

Two Special Eagle Scout Projects By Thomas Schiferl, Andrew Leicht Helping St. Raphael Parish, Rectory

To help pay for the costs of two special Eagle Scout Projects benefitting St. Raphael Parish, Thomas Schiferl and Andrew Leicht, who are currently doing the work, are selling tickets for a grand prize of one week in a Tahoe House. Only 500 tickets will be sold. The tax-deductible tickets are \$25 each or five for \$100.00. Checks are payable to St. Raphael Church. They will be sold after Masses and also Thomas (964-6013) and Andrew (681-0969) will take telephone orders. The raffle will take place on or around November 27 at the Boy Scout Christmas tree lot or when all tickets are sold.

A woman in the parish offered her 3-bedroom fully furnished house in South Lake Tahoe (Calif. side) to benefit St. Raphael. It is two blocks from Heavenly Ski Resort.

Thomas, born in Goleta, celebrated his 17th birthday on June 10. He is the son of Glenn and Lori (Vitalari) Schiferl. He attended St. Raphael School from pre-school through 8th grade and now attends Dos Pueblos High School.

Thomas Schiferl's Special Project

Schiferl originally came up with the project idea in 2008 and expects to be completed in December 2010. He installed Security Cameras in the Church and the front door of the Rectory to allow the people who work the front desk to know who they will be seeing on the other side of the door. Approximate cost for all parts is \$4,000. He is being helped by his father Glenn, Scoutmaster, J-Comm, Oliver Javier and Nonillon Moratilla. Thomas joined the Scouts in 1999 with Cub Scout Pack 105. The senior at Dos Pueblos stated, "One of the reasons I became a Boy Scout was the fun and exciting outdoor activities." He recommends other boys and girls in the parish to become scouts because "You learn leadership and many valuable life experiences." "The one Boy Scout Program that stands out a cherished remembrance never to be forgotten is Camp Chawanakee," specified Schiferl. He has attended this camp for seven years in a row. He added, "On my first campout, it rained so hard that the parking lot flooded."

An Altar Server from 5th grade to 12th grade, Thomas envisions, "The Boy Scouts undertaking ideas to move to the 21st century and use modern equipment and forms of teaching." Another special travel destination as a Scout is going to Mojave to launch rockets. When his project is completed a district board of review will determine his Eagle Scout ranking. After this recognition his next steps would be Eagle Palms (Bronze, Gold, and Silver).

Proud parents, Glenn and Lori, were married in St. Raphael Church on June 3, 1989 by Rev. Frank Berna. Glenn works in the UCSB Physics Department and Lori works at St. Raphael School. A daughter, Susan, 19, attends Marist College in New York and is currently in Florence, Italy majoring in Digital Media. Thomas plans to major in Broadcast Production next fall. He has been visiting different possible universities.

Thomas' special interest hobbies include computers, producing DPNews which can be seen nightly on Channel 21 at 6 or 6:30 p.m. He is active with the Parish Youth Ministry and was a major help at this year's Parish Festival.

Andrew Leicht's Special Projects

Andrew's undertaking to improve St. Raphael's security involves installing an electric strike lock on the Rectory door and also a two-way intercom between Receptionist Maria Romero's desk and the front door. Andrew, who was born on April 6, 1993 in Santa Barbara, has been an active Altar Server at St. Raphael's Parish. Since his friends were scout members he joined Cub Scout Pack 105 in 2000. He stated, "I became a Scout because I wanted to make Eagle." Andrew explained that, "The highlights of scouting are taking camping trips and the camaraderie."

His goal is to finish his two special projects

in December so he can earn an Eagle Palm for three months of Troop participation.

Andrew exclaimed, "I recommend other boys and girls become Scouts as Scouting is about learning life skills. It also gives Scouts something to strive for and achieve." The highlights of his experiences with the Scouts include attending Camp Chawanakee, partaking in rocket launches in Mojave and going on all the outings.

The senior at Bishop Garcia Diego High School tentatively plans to attend the University of Notre Dame or a university in California. Andrew enjoys playing soccer for the Cardinals.

His parents, Edward and Jacqui (Grainger), were married on September 16, 1989 by Father John Higgins in St. Raphael Church. (Grand Knight's Report, Continued from Page 1) The noise slowly got louder and louder, and the forest and its creatures slowly got quieter and disappeared. On the way back to camp, we discussed all that we had seen and heard and how nature lives in harmony, and how different that was versus being in camp. During some free time shortly after that, I sat and reflected to myself, isn't this how we treat our relationship with Our Lord sometimes?

The next day on the way home, my son wanted to see the Cold Springs Bridge. So instead of driving over the bridge, we decided to drive under the bridge. As we stopped off to the side of the road directly under bridge, my son noticed all the crosses and memorials. He was saddened by the sight of this, so we talked about it. On the surface, the number of memorials signified how many people had jumped to their death, feeling as though their life meant nothing, and wasn't worth living. But on a deeper level, the memorials also signified that these people were still loved by their parents, siblings and friends. As an example, we talked about how parents scold or punish their children for doing wrong. Just because children are punished or scolded for doing wrong doesn't mean that their parents don't love them. To prove that point, we looked over all the memorial markers for each person there and what they said about him or her. Each of these markers was saying how much the person was missed by their parents, siblings or friends. This theme of estrangement and unconditional love is identical to our relationship with our Lord Jesus in our spiritual lives.

The lessons I learned over the weekend was nothing new, but others are so easily trampled by life's "busy-ness".

God is always there, ready to love us and guide us. Life can put so much in front of us that it can become difficult to "see the forest through the trees". As we approach the Christmas Holiday season, our schedules will fill up and get busy, as is always the case. As Jesus reminds us again and again how much we matter and how much he loves us, take some time and let someone else who really needs it, know how much they matter and that you do care.
