Retirement Balancing Act

Frank Mackey passed on to His Eternal reward on Friday, April 30, 2010.

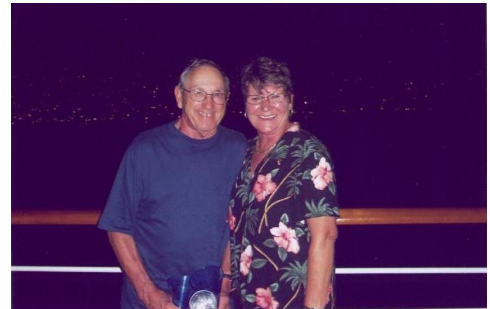

Joseph A. Lima, KC Member for Past 35- Years, Has Many Positive Recollections as a Knight

Joseph Alves Lima, a member of the Knights of Columbus, Council 5300 for 35-years, emphasized, "My special cherished remembrances at a KC event was taking part in the Track and Field events for the Annual Special Olympics held at UCSB. It was an unbelievable experience - never to be forgotten." He added, "For 10-years, seeing these excited students from ages 5 to 65 who came from Alpha School, Deveureux, St. Francis and the Santa Barbara Rec Department, and doing their best was a joy to witness."

Sponsored by Joseph R. Meitz in May 1975, Lima became one of Meitz's many loyal Knights who were hosting for a number of years the Special Olympics featuring up to 400 boys, girls, young men and women who would participate in all the field events including wheel chair races.

"One of my reasons for becoming a KC member was to meet men in my new parish that had the same beliefs as me," stated Lima. He added, "I also was looking for new friends and to become active in church and community." "To meet different Catholic men and become involved in Church and

community," are his recommendations why men should consider becoming a member of the Knights of Columbus.

The former Outside Guard expressed, "Being associated with men whose principles are Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism is the best thing about being a KC member." Over the years he has worked the Fun-a-Rama Booths, Sunday Night Bingo, Pepsi and Coke Booths during Fiesta, Bar Tender, Blood Bank, Cooking and having FUN, working wherever needed.

Born in Newport, Rhode Island to John and Mary Lima on April 30, 1926, Joe's brothers John and Albert reside in Newport and Bridgeport, Connecticut. His father came to America in 1920 from Arao, Portugal while his mother hailed from Middletown, R.I. His father worked as a carpenter and later for the Navy during World War II. Joe's education started in Newport where he graduated from John Clarke Grade School and from Rogers High School in 1944. He then attended Milwaukee School of Engineering and earned a degree as an Associate Electrical Tech.

In 1944 Lima enlisted in the U.S. Army Air Corps in Massachusetts. His training as a remote control turret gunner on a B-29 took him to Mississippi, Nevada, Colorado and his complete squadron all met in Alamogordo, New Mexico.

Lima began working for GM in 1950 in Milwaukee in the AC Spark Plug division. He was transferred from AC Electronics to Delco Electronics in Santa Barbara where he continued to work until his retirement in 1987. Regarding his long professional career, Lima exclaimed, "If I was a success it was because I worked hard and was a loyal employee and kept my skills current."

The native of Newport came to Goleta in 1972 with his wife Doris and five of their six children, Michael, James, Robert, Andrew and JoAnn. Son John remained as he was a student at the Univ. of Wisconsin, Milwaukee. Lima reflected, "The seven of us were packed in a 9-passenger Chevrolet station wagon, with no air-conditioning, but made the long trip safely." They became members of St. Raphael Parish.

Joe emphasized, "We have been thankful for being a member of a friendly, caring and faith community." He added, "Priests who have been

extra-special to me during my 38-years at St. Raphael include: Father Bruce Correio, Father Alberto Ledesma and Father Marco Ortiz." "I have learned more at my age about my faith and church through Father Correio's homilies and his Lenten Bible Study Groups," clarified Lima. He said, he'll always cherish Fathers Alberto and Marco for their youthful and sincere faith.

Joe had met Doris Mae Langlo at a friend's wedding in Milwaukee. They were married by Father Lugar at St. Elisabeth Church on June 25, 1950. Doris was born on January 20, 1929 in Milwaukee and her sister Shirley, brother Thomas and parents are deceased. On November 21, 1993 Doris died of Lymphoma. In Goleta, Doris's involvements in parish and community besides her motherly responsibilities, included St. Raphael Women's Sodality, CCD Classroom Assistant, Girl Scouts, KC Pepsi Booth, and KC Wrap Christmas Gifts.

Today there are eight grandchildren and one great-grandchild: Michael 34, Kathryn 29, Rebecca 15, Justin 14, Luke 7, Zoe 5, Lilly 3, Trevor 1 and Samuel, the great-grandchild. Lima's grown children include John (deceased), Michael 57 (Milwaukee), James 54 (Alaska), Robert 50, (Goleta), Andrew 46 (San Diego) and JoAnn (41 (Arizona).

Lima's community involvements have included Goleta Valley Days (1986-1989), 10 years with South Coast Special Olympics and Goleta Valley Man of the Year committee.

