
Brother Knights:



Happy 65th Wedding Anniversary Don & Lucille Aubrey

Lucille and Don Aubrey will celebrate 65-years of marriage on December 28, 2011. They were married in St. Francis Church in Bakersfield, California by Rev. William MacLaughlin, after having been high school sweethearts. Don was born on January 14, 1928. Don was a brand new 18-year old second lieutenant in the Army Corps of Engineers and Lucille was a bookkeeper at a hardware store (making more money than her new husband). Thirty-three days later Don shipped to Japan and Lucille joined him one year and seven days later.

Their first child, Dennis, was born there. They returned to the U.S. in 1949 to an assignment in Fort Sill, Oklahoma, where their second child, David, was born. In 1952, Don, by this time a first lieutenant, was transferred to Orleans, France and Lucille joined him with their two children four months later.

In 1955 they were transferred to Fort Ord, California, where their third and fourth children, Stephen and Ann, were born, in 1955 and 1957. Don, now a captain, was shipped to Korea in February 1957. Upon his return, Don and the family went to Fort Bragg, North Carolina in 1958. A second tour in France came in 1961 where they lived in Chauvigny, near Poitiers, later in Dange, near Chatellaroux and finally in Etain near Verdun. It was in Etain that their fifth child, John, was born. During this period, Don was promoted to Major.

During this time, Lucille, who was the only member of her family to leave Bakersfield, was raising their children, serving as a Pink Lady at hospitals, President of the Officers' Wives Clubs, Den Mother and on many committees. Lucille has traveled to France with two-year-old and three-year-old sons, on a train from Bakersfield to New York City, flying to Frankfurt-Main airport in Germany, taking a train from Frankfurt to Paris, where she said that if Don wasn't there to meet her she was getting on a plane back to the U.S. He made it. She had been delayed one day as there was no compartment on the train from Frankfurt for her and the boys to travel that night. The next night, she and the children were 'bumped' by a full Colonel's wife traveling by herself so Lucille and the sons slept sitting up in coach. This was the first of several challenges that Lucille faced and overcame in Don's 25-year career in the Army.

The family returned to the U.S. in 1965 to California, where Don was assigned as Advisor to the Engineer Battalion of California's 40th Armored Division. This assignment didn't last long. In 1966 he was transferred to Vietnam for 13-months. Don received his Lt. Colonel leaves at Travis Air Force Base just before boarding his plane to Vietnam. Lucille met him in Hawaii on his R&R

for a week, about the middle of his assignment.

When Don returned from Vietnam the family moved to Fort Carson, Colorado. Two years later, a General with whom Don had served on three occasions, requested he be reassigned to Frankfurt, Germany, as District Engineer of Land Hessen. In 1970 the Department of Defense was


implementing a plan for an all-volunteer Army. While stationed in Germany, he had seen the results of such a program in France, Germany and the Netherlands. The slovenly, undisciplined and doubtlessly, poorly-trained military in these armies, decided Don to retire. His second reason was that he wanted to return to school and get his college degree.

The Aubreys have lived in or visited 49 countries during their 65-years of marriage. These include: Japan, France, Germany, Netherlands, Belgium, Romania, Hungary, Greece and Greek Islands, Canada, England, Wales, Scotland, Portugal, Sweden, Finland, Russia, Denmark, Estonia, Andorra, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Monaco, Panama, Puerto Rico, Israel, Spain, South Africa, Kenya, Namibia, China, Berlin/East Berlin, Czech Republic, Poland, Austria, Italy, Egypt, Jordan, Yemen, India, Thailand, Malaysia, Singapore, Mexico, New Zealand, Costa Rica, Majorca, Turkey, Iceland and Switzerland.

On November 1, 1970, he returned to civilian life. The family bought their home in Santa Barbara and Lucille supplemented Don's retirement pay and G.I. Bill by taking a refresher course at the local business college and subsequently working at UCSB as the Office Administrator for the French and Italian Department, where she guide the department for 20-years. Upon completing his college work, earning an Bachelors and Masters in Mechanical Engineering, Don worked for Able Engineering for a year, for Raytheon for two years and then for Delco Electronics for 14-years. In 1970 Don leaped at the opportunity to join their sons in their oceanographic research business on Cape Cod, Massachusetts, as their business manager, planning for Lucille and him to be on the Cape for two or three years. They returned to Santa Barbara five years later in 1995, where they kept their home and rented it to a church friend during their absence.

Active in the church before going to the Cape, Don and Lucille immediately got back into active work in the church serving as Lector, CCD teacher, Eucharistic Minister. Don became a member of the Knights of Columbus in 1965, was Grand Knight in 1983-84 and Faithful Navigator of the 4th Degree. Lucille was Women's Auxiliary President in 1985-86 and is a Eucharistic Minister. She also bowled with the St. Raphael Women's Bowling League. They have been members of St. Raphael Church for 41-years.

They are proud grandparents of 11 children: Jill, Shelley, Andrew, Nick, Montana, Julie, Chance, Aubrey, Scott, Yasmenn and David Alexander. The nine greatgrand-children are Kimberley, Ben, Ariana, Alyson, Austin, Kane, Milo, Whitney and Adalyn.

In these uncertain times that we live in, we must be thankful for all the blessings that we have: family, fellowship with our brother Knights and, most importantly, the gift of life that God has given to us. Despite all the turmoil that we experience in our lives, the gift of life that God gives to us expresses God's love for us. In order to express God's love to others, we should pray and also help others who are in need. This can be done either by "clean" charity (donating money) or "dirty" charity (by actually participating in helping others). Both are necessary, but the latter engages the volunteer to experience how others less fortunate than us need our help. By actually help others in need directly, we as Knights practice one of the principles of our principles: Charity.

One of the ways you can demonstrate this principle is to set aside some time to participate in helping others. This past month just a few days before Thanksgiving, the Knights helped St. Mark's University Parish in Isla Vista with serving the homeless. Brothers Bill Calvo, John Peyton, Jim Bradbury, Shane Soliz and Tom Bauer were on hand to help Fr. John Love to help with this event. There was a similar event at my home parish, Our Lady of Sorrows, during Thanksgiving at Brewer Center. This event was also for the homeless and for others who do not have a family to share Thanksgiving with. I would encourage my Brother Knights to find opportunities in the month of December to help others and not be caught in the commercialization of Christmas that occurs annually. The distribution of candies for widows is one such opportunity. Please see Brother Joe Darga if you want to help.

I am proud to report that the Council passed our Council Budget and approved helping Sarah Arnoult's (PGK and FS Chris Arnoult) mission with Intervarsity, a non-denominational Christian organization. I also presented Fr. Bruce Correio a check of \$1000 dollars to St. Raphael's Church. This \$1000 donation was part of the Ralph Modugno resolution that was passed recently by our Council.

We also had a presentation at our business meeting by Monika Rodman Montanaro who is the Italian coordinator of Rachael's Vineyard Ministries, an organization which helps promote the virtues of family in Italy and helps minister to people who tragically chose abortion over life through counseling. 
