Update your Beneficiaries

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it could very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, that should be updated to reflect your spouse or your children as beneficiaries.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, as alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the

anniversary date of your policy – the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and



they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.

I look forward to meeting with each of you to discuss your family's needs.

SK Brian Klinge Has Been Presenter Of Golden Chalice for Over Seven Years

Sir Knight Brian Klinge has been making the Golden Chalice presentations for over seven years for deceased Brother Knights, Bishops, Monsignors and Priests. Klinge stated, "It is my honor to serve our Order in this unique capacity." He began this 'journey' when Don Aubrey resigned after doing a fine job for several years.

The presentation is made in full Fourth Degree tuxedo dress, as it is a formal and solemn occasion. To date Klinge has done 16 presentations and presented Chalices, Wheelchairs and Pyxs, depending upon the heirs' wishes.

The Junipero Serra Assembly has sent Chalices to Cuba, Mexico and Uganda. Klinge noted, "We are searching for new, additional places to send our Chalices and remembrances."

On the cup of the Chalice the name of our deceased brother is engraved. It is used for the first time at the deceased's Funeral Mass. The Chalice is presented to newly ordained priests to be used daily in the Eucharist, thereby remembering our brother. Every member of the Fourth Degree is entitled to such a presentation, if they choose.

Under the able stewardship of our Assembly Comptroller, SK Paul Coyne, we have money set aside and invested to afford to do this. Klinge added, "Although the need for Chalices is great, we are in no hurry to meet the demand."

Valdez Anthony Taylor peacefully passed away surrounded by his family on Thursday, Sept. 22, 2011 in Santa Barbara, CA. His gentle manner and contagious laugh will be missed by all who knew him.

Val was born on June 12, 1924 in New Orleans, La., the third of ten children. He married Lorine "Sis" Cousins in 1950 and soon moved to California. They settled in Santa Barbara in 1960, where he became a contractor and businessman and owned Val's Painting and Dry Wall.

Val was as active member of the Knights of Columbus, Council 5300. He joined the Knights in 1955. He was a Charter member and served as Grand Knight 1968-69. 