Travels have taken him to Germany, Austria, Denmark in 1967, Portugal 1996, Hawaii 2001, Italy 2002, Mexico 2005 and in 2004 a cruise from San Diego to Alaska with his whole family of 29 adults and children. It was extra-special as they all were able to see son Jim, who resides in Anchorage, Alaska, before everyone headed home in all directions.

Joe acknowledged, "Eleanor Paulazzo is my significant other, companion, friend for the past 12-years and my family considers her as one of the family. She was very active in St. Raphael's School when her children were going there. She worked in the Library, Learning Center, Office doing bookkeeping and Room Mother. Eleanor has been active in the St. Raphael Bowling League for 30-

years. She has been working elections for 25-years. Recently she has helped the KC's working the Lenten Fish Fries, monthly Breakfasts, Blood Bank and behind the Bar in the Parish Hall for various KC socials..

**Msgr. Henry Van Son's Funeral Mass
Held April 6 at Our Lady of Mount Carmel**

A Funeral Mass for Rev. Msgr. Henry Adrian Van Son, 86, who died on March 27 was held April

6 at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church in Montecito. The church was filled to capacity with 12 priests, the large number of the Van Son family, Montecito parishioners and St. Raphael parishioners. Msgr. Van Son was the pastor emeritus of Our Lady of Mount Carmel (1978-1990) and previously was pastor at St. Raphael Church in Goleta (1968-78).

Father Jack D. Stoeger (House of Prayer in LA) was the main celebrant who gave an inspiring homily, assisted by Rev. Msgr. Stephen N. Downes (Our Lady of Mt. Carmel) and Father John Love (St. Marks). The other priests helping were Msgr. Michael Jennett, S.T.D., (San Roque), Father Maurice O'Mahony (Emeritus, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel), Father Rafael Leon (Our Lady of Guadalupe), Msgr. Donal Mulchay (Our Lady of Assumption in Ventura), Father John Hughes (St. Mary Magdalene in Camarillo), Father Frank Hicks (St. Basil in LA), and three priests from Portland, Oregon who knew Msgr. Van Son in his retirement years there when he would be assisting them in their parishes. They were Msgr. Dennis O'Donovan, (St. Michael the Archangel Church), Father Richard Thompson (Holy Trinity Church) and Father James Mayo (St. Mary of the Valley Retirement Center).

Paul Coyne, Commander of the Knights of Columbus Junipero Serra Assembly and nine of his Color Corps members participated. They were Donald Aubrey, Rafael Cardenas, Juan Garcia, Jose Mesa, Ed Page, Tom Puerling, Walter Swiacki, Jack Turney and Carlos Valenzuela. Past Grand Knight Brian Klinge presented a new Chalice which was used at the Mass. Coyne stated, "We also plan to be at the Memorial Mass on May 5 with at least six Color Corps members taking part." Msgr. Van Son was a Knights of Columbus member since 1949, becoming a 4th Degree on February 20, 1971.

The parish singers and musician were inspiring throughout the Mass as they sang "How Great Thou Art," "Panis Angelicus," the "Lord's Prayer," "Agnus Dei," the Communion Hymn, "The Bread of Life," "We Will Rise Again," "Song of Farewell," and "I Know That My Redeemer Lives."

Beautiful, heart-warming eulogies were given by John Hydar (friend), Teri Salcedo (Ria Van Son's daughter), and Hans Kothuis (son of sister Annie Van Son Kothuis).

Pall Bearers were Lambert Van Son (Msgr's

brother), Carl Van Son (nephew, son of brother Joseph), Hans Kothuis (nephew, son of sister Annie), Bernie Monahan (son of Lucy Monahan), Phil Kirst (friend) and John Hydar (friend). The three Altar Servers were Joseph Salcedo (nephew), Hannah Morelos (great-niece) and Maya Morelos (great-niece).

Other Van Son family members who participated at the Mass were Ria and Theodora Van Son (sisters-in-law) in the Preparation of the Altar; Joe, Teri, Julianna and Elizabeth Salcedo in the Offertory Gifts Procession, Reading I by Hans Kothuis (nephew), Reading II by Yvonne Russell (niece); and the Prayer of the Faithful petitions led by Tony Van Son, Henry Van Son and Mark Van Son (nephews). Msgr. Downes proclaimed the Gospel, John 6:41-58.

Burial took place immediately after at Calvary Cemetery in Santa Barbara in the new northern part of the cemetery. A hearty reception followed at St. Raphael Parish Hall with ladies of St. Raphael and the Knights of Columbus taking care of everything.

In the special 8-page pamphlet given to everyone before the Mass, the cover had a smiling picture of Msgr. Van Son and noted, "Order of Christian Funerals - Eucharistic Liturgy Celebrated for the Repose of the Soul of Reverend Monsignor Henry A. Van Son - February 18, 1924 - March 27, 2010. On the back-page was an excerpt from Just Between You and Me in a 1974 SPIRIT newspaper column written by Msgr. Van Son. It read: "...but I BELIEVE, and despite my fears, I know that I must communicate God's word to you. For must I not say something to you about God, about eternal life, about the majesty of grace in your sanctified being? Must I not speak to you of sin, the judgment and mercy of God?...All I can do is travel with you into the light and presence of God our Father, who loves us, forgives us and sends Himself in Jesus Christ in the grace of the Holy Spirit. So you see, you must carry me as I must carry you. And I can only beg of you: pray for me. Have patience with me. Sustain me. Accept God's Word and His holy mysteries from me. And lastly, let us grow in love..." Love Ya, Father Henry A. Van Son.

