The saints all passed through many temptations and trials to profit by them, while those who could not resist became reprobate and fell away. There



\$1 Million Mausoleum Renovation at Old Mission Santa Barbara

In November of 2011, Old Mission Santa Barbara completed an extensive renovation and restoration of its Historic Mausoleum. The project began as a relatively simply roof repair, but it quickly turned into a more than \$1 million project. Shortly after repairs had commenced, it became readily apparent that the building required more work than was originally assessed.

With the help of a handful of dedicated Mission associates, Father Richard McManus expanded the project into a full restoration and refurbishment. The scope of the new project included adding French drains to divert the flow of ground water away from the Mausoleum; designing a new electrical system to properly light the interior; replacing all interior surfaces and making needed structural improvements; using handcrafted and historical products, such as 200-year old floor tiles from the Andalucia region of Spain, as part of the interior design; and installing a marble-clad Columbarium for the inurnment of cremated remains. This Mausoleum has become the symbol of the future of the historic cemetery.

This project, however, was more than just a renovation and restoration, it was a resurrection of the Franciscan ministry to the dead, a re-emergence of the need of the Franciscan community to bring back this essential component of Old Mission Santa Barbara and to reconnect its historic cemetery to the greater community.

For more than two centuries, Old Mission Santa Barbara has been the burial site of thousands of native Chumash people, Franciscan friars and many local people and families.

Adding the Columbarium to the Historic Mausoleum is the centerpiece for tying the old to the new. This serene and beautiful Columbarium is open to all people of faith and goodwill and will remain a place of peace and welcome for families and friends to remember and pray for their loved ones.

A special remembrance as a Knights of Columbus Council 5300 member occurred in 1980 when Grand Knight Stan Nowak sought three members to construct a large Cross at Old Mission Santa Barbara as a special favor for Father Virgil Cordano. Dick with Ogie Sedlak and Ray Looney did the masterful work in Karr's garage. The Cross was made of natural redwood with a lifetime guarantee of 100-years. Instead of placing the Cross in cement the three 'wise' men bored a hole in the bottom of the Cross and inserted a special stainless steel plate and pipe and then placed the Cross into it and the cement followed.

Pro-Life UPDATES: Right to Life News Recap for 2011 (And looking forward in 2012)

It appears that 2011 was a year of great advances for human rights to life. The year continued the shift of efforts to promote right to life legislation in the states. Bills that require a sonogram before an abortion passed in several states and are in process in others. The Texas sonogram requirement law was upheld by a federal appeals court. Sonograms have proven to be a major tool in convincing mothers that life is the best choice. Also, bills that limit abortions on the basis of fetal pain passed in several states and are under consideration in others. Altogether 460 pro-life bills were introduced and 70 passed. Many abortion clinics have closed in the past year and state regulatory agencies are stepping up from their poor performance in investigating problems in abortion clinics. Several abortion providers are under prosecution as horrific conditions in their clinics came to light. One of their most egregious practices, used in prosecutions, is the killing of children born alive after a "failed" abortion.

What is on the pro-life work list for 2012? According to the National Right to Life Committee, the most important items are fetal pain bills and the defeat of Barack Obama. The NRLC calls Obama "the most antilife president we've ever had". Although he professes to be against abortion privately, he actually voted twice in the Illinois legislature against protection for infant born alive after abortion. A vote for these laws would not have diminished his support of abortion rights, yet he chose to cater to his abortion industry constituency. Fetal pain laws have been enacted in 5 states and already in 2012 bills in 3 states and the District of Columbia have been introduced.

The NRLC ranks California as 49th of the states in upholding a right to life. It appears that we Knights of Columbus, protectors of the innocent, have some work to do. What can we as individuals do? For those who want to give of our time, we can pray at Planned Parenthood on Sundays, participate in Walk for Life, help at pro-life clinics, and talk to others, especially our children, about our convictions. For monetary support, we can give to appropriate organizations such as National Right to Life Committee, American Life League, and Life Network (Santa Barbara pro-life clinic). We can take pride that our Council 5300 is exporting the use of sonograms internationally.

Walk for Life: Standing Up for the Unborn

SAN FRANCISCO, January 24, 2012 (LifeSiteNews.com) – Tens of thousands of pro-lifers gathered in front of San Francisco's City Hall, and then filled the city's main thoroughfare, walking about two miles down Market Street to the Embarcadero in the 8th Annual Walk for Life West Coast on January 21.

Estimates of how many walkers participated vary from 40,000 to 55,000. "The San Jose Mercury News says 50,000," Gibbons Cooney, head of Walk For Life West Coast media relations told LifeSiteNews, "but I think more because our stationary video camera showed people passing solidly at the foot of Market Street for 1 hour & 10 minutes."

Organizers said this year's new route down Market Street made the event an even bigger success, providing more exposure for the Walk through the heart of San Francisco, with participants banging drums, playing guitars, chanting "We are pro-life," and stopping all traffic for more than a mile.

Abortion rights protesters, who held their own rally called 'West Coast Rally for Reproductive Justice,' which was reportedly attended by about 80 people, briefly attempted to disrupt the Walk by pulling an orange plastic fence across Market Street, but police quickly removed the group of counter-protesters.


Before the Walkers proceeded down Market Street, Baptist preacher Rev. Clenard Childress, who has spoken at seven of the eight Walks, urged the participants to focus on the light of the Culture of Life

they were giving witness to, and said that the Holy Spirit would be their guide.

KC Member, Scoutmaster Glenn Schiferl Earns Unit Leader Award of Merit

Glenn T. Schiferl, Scoutmaster of Troop 105 for the past four years, was the recipient of the Unit Leader Award of Merit at two ceremonies recently. Life Scout Fritz Mora and his parents, Assad and Kathy, showed up in a surprise visit at Glenn's workplace at UCSB's Physics Department during winter break by reading the award's requirements and presenting him with a plaque, plant, balloon and plate of cookies.

Again, at the regular Wednesday meeting in January of the Troop, a formal presentation was made of the certificate in front of the entire troop and many of the parents.

Highlights of Glenn's experience as Scoutmaster to date:

 Going to Camp Chanwanakee in the Sierras seven years in a row. Spending a week outdoors, camping and competing with other troops in scouting skills, working on merit badges and working as a team to have as much fun as possible.

- Skiing and snowboarding, backpacking in the Sierras and whitewater rafting;
- Launching rockets in the desert, spending a night on the USS Hornet, camp and kayak at Santa Cruz Island, go sailing, visit fire stations, learn about robotics, chess, welding, dentistry, fingerprinting, financial management, learn to cook, play games, attend religious retreats, serve the parish and the community and all the while earn ranks, badges and community accolades.

Glenn was born on September 10, 1961 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. His parents, Ralph and Annie, purchased a new home in Lake Los Carneros in 1967. His father, a professor, was the chair of the SBCC Computer Science Department for 22-years.


As a youngster, Glenn was a Cub Scout in Pack 104, hosted by LaPatera School. His father was the Cubmaster of the pack for several years. Glenn rejoined boy Scouts as a Tiger Cub leader when his son Thomas became a Cub Scout in first grade. He then served as a Wolf and Bear Den Leader and took on the role of Cubmaster for three years. When Mark Vampola agreed to become Cubmaster, Glenn was able to serve the Troop as an Assistant Scoutmaster. When Tom Good retired as Scoutmaster in 2001 Glenn then took that role.






