

Sam peacefully passed away on Sunday, December 18 in Santa Barbara, CA. He was born on November 28, 1930 in Buffalo, New York to Charles and Mary Alfano, one of five children.

Sam is survived by his wife, Lee C. (Porrini) who he married on June 21, 1958 at St. Luke's Church in Temple City, CA by Rev. Hugh Clear. Survivors also are: sisters Connie, Mary, Jeanne (Nate Mahn) and his children: Nancy (Brad Banks), Mark (Kimberly) and Victoria (Mark Blethen).

He leaves seven grandchildren: Tiana Hayes, Kristina Vercellono, Steven Hayes, Robert Blethen, Mary Margaret Blethen, Matthew Blethen and Isabella Alfano and seven great-grandchildren: Jaiyden Chaidez, Malachy Hayes, Ethan Vercellono, Elijah Vercellono, Emberlyn Vercellono, Elizabeth Vercellono, Eden Vercellono and numerous nieces and nephews.

Sam graduated from Utah State Univ. in 1954. He served in the U.S. Army from 1954 to 1956 at Ft. Ord, Ca., Ft. Belvoir, Virginia, Ft. Sheridan, Il. and Kaiserlautern, Germany.

Sam began his rewarding 32-year career with the U.S. Forest Service at the Angeles National Forest in Pasenda, followed by Sequoia National Forest in Bakersfield, San Bernardino as District Ranger and Los Padres National Forest in Santa Barbara as Outdoor Recreation Management Officer. Sam was a member of Society of American Foresters, Toastmasters Club #5, Mission Club (Founder), Los Compadres Retirees, Goleta Valley Beautiful, and

Boy Scout Mission Chapter. Sam was a devoted member of St. Raphael's Church for the past 47-years involved in numerous positive contributions (Parish Council, Lector, Eucharistic Minister and Centennial Anniversary events in 1996).

Sam joined the Knights on October 9, 1995 with Bro. Jim Provenza his sponsor. He quickly became a 2nd Degree on March 11, 1996, a 3rd Degree on June 23, 1996 and 4th Degree on Feb. 8, 1997. "The best thing about being a KC member is the service to our Church, fellow Knights and our Community," specified Sam. He was a driving force as the successful Membership Committee Chairman for many years.

In 1999 Sam was chosen as the Goleta Man of the Year.

A Funeral Mass was celebrated on Thursday, December 22 at 10 a.m. at St. Raphael's Church.

A lunch reception for his many friends took place in the Parish Hall immediately following the Mass for his many friends who filled the Church

Pro-Life UPDATES: How Misssouri Knights are Saving Lives

The Missouri Knights of Columbus are making progress with their statewide "Meet Life" campaign, which is generating funds to purchase ultrasound machines for pregnancy resource centers. Studies show that 95 percent of women who view an ultrasound image and hear the heartbeat of their baby abandon plans for an abortion, said Louis Holtmann, committeeman for the campaign for the state council.

The Knights have raised funds for and placed four ultrasound machines since July in House Springs, Waynesville, Warresburg and Clinton, Mo. The council is on pace to place machines at Thrive in St. Louis, a group of pregnancy resource centers in St. Louis City, North County, St. Charles County and a

mobile unit and centers in Kansas City and Mountain Grove during the first quarter of 2012, Holtmann said.

The "Meet Life" campaign came out of the state convention in May. Holtmann said the state deputy, John Applebaum put a challenge out to the membership to cut abortions in the state by 50 percent. He challenged each Knight to donate \$50 over five years and the councils to raise funds to place ultrasound machines in every pregnancy center in the state. He praised a local project at Council 9981 at Incarnate Word Parish in Chesterfield a "Baby Bottle" campaign to raise funding to help Thrive St. Louis and efforts at other local councils.

Holtmann said that the ultrasound machines give a full picture of the baby as early as six weeks. The machines help introduce the mother to her baby as she

sees the fingers and toes and hears the heartbeat. Without the machines, centers would have to ask women to go elsewhere to view the image.

The Knights of Columbus have been ardent supporters of life issues for many years, donating to the Vitae Foundation, which promotes a culture of life through media efforts, and other organizations such as

through media efforts, and other organizations such as Birthright and Our Lady's Inn.

#### Knights of Columbus Council 5300 to support Rachel's Vineyard Italy

At the December 13, 2011 Council Business meeting, a resolution was passed to support Rachel's Vineyard Italy under the direction of Ms. Monika Rodman Montanaro. The Council has pledged to fund Rachel's Vineyard Italy in the amount of \$1000.00 per year for three years beginning 2012 through 2014. Rachel's Vineyard is a prolife, post-abortion ministry seeking to bring healing and return to the Church and to Christ, women and men who have had abortion enter their lives.

Ms. Rodman Montanaro, from a St. Raphael parish family, was involved with a Rachel's Vineyard chapter in Oakland for over ten years before moving to Italy with her husband Domencio Montanaro in 2007. Together Monika and Domencio have started the only Rachel's Vineyard chapter in Italy. It has been in operation for four years.

Ms. Rodman Montanaro, spoke to the Council at the November 2011 business meeting regarding Rachel's Vineyard ministry, the needs of the organization and value of this ministry in Italy. She told the Council that although Italy is a nominally Catholic nation and Rome the seat of The Church, that majority of its citizens are non-practicing Catholics. Rachel's Vineyard fulfills the special need in Italy of providing a venue for persons seeking healing from abortion to re-connect with Christ and re-enter into active participation in life of the Church.

Knights of Columbus Council 5300 believes that supporting Rachel's Vineyard Italy is a unique opportunity to actively demonstrate the Knights pro-life commitment and at the same time be part of an international mission effort. Ms. Rodman Montanaro will be giving the Council annual updates on Rachel's Vineyard Italy mission. 


