

Raising Awareness About Life Insurance

Each September since 2003 has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month. Monday, September 19, 6:00 p.m. St. Raphael Church


A "Blue Mass" will be held to honor our police, firefighters and military service people. Dinner will be served afterwards in the parish hall.


Dinner tickets are \$15 and can be purchased at the parish office or by contacting Bill Fuhrer at **683-4236.**

KELLER'S KINDNESS RECALLED...

This is in response to the article about the L.A. County Sheriff's Department paying tribute to Torrance Police Department's Officer Thomas Keller who was killed while performing his duty ("Running for the fallen," Saturday).

I can't measure up to the fine people who have praised Officer Keller's fine character but I thought this small incident would also speak to Keller's outstanding and thoughtful character.

The year 1986 will indeed live in infamy for my family on so many levels. It was year that my family lived in turmoil due to problems with a wayward child. At a loss of what to do because nothing seemed to be working with this child I called the Torrance police and just threw my arms in the air and pled for help.

I was amazed not just that they really showed up but there were many and they were truly concerned and made every effort to help even though this was out of line with normal police work. Among the officers who responded to our plea for help was Officer Keller. He was attentive and made every effort to understand.

There would be other occasions in 1986 when we would have contact with the Torrance police in reference to the wayward child. Sometimes other officers would respond and listen and offer solutions in a professional and caring manner and on occasion it would be Officer Keller, so we got to know him a little.

To emphasize Officer Keller's caring nature, one day shortly before that sad day I was sitting deep in thought about our kid when I heard a knock at my door and there stood Officer Keller. We just looked at each other, both at loss for words. I hadn't called him, but there he was and he finally said that he had been thinking about me and was wondering how things were.

We talked for a while as I filled him in on how things were going, and he said he would stay in touch and he left. Well, he couldn't stay in touch because two days later he was shot and killed.

Officer Keller's kindness at a truly rough time for our family will never be forgotten. This old Marine knows a good man when he sees one. His kind are few and far between and will be greatly missed.

Tribute to Thomas Joseph Keller

On April 17, 1986 Thomas Joseph Keller, a Torrance Police Officer, was killed in the line of duty, three months before his planned wedding.

He was born April 29, 1960 on Long Island, New York. In 1962 Tom and his family moved to Dana Point and in 1970 to Santa Barbara. He attended Dos Pueblos High School and did well scholastically. He was an active boy, involved in Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, little league baseball, YFL football, YMCA swim team, as well as the Dos Pueblos High School varsity swim team.

After graduating high school he joined the Marine Corps. He ended his four years of service as sergeant achieving the goal he had set for himself, and was awarded three medals of commendation during his tour of duty. After his discharge, in 1982 Tom applied to and was accepted by the Torrance Police Department. In was his vocation.

On April 17, 1986 while Tom was on patrol, a 911 call came in from a sporting goods store describing a deranged man with a gun. It was the end of his shift, he could have gone home, but that wasn't Tom. He was the first officer on the scene, arriving within minutes, taking cover behind a car directly in front of the store. The store keeper and customers fled out the back. The deranged man sort ammunition for a hand gun he had picked up, to be used to kill his boss who had fired him the previous day. While roaming the store he found an unsecured MI Carbine rifle with a fully loaded extended clip on the rifle rack - the weapon he used to kill Tom. Tom's fellow officers The Paramedics close by pulled him to safety. responded immediately, finding Tom cradled in the arms of his close friend and fellow officer. There was nothing the paramedics could do.

A modest section of land was set aside by the downtown Torrance business community near where Tom was killed. The small lot was converted into a public park and was dedicated as the "THOMAS KELLER MEMORIAL PARK." The local business people truly understood the significance of Tom's sacrifice — that had this deranged man with the weapon he had found, been able to escape into the community, not only would their lives have been at risk but many others as well.

Recalling Father Henry Van Son's reference to Tom, "No Greater Love Hath Man Then He Lay Down His Life For His Neighbor." - mk





Over 100 Persons Attend Noon Mass at Stow Park; Father Tomas Elis, Former Council 5300 Chaplain Returns for 5th Consecutive Year as Celebrant

Father Tomas A. Elis, former Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus Council 5300 and former Pastor of St. Mark's Parish in Isla Vista, celebrated an outdoor noon Mass with over 100 parishioners from St. Raphael and St. Mark's enjoying the Mass and meal under the majestic redwood trees at Stow Park

Father Tomas came under difficult health conditions for his fifth consecutive year for this annual Sociable Seniors picnic, held this year on Wednesday, August 17. Deacon Randy Saake of Holy Cross Parish assisted him.

Father Elis stated, "I certainly enjoy being part of your Mass celebration." In a beautifully written note to coordinator of the picnic, Bea Scheel, Father said, "As you read out all your other activities past and those coming up, I am thankful for all your work of keeping the members alive, in good spirits and making choices."

The Sociable Seniors' Book of Remembrance was placed on the altar by Fr. Elis. Included are 147 deceased members, many past KC members. This was established on December 5, 1990 when the group was organized in the parish.

Father informed everyone that on Easter Sunday he suffered a serious medical setback caused by a staph infection in his head and neck. Surgery took place to straighten his head and neck by having screws secured into the first seven vertebrae of his spine. He didn't think he would live and remarked, "I went to the heavenly gates but did not pass yet, so I am back." Full recovery he prays will be within at least one year. He recently celebrated his 68th birthday and his 41-years as a priest.

Father gave a very heart-warming and impressive homily. He told the gathering, 'We need to be thankful we are up and about." He added, "We need to pray for our family, relatives and friends, whether they are good or bad, and to be more patient with each other."

Father currently is the Senior Priest at St. Mel's

Church in Woodland Hills.




