Bishop Urges Catholics to Return to Sacrament of Penance

WORCESTER, Mass. (CNS)—Bishop Robert J. McManus of Worcester urged Catholics in his diocese to take part in a pastoral initiative called "Come Home to God's Mercy" and to return to the sacrament of penance during Lent. In a pastoral letter he said he asked all priests in the diocese to preach on the sacrament of penance before and during Lent to help Catholics reacquaint themselves with the sacrament. Beginning Feb. 23, a priest will be available every Tuesday from 7 to 8:30 p.m. in every church in the diocese to hear confessions.

"My hope is that by making the sacrament of penance more available, more of our Catholic people will avail themselves of this spiritually healing and renewing sacrament," the bishop wrote. Citing a recent survey of U.S. Catholics, the bishop noted what he called an unsettling statistic—45 percent of Catholics who attend Mass weekly never receive the sacrament of penance. He said the reasons for this are varied, but "an explanation of this disconcerting pastoral situation has to include to a significant degree a loss of the sense of sin among contemporary Catholics."

He quoted St. John the Evangelist, who wrote: "If we say, 'We are without sin,' we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us." A central theme of Christ's ministry was the need for people to repent to be able to enter the kingdom of God, the bishop wrote.

Conversion, the continual turning away from sin and, under God's grace, turning back to God, is essential to the Christian life, Bishop McManus said in his pastoral.

John W. Moynihan Jr., Recalls First KC 5300 Oktoberfest Celebration

John William Moynihan Jr., became a Knights of Columbus member in April 1967. Brother John has many vivid and interesting recollections of the past which include: his U.S. Army service during World War II, KC events, past St. Raphael parish priests and happenings.

The 85-year old native of Blue Island (South Chicago) stated, "I believe the best thing about being a KC member is the involvement with dedicated Catholic men and their families. This has been especially important to me as I only knew a few people in the Santa Barbara area when I

moved here in 1967. In a short time I was able to introduce John Sullivan and Frank Sween to Council 5300 and they became long time KC members."

His favorite KC sponsored social occurred in 1970 with the initial Oktoberfest celebration which has become an annual event for nearly 40-years. Moynihan noted, "I suggested to Activities Chairman Max Keller that Council 5300 put on an Oktoberfest if we could get Joe and Ruth Duwell to participate. Durward Hill and I were selected as co-chairmen and were assisted by Max Keller, Joe Duwell, Bob Weidle, and Dal DieBold."

John continued, "Dal DieBold got permission to use the Bishop Diego High School gym, Weidle put on a German Liederhausen outfit of leather shorts with suspenders, a colorful shirt and alpine hat and appeared on the local TV station. Duwell imported a bunch of Oktoberfest posters from Europe and made up posters with a German man in costume holding a big stein, 'Beer is on der house.'"

On the afternoon of the event Moynihan borrowed Val Taylor's pickup truck and purchased about 10 kegs of beer. John added, "Ruth Duwell, my wife Camille, a number of other people including Ralph and Kathy Wengler prepared the Bratwurst, cold German potato salad, sauerkraut, etc. Don Fitch trained and led a group of singers as they sang a number of traditional Oktoberfest songs in German. Duwell led us all in singing the Schnitzelbank song in German. Folk dancers who dressed in Liederhausen with suspenders and German dresses danced a number of Folk dances and polkas."

Moynihan pointed out, "When I joined Council 5300, the members' average age was about 35. The members were extremely active playing softball, participating in a once-a-week bowling league and volleyball at council picnics. I believe that these and other sporting activities attract young families and get members better acquainted with each other."

"I joined the KC's as a great way to get acquainted with men and families who took the Catholic religion seriously," said Moynihan, a 4th Degree Knight since October 2, 1971. One of his goals was to learn more about what the KC's stood for and how it differed from organizations like the Holy Name Society, the Boy Scouts, Elks Lodge,

etc. "It turned out that Chuck Burke had attended Loyola University of LA when I did and he was one of the first people I met in Council 5300."

"Catholic men, especially those who are new to the Santa Barbara area, should join the Knights to become acquainted with other men and their families who take their Catholic faith seriously.

"They should also take advantage of the KC Life Insurance and Annuity Programs. These programs can be very important to a young family," expressed Moynihan.

Born on December 15, 1924 to John W. Moynihan, Sr., and Teresa Catherine Harrington, who hailed from Jamestown and Wellsville, New York respectively, John would grow up in Wellsville with a sister Mary Eileen and three first cousins, John, Betty and Margaret Dean who were about 3, 5 and 8 years older. Their mother had died and their father was unable to raise them. "We all treated ourselves as brothers and sisters and got along well as a family," boasted Moynihan.

John attended Immaculate Conception Grade School in Wellsville, St. Agnes School in Los Angeles and Wellsville High School graduating in June 1942. He then attended Glendale College in California from Sept. 1942 to March 1943. After his military service, John enrolled at Loyola University of Los Angeles from January 1946 to June 1950 and earned a BS Degree in Business.

John's served in the U.S. Army from late February 1943 until his discharge in December 1945. He served in two theatres of war: the North Pacific (Aleutian Islands) and the European Theatre.

John was drafted into the Army at Camp Roberts near Paso Robles. After basic training in July 1943, his infantry unit was shipped to Dutch Harbor, located in the Aleutian Islands. After the Japanese left the Aleutians, John was transferred to serve in the 207th Coast Artillery Regiment. In February 1944 he was transferred to Ft. Bliss, Texas to an Automatic Weapons Division. In late 1944 he was aboard the Queen Mary heading to England where John celebrated his 20th birthday on Dec. 15. In February 1945 his unit had landed onto the beach at LeHavre, France and headed to Venlo, Holland near the Rhine River. From Wesel his unit would travel several hundred miles into Germany where they stayed until May when the European War ended.