A few excerpts from the obituary appearing in the Santa Barbara News-Press and The Tidings:

* In anticipation of the light of the Risen Christ, on the 27th of March, 2010, at 3:15 p.m., a Saturday,

with the first vespers of Holy Week approaching, the Rev. Msgr. Henry A Van Son, migrated, in the presence of his beloved family, from this world to the Father. He was a priest in the Roman Catholic Church for more than 60-years. His memory remains in the hearts of many Christian Faithful, religious and lay.

* Born in Eindhoven, Holland, on the 18th of February 1924, of Josephus Van Son and Petronella Roos, their third of ten children. At the age of 12, in 1936 he entered the Seminary where life was spartan, but where he was very happy. When the war broke out in May 1940 conditions became even harsher and he suffered various serious illnesses, receiving at one time the last rites. However, God had more in store for him. He recovered and was invited by a priest at the American College in Louvain, Belgium to apply for the priesthood in a gentler climate. He was admitted in 1948 to St. John's Seminary in Camarillo. He was ordained to the Priesthood for the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Los Angeles on the 7th of May 1949 through the imposition of the hands by the late Cardinal James McIntyre.

* He sustained the Church through many pastoral offices: at St. Gertrude Church in Bell Gardens, as Associate Pastor and administrator at Holy Angels in Arcadia, St. Elizabeth Church in Altadena, Associate Pastor at Our Lady of Peace in Sepulveda, Chaplain at the Ventura School for Girls in Camarillo, Chaplain at the Los Angeles County Hospital, St. Mary Star of the Sea Church in Port Hueneme, and in 1968 was appointed the 12th pastor of St. Raphael in Goleta, serving until 1978, and then Pastor of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, serving until his retirement in 1990.

* Parishioners at St. Raphael recall his prayerfulness, keen sense of hospitality, superb administrative skills and his excellent writing skills featured in the church newspaper, The Spirit, where he always ended his column with his trademark phrase, "Love Ya, Father Henry A. Van. Son."

* He exercised his ministry with confidence and good humor, under the motto: "Those who try to make their life secure, will lose it, but those who lose it will keep it." (Luke 17:33). Priests, religious and laity held a great love and respect for him.. Msgr. Van Son is leaving behind a wonderful evidence of the art of living and of a paternal love

for all.

* He was preceded in death by his parents Josephus and Petronella Van Son, his sisters Francine Van de Ven and Annie Kothuis; his brothers Adrian, Kees, Gerard and William Van Son.

He is survived by his brothers Joseph (Thea), Lambert (Theodora) and Anthony (Tina); sister-in-law Ria Van Son, brother-in-law Jan Kothuis and 33 nieces and nephews.

* For the last eight months of his life he resided at Ria Van Son's home in Goleta where he was cared for by his family.

* The family would like to thank Santa Barbara Visiting Nurses and Hospice Care for their gentle and loving care.

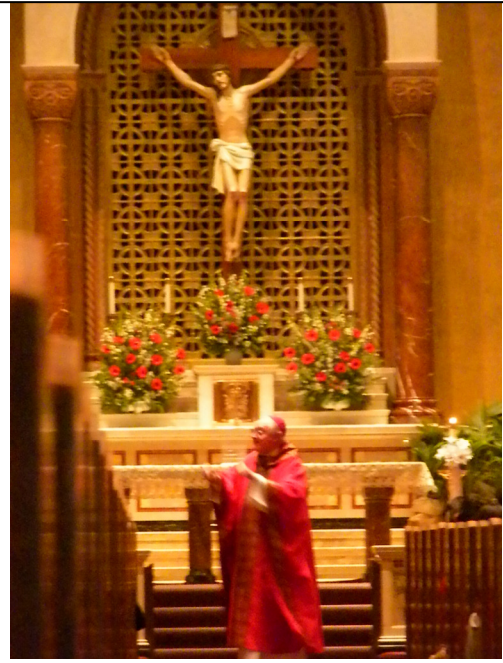

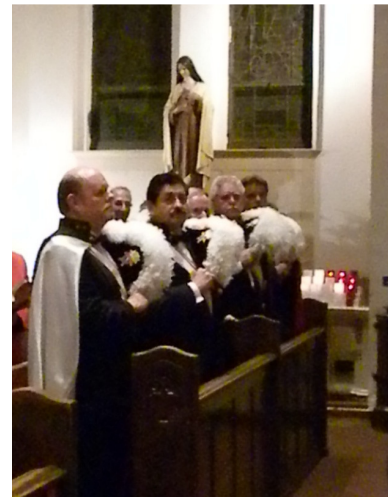
