Ed retired as a Lt. Colonel

Born November 19, 1922 in Chicago, IL, Ed attended Catholic Grade School, Public High School, Chicago City College University of Pennsylvania and graduated from Loyola University, with Doctor of Dental Surgery Degree.

Ed assumed the Dental Practice of a Dentist, who while home eating dinner had a massive heart attack and died. "The Dental practice was very rewarding and I thought I had the world's best patients," stated Ed.

In 1950 the Korean conflict began and President Truman felt the U.S. should come to the aid of South Koreans because of the invasion by the North Koreans. This event eventually changed Ed's life plans very much. The infra structure of the Army was not in good shape since it had a severe shortage of medical professional personnel so the President called out Reserve Officers to supplement the shortage. Being Reserve U.S. Army 1st Lt., Ed was called to active duty with a reporting date of Jan. 1, 1950. He noted, "I completed treatment on most patients however the rest I referred to my brother Ted, who practiced about three miles from my office. Ted had just completed two years in the Navy Dental Corps as a Reserve Lieutenant.

"I told my landlord I would continue paying him rent and I was sure to tell everyone I would be back in two years," Ed pointed out. His first duty station was Camp Roberts, CA., near Paso Robles. Most of his tour there he was doing Prosthetic Dentistry and he liked what he was doing. He applied for a Regular Army Commission and after appearing before a Board of Officers at Letterman General Hospital was told he was accepted and integrated as a 1st Lieutenant in the Regular U.S. Army.

Shortly, while on leave he told everyone he would not be returning to Chicago as previously planned. Ed's folks accepted this, however, his sisters were not at all sympathetic to the idea of Ed making the military as a career. Fortunately Ed was able to make a sale of his dental equipment that he would no longer need.

After Camp Roberts, Ed was ordered to Korea to serve with the 3rd Infantry Division. He was stationed with three Medical Officers, one being the Division Psychiatrist. These Medical doctors were really devoted to their profession. Ed was promoted to Captain and awarded the Bronze Star Medal.

Next assignment ordered Ed to Camp Breckinridge, KY. which was only about 300 miles from home so every weekend Ed was able to get away for about two days. The camp was destined to be closed and Ed was told by the CO that he would be the last Dental Officer to leave since being in charge of moth balling the dental clinics and equipment. The camp would be preserved on a standby basis. Ed was doing Dental Prosthetics at the camp servicing the 101st Airborne Division, the jumpers. When the base closed, Officers would be assigned to Forts Knox or Campbell. Surprisingly Ed was ordered to Ft. Hayes, Columbus, to become Dental Surgeon of the Ohio Military District.


While at Ft. Hayes, Ed was introduced to a beautiful young Lady named Janet Hensel, who was to become the love of Ed's life. Nine months later on Jan. 19, 1957 they were married by Father John Keller in Corpus Christi Catholic Church, Columbus, Ohio. Ed and his new bride moved to Lordstown Military Reservations where he was in charge of serving the Nike Missile Men.


Next assignments were Military Assistance Advisory Group Pakistan where Ed was promoted to Major; Fort Sam Houston, San Antonio, TX.; Presidio of San Francisco, CA., promoted to Lieutenant Colonel; Walter Reed Medical Center, Fort Polk, LA., Vietnam, servicing 1st Infantry Division, Big Red One and Long, Binh Depot, Fort Holabird, Baltimore, MD., Yuma Army Proving Ground, AZ., retirement on May 31, 1970 when Ed received a Meritorious Medal from Washington D.C.


Family history: parents Stanley and Eva Page, both deceased. There were five members of which Ed was the youngest. Two sisters, Mary and Anne, both deceased. Two surviving brothers, Dr. Theodore Page and Joseph Page.

Ed and his adored wife have three children: Ann Foltz of Oxnard and Mel Page and Jean Sanchez both reside in Santa Barbara. Ed beamed, "Jan and I have been married 55-years."


Lee married Ann Lordahl on Nov. 4, 1967 at St. Stanislaus Church in Milwaukee, WI., by Rev. Martin Coyne.

Lee worked for 34 1/2 years with Delco Systems Operations.




Be a part of the New Evangelization! Help us show this amazing movie, "Restless Heart"

Restless Heart, the first full-length feature movie on the life of St. Augustine, may be coming to Santa Barbara. Augustine is one of the greatest saints of the Catholic church. It is the story of one who pursues fame and fortune without a moral compass — and the changes that occur when events lead him to see the light. It also chronicles the collapse of the Roman world and how Augustine laid the intellectual foundations of what became Europe.

Born in North Africa during the Roman Empire in the year 354, Augustine of Hippo was a philosopher and theologian and considered one of the greatest Christian thinkers of all time. Trained as a rhetorician, he quickly rose in stature but lived a dissolute life, living with several concubines and fathering a son. Augustine was raised as a Christian by his mother, St. Monica, but was later attracted to Manichaeism and Neo-Platonism. He felt something was missing, so after years of prayers by his mother, the example of his son, and the urgings of others, he received an inspiration in the year 386 to open the Bible and read the first thing he saw. It was one of Paul's epistles and perfectly phrased to provide the answer he needed. Then he turned his life over to Christ. Eventually Augustine became the bishop of Hippo in what is now Algeria and was known as the greatest Christian apologist and theologian of his time. He died in 430. According to Jerome, "he established anew the ancient faith". His "Confessions" are known as the greatest tale of conversion to Christianity. He is revered in the Roman Catholic, Anglican, Calvinist, Lutheran and Eastern church traditions. Even modern non-Christian philosophers are heavily influenced by Augustine and the modern historian Thomas Cahill calls him the last Classical man and the first Medieval man. Benedict XVI claims Augustine as one of the deepest influences on his own thought.

We have been given the call by Benedict XVI and Archbishop Gomez to evangelize. This film is a good way accomplish evangelization and has been recommended by both of them. The Knights of Columbus Council 5300 has the ability to bring this film to Santa Barbara for a hosted showing. Knights of Columbus councils, parishes, youth organization and pro-life organizations (Augustine is one of the great pro-life saints) all over the USA are scheduling this film for showings at parish facilities or major theaters. I propose that our council, alone or in concert with other Christian organizations, promote and show Restless Heart locally. I will have information soon from the promoter about how to do a hosted showing. If other councils and parishes can do it, then we should be able to do so also. 
Raphael Parish Office who sold tickets and kept things in perfect order.