Soon after, John was transferred to Bavaria around Berchtesgaden, Hitler's Hideout.

After a short stay in Munich, two trips to Paris and a one week tour of Switzerland, Moynihan's European duty ended on October 22, 1945. He returned to the states on an American built Liberty Ship the week before Christmas. He proceeded to Fort McArthur in Los Angeles to receive his honorable discharge papers. John was jubilant when he walked in the door at his parents' home in Glendale one day after calling them from New York. He exclaimed, "What a homecoming...my mother, father, sister Mary, cousin Betty Dean and cousin John Dean (who had survived over a year in a German prison camp), and Lt. Commander Jim Dolan were all there."

John recalled how he met his wife, Camille: "Camille and I met on a "CAC," Catholic Alumni Club of Los Angeles weekend trip to Catalina Island with 100 other CAC members," stated Moynihan. We dated for six or seven months and were married on April 24, 1954 at St. Basil's Church in the Wilshire district of Los Angeles. Camille Martineau was born in St. Paul, Minnesota on November 19, 1924. She has a brother Jules now a resident of Quebec, and two sisters Claire and Madelein.

John and Camille have two angels in heaven who were born at Queen of Angels Hospital in Los Angeles but did not survive. John stated, "We have one adopted daughter Patricia Claire Moynihan who is an ERA, licensed to practice before the IRS. Patty is currently operating a tax and accounting practice in Santa Rosa, CA."

The Moynihans have been members of St. Raphael Parish since January 1967. "The best thing about being parishioners is having the opportunity to meet wonderful priests like Msgr. Stephen Noel Downes and Rev. Vaughn P. Winters. The other benefit of being a parishioner is also having the opportunity to get to know long time residents of Goleta, which include a number of well educated engineers, accountants and attorneys."

John has served as a member of the Parish Council just prior to the arrival of Pastor Henry A. Van Son, member of the Parish Finance Committee while Msgr. Downes was Pastor and running the hamburger and hot dog booth at the first St. Raphael

Fun-a-Rama organized by Dick Hopper.

Four priests who have been extra-special during their 43-years at St. Raphael's include:

* Rev. John McKenna and Rev. Henry Van Son for helping the parish and school recover from overaction to changes following the 2nd Vatican Council;

* Msgr. Downes for applying modern business practices and management to the parish. Father Steve took the approach that "it is the parishioners' money and they should have the most to say as to what is done with it.';

* Rev. Vaughn P. Winters for being such a good friend to us and to all his parishioners and developing into such a great priest in his first assignment to a parish.

As a KC member, John was in charge of the monthly breakfasts when Val Taylor was the Grand Knight. He served as Warden the year Dale Wenzinger was Grand Knight. He also was the treasurer for two years for the 4th Degree Junipero Serra Assembly and Scribe for two years also.

From 1950 through 1989 Moynihan worked as an internal auditor and Certified Public Accountant starting with the Flying Tiger Airline, the family business, Harrington Motel in Hollywood, for Samuelson & Co., Arthur Young and Co., Orvis and Douglas and Dart Transportation and Warehouse Co. From 1966 to retirement in 1989 his John W. Moynihan Certified Public Account firm helped small and medium size business proprietors, partnerships, corporate officers, non-profit organizations and individuals take advantage of modern accounting principles, cash management and tax planning according to their situations.

John's community involvements included membership with the Northside Optimist Club, California Society of Certified Public Accountants, Twin Lakes Golf Club and PC Users Group of Santa Barbara until it terminated recently. Camille is a member of the Ladies of Charity and has sorted clothes and helping out in their Thrift Store. She swims three times a week which helps to get rid of arthritis pains in her back and neck.

Their travels have taken them on a 15-day tour of Italy where they had the wonderful opportunity to attend a Latin Mass at St. Peter's Basilica and hear the choir sing the Pater Nostra. They have taken

numerous trips to the Hawaiian Islands.

"We need the powerful grace of God to assist us in living the Christian life in an authentic way. Indeed, it is impossible to live the Christian life without the

help of God's grace, and that grace is made available to us every time we receive the sacrament of penance," he wrote.

Bishop McManus said he has asked teachers in Catholic schools and religious education programs for children and adults "to give special attention to providing catechesis and instruction on this sacrament during the days and weeks ahead."

In addition, the *Catholic Free Press*, Worcester diocesan newspaper, will be printing articles "that will help our Catholic people come to a sound understanding of the importance of the sacrament of penance in their spiritual lives," the bishop said.

Bishop McManus said some curious and often mistaken notions about penance "have contributed in recent years to the decline of going to confession. ... In the aftermath of the Second Vatican Council the importance and necessity of receiving the sacrament of penance were sometimes minimized or, sad to say, even denied."

He wrote that priests rarely preached about the crucial role of the sacrament in living the Christian life. Some people believed that when the priest called upon the congregation at Mass to recall their sins before receiving Communion, that this "imparted sacramental absolution or the forgiveness of their sins," he said. Bishop McManus said he believes some Catholics have forgotten how to go to confession. Some have told him they don't know what to confess, or they have forgotten the act of contrition, or they are embarrassed.

A brochure titled "How to Go to Confession" was being provided to all parishes in the diocese with the bulletin inserts during Lent, he wrote.

"What is fundamental in 'making a good confession' is an appropriate examination of conscience," Bishop McManus wrote. "Before we actually enter the reconciliation room or confessional we should spend some time reflecting seriously on how we are living our daily lives in relation to the Ten Commandments, the beatitudes ... and the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

"Asking the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we should honestly look at how we are living out the commitment and responsibilities of the state of life to which we have been called," he said.
