James Howard Bradbury, a tireless Knights of Columbus member since 2001, is a well-known helper at most KC and parish events. The native of Santa Barbara has been a St. Raphael parishioner since 1962. "Helping others is the best thing about being a Knight," emphasized Bradbury. He added, "Helping repair widows' homes is one KC event that stands out as a cherished remembrance never to be forgotten." "To be a part of a great Catholic men's organization" is his recommendation why other men should consider becoming a member of the Knights of Columbus.

Joining the Knights on June 11, 2001, Jim became a 2nd Degree on September 6 and a 3rd Degree on September 23, 2001. The 4th Degree took place on November 2, 2002. Proud sponsor was Paul Curzan. He has served as Warden for three years.

Describing his experiences as a KC member, Jim pointed out, "It has been very rewarding. I have made new friends that have the same ideals that I have as giving to the community, loving the church, and loving and serving Christ."

Bradbury would like to see the KC's work with the Youth Group more "because they are the next generation," stated Jim.

The reason he decided to become a KC member, Jim explained, "Was to give back to the church community for all the time I worked for UPS and had no time to give." Some of his goals as a KC member include helping the youth, the poor and the widows of the parish.

His parents, Howard and Myrtle were proud of their three children: Jean (deceased), Judy, 66 and James, the youngest, born on April 21, 1945. His father's birthplace was Santa Barbara and his mother hailed from Missouri. The Bradbury family (grandfather and great-grandfather) also were natives of Santa Barbara.

Jim graduated from Roosevelt Elementary School, San Marcos High School and San Diego City College earning an Air Frame Power Plant license.

Jim first met Diane Marie Stoyka while attending San Marcos in 1960. They were married on May 14, 1966 at St. Raphael Church by Rev. John G. Fitzgerald.

They are proud parents of five children and 9 3/4 grandchildren. They are: Mark 41, Laura 37, Lisa 31, Mindy 28 and Amy 26. Grandchildren include: Megan 13, Raymond 8, Oscar 5, Mason 3, Emily 3, Jonah 2, twins Georgia and Madelina 3 months; Josiah 1 month and Antonio Perez IV due in July.

Asked what is the best thing about being a St. Raphael parishioner, Jim attributed, "Our history with the parish. Diane since she was 12, my conversion in 1959, our wedding and our children's sacraments. It is a great community to be part of."

Jim's parish involvements include: serving on new building committees, cooking at parish functions and organizing a fundraiser for the Youth to go to see Pope Benedict XVI in Australia.

Rev. Msgr. Stephen Noel Downes is a special pastor who has been extra-special to the Bradbury family. "He was always among the people and a part of all parish activities," expressed Jim.

His wife Diane was born in Detroit, Michigan on August 12, 1946 and in 1957 her parents, Michael and Helen and brother Bob moved to Santa Barbara. Diane has helped for many years in the CCD program, led Brownie and Girl Scout troops and works for the county as a Special Education Instructional Assistant with special needs children.

Jim's community interests include: Assistant Boy Scout Master, Inspector for the voting poll at St. Mark's, past president of Meadowlark Road Assn., worked to rebuild our neighborhood after the Painted Cave Fire and volunteer at different schools doing maintenance work.

Jim served with the U.S. Navy from 1966 to 1970. While in Vietnam in 1968 he was a door gunner on a helicopter based on the only landbased attack helicopter squadron. He also resided in Kingsville, Texas while in the Navy and finished his tour of duty in San Diego where he started school at SDCC.

For 25-years Jim worked as a UPS driver. He reflected, "The keys to my success in my professional career were hard work, determination, a sense of humor and enjoying people."

Jim and Diane explained, "We have been married for 43-years. Our greatest enjoyment is watching our children, their spouses and our grandchildren in their growth and antics. We love to travel and be together and 80 percent of the time our children and their families follow and join us wherever we are."

They have driven many times across the country with and without the kids to most of the national parks and through about 45 states. Jim added, "Now that Diane is retiring in June we plan on visiting more states and cruising."

Among his many hobbies are: building, making furniture, flying remote planes, riding dirt bikes in the desert, fishing, camping and backpacking.

"What does it mean to be a Catholic?" This question, posed in just about every form of media recently, is a question worth examining.

For many of us born into Catholic families, it is a question that seldom came up. We simply accepted all the traditions and responsibilities being Catholic required, believed what we were taught, did what was expected and did not question.

In retrospect, looking over a lifetime of living within the Catholic Church, this is somewhat regrettable. How is it possible to embrace religious convictions without examining them, discussing them among family and friends, and finally coming to a point where they settle into your heart as a belief system?

Many parents today lament the fact that their adult children do not have a firm attachment to the Catholic Church in which they were raised. I wonder; I find that many young adults identify themselves as Catholic, though their practices differ from those of their childhood (even if the doctrine is the same). Being Catholic means different things to different people and certainly to different generations. Is it about following rules? How you pray? How you vote? How you treat others?

A few weeks ago I learned of the death of a man I had not seen in some time. Dennis was a good man, a Catholic from beginning to end, and an uncle by marriage. He was a priest for a number of years before he met my aunt, a former Immaculate Heart nun. Their story was not uncommon during the '60s and '70s: Each had reached the conclusion that the lives that had seemed so right many years before were somehow not leading them in the direction God was calling them.

It was the post-Vatican II era, a time of change and excitement within the Church and the world. There was an openness and ease between people and within the Church that was not present in prior years. As with any transition, it was also a confusing time. Many people were not prepared for the changes; they clung to the older, familiar ways and at times this caused conflict. Some found it difficult to distinguish God from the institutional human Church and saw the changes taking place as an affront to God, rather than a natural evolution that takes place within human organizations.

The marriage of my aunt and uncle, like so many others at the time who had moved from the priesthood or religious life to a secular life, caused varied reactions; not everyone agreed with or supported what was taking place. Over time, this changed, and families and friends were enhanced by their presence, their knowledge and skills gained from their years of vocational formation and practice.

Catholic beliefs are spelled out for us to hear and proclaim every Sunday as we recite the creed, a creed repeated around the world in many different languages, as minds and hearts determine how to live the beliefs they are professing. Ultimately, each of us stands alone before God. Barring blatant disregard for church teaching, what it means to be a Catholic is a personal question known only in the heart of anyone who claims membership in the Catholic Church.
